THE UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACTS, 1877-1923.

The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Trinity College, Cambridge, on the 22nd November, 1924, the Governing Body of Christ's College, Cambridge, on the 24th November, 1924, and the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, on the 19th December, 1924, and approved by the University of Cambridge Commissioners on the 14th January, 1925, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923":—

TRINITY COLLEGE, CAMBRIDGE.

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of Trinity College in the University of Cambridge, which amending Statutes were duly made at a College Meeting being a Meeting of the Governing Body of the College specially summoned for this purpose held on the twenty-second day of November, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, and having been passed at such Meeting by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and having been approved by the University of

Cambridge Commissioners, under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923" (13 and 14 George V., Chapter 33), which approval is testified by the Common Seal of the Commissioners being hereunto affixed, are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

WE, The Master, Fellows and Scholars of Trinity College, in the University of Cambridge, in exercise of the powers given to us by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and by the 11th Section of the Schedule to the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, Do hereby alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College, in manner following, that is to say:—


I. By adding after section 9a of Statute XV intituled "Tenure and Vacating of Fellowships" the following section to form a new section 9b of the same Statute:—

9b. The Council shall have power to enter into an agreement with any Fellow holding a qualifying office who shall have held that or some other qualifying office before the 25th day of January, 1924, whereby such Fellow shall agree in consideration of any payments made or to be made by the College to him or for his benefit or of any rights under the Federated Superannuation System for Universities secured to him by such payments to surrender his actual or contingent rights or claims to a fellowship dividend on retirement from any qualifying

office and to place himself under the operation of any Statutes for the College made or approved or to be made or approved by the University of Cambridge Commissioners.

II. By repealing section 12 of Statute XLIX intituled "Distribution of Revenues" and substituting therefor the following section to form an amended section 12 of the same

12. The Council shall fix for the year the amount being not more than three hundred and twelve pounds and ten shillings (£312 10s.) subject to income tax to be called a modulus And there shall be paid to each Fellow (not being a Supernumerary Fellow) his proper dividend fixed as herein-after mentioned by reference to the amount of the modulus.

CHRIST'S COLLEGE, CAMBRIDGE.

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes of Christ's College in the University of Cambridge such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose and held on the twentyfourth day of November One thousand Nine hundred and twenty-four and passed at such Meeting by the votes of more than twothirds of the number of persons present and voting and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

WE, the Master, Fellows, and Scholars of Christ's College in the University of Cambridge do hereby in exercise of the powers given to us by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College in the following

By adding to Chapter XXIX of the said Statutes the following section:

8. The financial year for College Accounts, shall end on the thirty-first day of July.

UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes in relation to the University of Cambridge, made under "The Universities of Oxford made under The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 " (40 and 41 Victoria, Chapter 48), and having been approved by the University of Cambridge Commissioners, under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923" (13 and 14 George V, Chapter 33), which approval is testified by the Common Seal of the Commissioners being because of the Commissioners being hereunto affixed, which amending Statutes are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

WE, the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 53rd Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and by the 11th Section of the Schedule to the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, in relation to our said University in manner following, that is to say:-

STATUTE A, CHAPTER IV.

By altering the title of Section 5 to " Elec-

tion of Orator, and Esquire Bedell."

By deleting the word "Registrary" from the Section.

By adding the following Section:-

'Section 5.* Appointment of Registrary. The Registrary shall be appointed by Grace of the Senate on the nomination of the Council of the Senate. Such Grace shall be submitted to the Senate not later than forty days (exclusive of any vacation) from the office falling vacant. The appointment may be made by anticipation as from the date of the office becoming vacant, when such vacancy can be foreseen by reason of the retirement of the Registrary on account of age or of his having given notice of resignation."

STATUTE A, CHAPTER V.

By inserting in Section 3 intituled 'Office of Registrary' the following paragraph between the second and third paragraphs of that Section:-

"It shall be the duty of the Registrary to act as Secretary to the Council of the Senate: he shall be ineligible for membership of that Body.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 30th January, 1925, at 1 o'clock, for:
 - (a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, The National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and
 - (b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.
- 2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £30,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 2nd February, 1925, to Saturday, the 7th February, 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

- 6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 30th September, 1924, rank pari passu with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 2nd February, 1925, to Saturday, the 7th February, 1925, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th April 1925, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.
- 7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.
- 8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the

amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

- 10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

ORDER DEFINING THE EMPLOYMENT TREATED AS OVERTIME TO \mathbf{BE} EMPLOYMENT.

The Middlesex Agricultural Wages Committee in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Agricultural Wages Committees Regulations, 1924, do by this Order define the undermentioned employment as the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment in the administrative county of Middlesex, and the City of London and those parts of the administrative county of London (except the parts of the Metropolitan Borough of Woolwich) which lie north of the River Thames, for the purpose of the application of any differential rate of wages for overtime fixed by the said Committee:

(a) In the case of all workers, all employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between employer and worker.

(b) In the case of workers employed wholly or mainly on the duties of Stockmen, all employment in excess of 60 hours in any week (including Sunday, but excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment).

(c) In the case of workers employed wholly or mainly as Carters, all employment in excess of 56 hours in any week (including Sunday but excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment).

(d) In the case of workers other than those mentioned in (b) and (c) above, (i) all employment on a Sunday, (ii) all employment in excess of 50 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in summer, and (iii) all employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as overtime employment) in winter.

For the purpose of this Order, employment in Winter shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first day of November and terminating on the last day of February, and employment in Summer shall be deemed to be employment from the first day of March until the last day of October following.
