The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**WHEREAS** there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 5th day of February, 1925 (C.W. 4748/24), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 28th day of March, 1903, the 18th day of October, 1909, and the 14th day of April, 1917, provision is made for certain Officers of the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant promoted from Warrant rank to be placed on half-pay in the event of misconduct or prolonged sickness :

“And whereas we are of opinion that in the Warrant Officer branches liability to discharge

to half-pay should not be limited to the ranks or classes of Officers so provided for or to the circumstances aforesaid, but should be extended to Warrant Officers and Officers promoted therefrom of all branches of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces, and that the rates of half-pay payable to such Officers should be prescribed :

“And whereas we are of opinion that all such Officers in respect of whom provision in that behalf does not already exist should be liable to compulsory retirement after a period of non-service :

“And whereas it is necessary to amend and amplify the regulations under which certain Officers formerly of Warrant rank are liable to such retirement :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the regulations set forth in the annexed Schedule.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“SCHEDULE.

“1. Warrant Officers and Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank of all branches, R.N. and R.M., including the Schoolmaster branches, and Officers promoted therefrom for long and zealous service or after examination to be liable to be placed on half-pay, and to be eligible therefor at their own request, at

the discretion of the Admiralty. The foregoing regulation to be applicable also to:—

" 2. The rate of half-pay for Warrant Officers R.N. and Officers promoted therefrom whose full pay is on the 'mechanical' scale to be half the rate of full pay applicable to their rank and seniority on the 'non-mechanical' scale; in all other cases the rate of half-pay to be half the rate of full pay of their rank and seniority.

" 3. All Officers of the above-mentioned categories, in respect of whom provision for retirement on account of non-service has not already been made, to be retired after three years from date of last service.

" 4. Officers, Royal Navy, of the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant or Lieutenant Commander promoted to the former rank for acts of gallantry or daring to be retired after three years from date of last service.

" 5. The time of Officers while on half-pay under the provisions of this Schedule to count as one-third of full service for increase of retired pay under the usual conditions, but not to count for increase of gratuity on retirement or discharge."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

" Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

" And whereas Your Majesty was pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 21st day of April, 1922, to empower us to place on the Retired List, irrespective of age and service, Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces who may be judged by us to be unfit for further employment by reason of

incapacity or temperamental or other defect not amounting to misconduct and not caused by intemperate or irregular habits of life, at such rates of retired pay, pension or gratuity as we with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury may determine:

" And whereas it is expedient that the rates of retired pay, pension or gratuity that may be granted to Officers retired in such circumstances should be defined:

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to sanction the regulations set forth in the annexed Schedule.

" The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

#### " SCHEDULE.

" 1. Officers in respect of whom provision is made for retirement on account of non-service to receive retired pay on the scale which would have been applicable to them if retired for that reason.

" 2. Officers on the Supplementary List:—

(a) If retired after less than 10 years' full pay service (including service in the Royal Navy as R.N.R. Officer, Acting Sub-Lieutenant and Sub-Lieutenant, R.N.) to receive a gratuity of 5 calendar months' full pay for each complete year of such service.

(b) If retired with 10 or more years' full pay service as above, to receive retired pay at the rate of £200 a year together with an addition of £15 a year for each complete year of such service over 10 (maximum £275).

" 3. Sub-Lieutenants, R.N., Paymaster Sub-Lieutenants R.N., and Probationary Second Lieutenants, Probationary Lieutenants, and Lieutenants, Royal Marines with less than 4 years' commissioned time (except Officers promoted under the provisions of Order in Council dated 11th February, 1913):—

To receive a gratuity at a rate not exceeding £50 for each complete year of full pay service, or £200 in all; in the case of Royal Marine Officers, service for this purpose to count from the age of 18 only.

" 4. Officers of the Schoolmaster Branch, R.N. and R.M.:—

The scale of gratuities authorized by Order in Council of 27th May, 1921 (as amended in regard to the counting of time by Order in Council of 28th November, 1923, Section III of Schedule) for Officers retired below the age of 40 years if found inefficient or unworthy of further employment to be applicable to Officers retired under the provisions of Order in Council of 21st April, 1922.

" 5. The regulations contained in this Schedule to have effect from the 1st April, 1919, but without prejudice to any awards made under other regulations.

