#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

Lord Colebrooke. Lord Thomson. Mr. Secretary Henderson. Mr. C. P. Trevelyan.

WHEREAS by section 18 of the Extradition Act, 1870, it is among other things enacted that if by any law or ordinance made after the passing of the said Act by the Legislature of any British Possession provision is made for carrying into effect within such Possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British Possession, His Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Act in the case of any Foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, either—

Suspend the operation within any such British Possession of the said Act or any part thereof, so far as it relates to such Foreign State, and so long as such law or ordinance continues in force there and no longer;

Or direct that such law or ordinance or any part thereof shall have effect in such British Possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the Act:

And whereas by an Act enacted by the Legislature of the Colony of Southern Rhodesia, the short title of which is the Extradition Act, 1924, and the provisions of which are fully set

forth in the Schedule appended to this Order, provision has been made for carrying into effect within the Colony the surrender of fugitive criminals who are therein or suspected of being therein:

And whereas it is provided by the said Act that the said Act shall come into operation as soon as an Order of His Majesty in Council directing that the said Act shall have effect within the Colony as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870, shall have been duly published in the Government Gazette of the Colony:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the Extradition Act, 1870, and in exercise of the powers in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, direct as follows:—

The Southern Rhodesia Extradition Act, 1924, shall have effect in the Colony without modification or alteration as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870.

#### SCHEDULE.

Whereas by the Imperial Act known as the Extradition Act, 1870, it is enacted that that Act when applied by Order in Council, unless it is otherwise provided by such Order, shall extend to every British Possession, but with the following, among other, modifications, namely:—

No warrant of a Secretary of State shall be required, and all powers vested in or acts authorised or required to be done under that Act by the Police Magistrate and Secretary of State, or either of them, in relation to the surrender of a fugitive criminal, may be done by the Governor of the British Possession alone:

And whereas by that Imperial Act it is also enacted that if, by any law made before or after the passing of the said Act by the Legislature of my British Possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within that Possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in that Possession, The King may, by Order in Council, direct that such law or any part thereof shall have effect in that Possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the Imperial Act:

And whereas by other Imperial Acts known as the Extradition Act, 1873, the Extradition Act, 1895, and the Extradition Act, 1906, it is enacted that those Acts shall be construed as one with the Extradition Act, 1870, and that the four Acts may be cited together as the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of the Colony of Southern Rhodesia. as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be cited as the "Extradition Act, 1924."
- 2. This Act shall not come into operation until His Majesty shall by Order in Council direct that this Act shall have effect within this Colony as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870, but this Act shall thereafter come into operation as soon as such Order in Council shall have been duly published in the Government Gazette of this Colony.
- 3. In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears, terms defined in the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, have the same meaning as in those Acts.
- 4. All powers vested in and acts authorised or required to be done by a Secretary of State, under the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, in relation to the surrender of a fugitive criminal, are hereby vested in and may in the Colony be exercised and done by the Governor.
- 5. All powers vested in and acts authorised or required to be done by a Police Magistrate or any Justice of the Peace under the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals, are hereby vested in and may in the Colony be exercised and done by any Magistrate or Acting Magistrate.
- 6. Where the Extradition Act, 1870, applies in the case of any foreign State, a requisition for the surrender of a person accused or convicted of an extradition crime in the Colony who is or is suspected to be in that foreign State may be made by the Attorney General to a consular office of that State in the Colony, or to any Minister of that State through the diplomatic representative of His Majesty in that State, or in such other mode as is settled by arrangement.
- 7. Any person accused or convicted of an extradition crime who is surrendered by a foreign State, may, under the warrant for his surrender issued in the foreign State, be brought into the Colony and delivered to the

proper authorities, to be dealt with according to law.

