AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 22ND DECEMBER, 1924.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED
AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 181).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Infected Areas.

1. The Areas described in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 164), hereinafter referred to as the "Principal" Order.

Revocation of Certain Orders.

2. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-ninth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-four.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1924 (No. 181), and shall be read with the Principal Order.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Infected Areas.

1. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Northampton.

The county borough of Northampton.

The borough of Higham Ferrers.

The petty sessional divisions of Kettering (*except the parish of Gretton*), Thrapston, Wellingborough and Northampton (*except the parish of Cold Ashby*), and the parishes of Benefield, Stoke Doyle, Pilton, Wadenhoe, Barnwell All Saints, Lilford cum Wigsthorpe, Thorpe Achurch, Hartwell, Ashton, Grafton Regis, Alderton, Shutlanger, Stoke Bruerne, Blisworth, Easton Neston, Tiffeld, Gayton, Pattishall, Naseby, Haselbech, Maidwell, Kelmars, Clipston, Arthingworth, Great Oxendon, Braybrooke, Brampton Ash, Stoke Albany and Wilbarston.

In the county of Huntingdon.

In the county of Bedford.

The borough of Bedford.

The petty sessional divisions of Sharnbrook and Bedford (*except the parishes of Eaton Socon, Little Barford, Roxton, Great Barford, Willington, Cople, Cardington, Eastcotts and Wilshamstead*) and the parish of Cranfield.

In the county of Buckingham.

The petty sessional division of Newport Pagnell (*except the parishes of Broughton, Milton Keynes, Great Woolstone, Little Woolstone and Bradwell*) and the parish of Castle Thorpe.

2. An Area comprising:—

In the county of Norfolk.

The parishes of Great Cressingham, South Pickenham, Houghton-on-the-Hill, North Pickenham, Cockley Cley, Swaffham, South Acre, Newton by Castle Acre, Sporle with Palgrave, Necton, West Bradenham, East Bradenham, Holme Hale, West Lexham, East Lexham, Litcham, Great Dunham, Kempstone, Little Dunham, Great Fransham, Little Fransham, Beeston with Bittering, Longham, Wendling, Scarning, Shipdham, Ashill, Saham Toney and Ovington.