8. The "Fugitive Criminals Surrender Ordinance, 1905," as amended, is hereby repealed.

Whereas by an Act passed in a Session of Parliament holden in the third year of the reign of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, intituled "An Act to reorganise the Administration of the Patriotic Fund," the Patriotic Fund Commission constituted by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, by Warrant under the Royal Sign Manual, dated the seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, was dissolved, and the property, rights, duties and liabilities thereof, and all property held in trust therefor, were transferred to and vested in the Royal Patriotic Fund Corporation established in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas pursuant to the provisions of the said recited Act and of Section 7 of the War Pensions (Administrative Provisions) 1918, eight of the members of the said Corporation are appointed by Warrant under the Royal Sign Manual, and hold office for a term of three years, being eligible for re-

appointment:

And whereas, in pursuance of the powers vested in Us by the said Acts, We did, by Warrants under Our Royal Sign Manual bearing date the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and the nineteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, appoint you Our said Most Dear Uncle and Counsellor Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, together with the persons therein named to be members of the Royal Patriotic Fund Corporation until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four:

Now know ye that We do by these Presents under Our Royal Sign Manual, ordain and declare that you Our said Most Dear Uncle and Counsellor Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, together with you the said Sir Frederick William Stopford, Sir Bertram Blakiston Cubitt, Sir Frederic Edward Errington Brock, Sir Harry Edwin Haward, Arthur William Smallwood, Edward Thompson Dickson and Elisabeth Harriott Kelly, shall be Members of the Royal Patriotic Fund Corporation, to exercise for the term of three years from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, in conjunction with the six members co-opted by the General Council, and the ex-officio members specified in the First Schedule to the Act first above recited, the powers and duties transferred to that body as aforesaid, and generally to carry into effect the provisions of the said Act.

And We do further ordain that you Our said Most Dear Uncle and Counsellor Arthur William Patrick Albert, Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, shall be President of the General Council of the said Corporation.

They heard the fall and being informed that McNally and Place had been buried they at once collected some bandages and proceeded to the spot. They found that owing to the tubs taking the weight of the fall McNally and Place were alive, and in spite of the fact that stones were still falling they commenced tunnelling towards the imprisoned men. They succeeded in making a tunnel 12 feet long through which Elwick managed to make his way passing the stones back as he proceeded, and Wilson followed him. After twenty minutes hard work they managed to reach the buried men and succeeded in extricating Place but only after a struggle as he had become hysterical. They then returned to McNally but found that he was held fast by three of his fingers which were between a bar and the top of a tub. They therefore built up stones to support some of the falling bars and atempted to cut off the top of the tub with a hammer and chisel but their task was made impossible by the confined space. McNally agreed that his fingers must be cut off if he were to be saved, and further efforts to release him having failed, Elwick and Wilson proceeded to apply tourniquets to his arm and endeavoured to amputate the fingers with the only implements at hand—a knife, an axe and a hammer. operation was found impossible until a fellow workman arrived on the scene with a sharp chisel; this was passed up the tunnel and with it Elwick and Wilson managed to sever the three fingers. McNally was eventually extricated and taken to Sunderland Infirmary.

Elwick and Wilson cannot be praised too highly. They knew only too well the risks they ran as they were well-acquainted with the nature of the ground and there were continual further falls of roof during their two hours work. During the whole of that time the spot where they were working gradually grew smaller and smaller but they never relaxed their efforts and never even suggested abandoning their task. There was a grave risk that their passage back would be closed, and indeed it did fall in shortly after the rescue was completed. Both Elwick and rescue was completed. Wilson had been trained in ambulance work and they had the presence of mind to apply tourniquets not only with a view to preventing bleeding but also in order to stop the circulation so as to reduce the pain of the amputation as far as they possibly could. They undoubtedly saved McNally's life, and the story of their bravery and coolness is one of the most remarkable recorded in the history of rescue work.

## COUNTY OF WEST SUFFOLK.

## NAIRNSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1924.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as

## Power to make Regulations.

- 1.—(1) The Local Authority of the District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.
- (2) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

## Confirmation of Regulations.

- 2.—(1) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

## Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are . Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by Section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

## Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (powers of police); Section forty-four (powers of inspectors); and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

#### Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

## Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the NAIRN-SHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1924.