" 6. The rates of retired pay authorized by this Schedule to be regarded as standard rates comparable with those authorized in Schedule V, Section IX of the Order in Council dated 22nd January, 1920, and to be subject to revision at the same dates and in the same manner as retired pay authorized by that Order."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

“ And whereas in the revised scales of retired pay of Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces which were established by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, no provision was made for the rates of retired pay to be granted to certain classes of officers placed on the retired List on account of non-service :

“ And whereas Your Majesty was pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 15th day of March, 1922, to sanction rates of retired pay for certain officers of the rank or corresponding rank of Lieutenant Commander or Lieutenant in the Executive, Engineer and Accountant Branches of the Royal Navy placed on the retired List in consequence of non-service when under the age of forty years :

“ And whereas it is necessary that similar provision should be made in respect of other officers who may be retired for non-service :

“ We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the regulations set forth in the annexed schedule.

“ The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ 1. Officers of the Medical, Dental and Instructor Branches, and Chaplains, who are ineligible for voluntary retirement with retired pay :—

If retired for non-service after completing four years' service, to be granted retired pay at the rate of £75 a year, with an addition of £7 10s. 0d. for each of the first six complete

years of service and an addition of £12 10s. 0d. a year for each complete year of service subsequent thereto.

“ 2. Mates, Mates (E), R.N., Officers of the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant or Lieutenant-Commander promoted from these ranks, and Probationary Second Lieutenants, Probationary Lieutenants, Lieutenants and Captains, Royal Marines, promoted under the provisions of Order in Council of 11th February, 1913, (Corps Commissions), if retired at ages under forty years on account of non-service :—

To receive retired pay on the scale of £100 a year together with an increment of £10 a year for each complete year of service in the rank or ranks stated.

“ 3. Warrant Officers and Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank of all Branches R.N. and R.M., including the Schoolmaster Branches, and Officers promoted therefrom for long and zealous service or after examination; Lieutenant-Commanders and Lieutenants and Naval Officers of equivalent rank promoted for acts of gallantry and daring, and Royal Marine Officers promoted under the provisions of Order in Council of 11th February, 1913, for specially meritorious service or distinguished war service; Quartermasters, R.M.; Directors of Music, R.M.; the Musical Director, Assistant Musical Director, Company Officers and Quartermaster, R.N. School of Music :—

If retired at ages under forty years on account of non-service, officers in the above categories to receive the retired pay for which they would have been eligible if invalidated for a cause not attributable to the conditions of service, reduced by £20 a year in each case.

“ 4. Lieutenants R.M. (direct entry) after four years from date of first commission, and Captains, R.M. :—

If retired for non-service under the age of forty years, to receive retired pay on the scale applicable to Lieutenants and Lieutenant-Commanders authorized by Order in Council of 15th March, 1922, and to reckon service for this purpose as from a date four years later than the date of first commission.

“ 5. The time of the before-mentioned officers while on unemployed pay or half pay to count under the usual conditions as one-third of full service for increase of retired pay under this Schedule.

“ 6. The foregoing regulations to have effect from 1st April 1919, but without prejudice to awards already made under other regulations.

“ 7. The rates of retired pay authorized by this Schedule to be regarded as standard rates comparable with those authorized in Schedule V, Section IX of the Order in Council dated the 22nd January, 1920, and to be subject to revision at the same dates and in the same manner as retired pay authorized by that Order.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas by Your Order in Council of the 9th March, 1921, a non-substantive allowance of 9d. a day was instituted as from the 5th August, 1920, to be payable to Writer ratings who qualify, in the prescribed standard of proficiency, as Shorthand Typists :

“And whereas by Your Order in Council of the 10th August, 1921, this allowance was extended to such Non-commissioned Officers or

men of Your Royal Marine Force as are qualified and allocated for duty as Shorthand Typists :

“And whereas we consider it necessary that a small number of Shorthand Typists with a higher degree of proficiency should be borne, for duty in the offices of the Flag Officers and Commodores, and in shore establishments :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to direct that a non-substantive rating with pay, at our discretion, of 9d. a day may be instituted as from the 8th January, 1925, in addition to that already instituted by Your Orders in Council of the 9th March, 1921, and the 10th August, 1921, to those Writer ratings or Royal Marines who qualify in the prescribed higher standard of proficiency :

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

the following Scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the County of Durham now vested in us :

“Whereas the property, particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written, is now vested in us not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but in possession, and we are desirous of selling the same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund :

“Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that we may be authorized and empowered to sell or dispose of and duly to transfer or convey from time to time all or part of the said property described in the said Schedule for such consideration as shall appear to us to be just and reasonable.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the Parish (being a New Parish) of Saint John with Saint Saviour, Fitzroy Square, and the Parish (being a New Parish) of Saint Mary Magdalene, Munster Square, both within the original limits of the Parish of Saint Pancras, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London :

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 26th day of December, 1851, and published in the London Gazette on the 9th day of January, 1852, part of the said Parish of Saint Pancras was assigned as a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Charlotte Street, situate in the said Parish of Saint Pancras, and such District Chapelry was named ‘ The District Chapelry of Saint John, Upper Charlotte Street, Saint Pancras ’ :

“ And whereas the said District Chapelry of Saint John, Upper Charlotte Street, Saint Pancras, has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94 :

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 5th day of March, 1852, and published in the London Gazette on the 9th day of the same month part of the District of Christ Church, in Saint Pancras, in the said County of Middlesex and in the said Diocese of London, was constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and the said District was named ‘ The District of Saint Mary Magdalene, in Saint Pancras ’ :

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 4th day of February, 1865, and published in the London Gazette on the 7th day of the same month a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Saviour, situate in the said New Parish of Saint John, Upper Charlotte

Street, Saint Pancras, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named ‘ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Saviour, Saint Pancras ’ :

“ And whereas the said District of Saint Mary Magdalene, in Saint Pancras, and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Saviour, Saint Pancras, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the above mentioned Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the above mentioned Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94 :

“ And whereas under the provisions of the Saint Pancras Ecclesiastical Regulation Act, 1868, the said Cures of Saint John, Upper Charlotte Street, Saint Pancras; Saint Mary Magdalene, in Saint Pancras, and Saint Saviour, Saint Pancras, have become Parishes and have taken the titles of ‘ The Parish of Saint John, Fitzroy Square ’; ‘ The Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Munster Square ’; and ‘ The Parish of Saint Saviour, Fitzroy Square, ’ respectively :

“ And whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council bearing date the 10th day of August, 1904, and published in the London Gazette on the 12th day of the same month, the Benefice of Saint John, Fitzroy Square, and the Benefice of Saint Saviour, Fitzroy Square, both situate within the Metropolis and within the said Diocese of London, were united into one Benefice under the style of ‘ The Benefice of Saint John with Saint Saviour, Fitzroy Square, ’ and the said Parish of Saint John, Fitzroy Square, and the said Parish of Saint Saviour, Fitzroy Square, became a United Parish :

“ And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said Parish of Saint John with Saint Saviour, Fitzroy Square, and the said Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Munster Square, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned :

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said Parish of Saint John with Saint Saviour, Fitzroy Square, and of the said Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Munster Square, shall be altered so that all that part of the said Parish of Saint John with Saint Saviour, Fitzroy Square, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Munster Square.

“ And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall

prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“ The territory to be dissevered from the Parish of Saint John with Saint Saviour, Fitzroy Square, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, and to be annexed to the Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Munster Square, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

“ All that portion of the said Parish of Saint John with Saint Saviour, Fitzroy Square, which is bounded upon the west by the said Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Munster Square, upon the north and upon the east by the Parish of Saint James, Hampstead Road, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south by an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Hampstead Road with Euston Road where the boundaries of the said Parish of Saint James, Hampstead Road, the Parish of Saint Pancras, in the said County and Diocese, and the said Parish of Saint John with Saint Saviour, Fitzroy Square, all meet, and extending thence westward along the middle of Euston Road for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stanhope Street upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint John with Saint Saviour, Fitzroy Square, from the said Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Munster Square.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 20th February, 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877; the National Debt

Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £30,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

#### TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 23rd February, 1925, to Saturday, the 28th February, 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

#### 4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. NEW UNION.

## LEEDS TOWNSHIP.

## BRAMLEY, HOLBECK AND HUNSLET UNIONS.

Whereas the City of Leeds comprises—

- (a) The Township of Leeds which has a separate Board of guardians;
- (b) The Township of Armley and Bramley in the Bramley Union;
- (c) The Township of Holbeck in the Holbeck Union; and
- (d) The Township of Hunslet and the Parish of Osmondthorpe in the Hunslet Union:

And whereas by Part II of the Leeds Corporation Act 1924 the existing Township of Leeds will on the 1st day of April 1925 be extended so as to include the existing Townships of Armley and Bramley, Holbeck, and Hunslet, and the existing Parish of Osmondthorpe, and those Townships and that Parish will cease to form part of the Unions in which each of them is now included:

And whereas the Bramley Union, the Holbeck Union and the Hunslet Union also contain the following townships which are situate outside the City of Leeds—

- (a) The Township of Gildersome in the Bramley Union;
- (b) The Township of Churwell in the Holbeck Union; and
- (c) The Townships of Oulton-with-Woodlesford, Rothwell, Templenewsam, and Thorpe Stapleton in the Hunslet Union:

And whereas subsection (1) of section 7 of the Leeds Corporation Act, 1924, empowers the Minister of Health by an order or orders under the Poor Law Acts, to take effect on the 1st day of April, 1925, and made after a local inquiry directed by the Minister, to add to any existing union or unions the townships last-mentioned, or any of them, or to unite any of those townships with any other township or parish to form a union for the purpose of the administration of the laws relating to the Relief of the Poor:

And whereas subsections (2) and (4) of Section 7 of the Act of 1924 contain supplemental provisions enabling adaptations or amendments of Part II of that Act to be made by any such order of the Minister of Health, and as to the transfer of any institution or buildings or other premises, vested in the Bramley Guardians, the Holbeck Guardians or the Hunslet Guardians, to the Guardians of the Township of Leeds, or of any union in which the township in which the premises are situate may be included by order of the Minister, subject nevertheless to a financial adjustment of the property and liabilities in respect of such premises under the provisions of the Act of 1924:

And whereas subsection (3) of section 7 of the Act of 1924 requires the Minister of Health in any order made under subsection (1) of

that section to make such provisions (if any) for the adjustment of financial relations, property, income, debts, liabilities and expenses, and as to the application or otherwise of the Local Government (Adjustments) Act 1913 (with or without modifications) in respect of any of the existing townships outside the City of Leeds, and any questions arising with respect thereto, by reason of the provisions of Part II of the Act of 1924, or of any order of the Minister of Health made thereunder, as he shall think fit:

And whereas the Minister of Health has caused to be held the local inquiry contemplated by section 7 of the Leeds Corporation Act, 1924, and report has been made to him thereon:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Health, in pursuance of his powers under section 7 of the Leeds Corporation Act, 1924, under the Poor Law Amendment Act, 1834, and the Acts amending or extending that Act, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

## PART I.

SHORT TITLE, INTERPRETATION AND  
COMMENCEMENT.

1. This Order may be cited as the Leeds (Alteration of Unions) Order, 1925.

2. In this Order unless the context otherwise requires—

“ Existing ” in relation to any poor law union, township or other area altered by the Act of 1924, or by this Order, means existing immediately before the 1st day of April, 1925;

“ Officers ” includes servants;

“ Orders ” includes rules and regulations;

“ The Act of 1924 ” means the Leeds Corporation Act, 1924;

“ The appointed day ” means the 1st day of April, 1925;

“ The Bramley Guardians,” “ the Dewsbury Guardians,” “ the Holbeck Guardians,” “ the Hunslet Guardians ” and “ the Wakefield Guardians ” mean respectively the Board of Guardians of the Poor Law Union of the same name;

“ The Leeds Union ” means the Leeds Union formed by this Order, and “ the Leeds Guardians ” means the Board of Guardians of that Union;

“ The Minister ” means the Minister of Health;

“ The Township of Leeds ” means the existing Township of Leeds as extended by section 6 of the Act of 1924.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1925:

Provided that this Order shall operate as from such day earlier than the day aforesaid as may be necessary for the following purposes, viz.:—

- (1) The proceedings preliminary to the first meeting of the Leeds Guardians and to the transaction of the business to be performed at that meeting;

(2) The provision to be made by the Dewsbury Guardians and by the Wakefield Guardians for the relief of the poor and for vaccination, on and after the 1st day of April, 1925, in any parish by this Order added to the existing Dewsbury Union or the existing Wakefield Union;

(3) The preparation of any precept or contribution order to be made on or after the 1st day of April, 1925; or

(4) The proceedings preliminary or relating to the election in the year 1925 of guardians or rural district councillors.

## PART II.

### DISSOLUTION OF UNIONS, TRANSFER OF PARISHES, &c.

#### 4. On the appointed day—

(1) The Bramley Union, the Holbeck Union and the Hunslet Union shall be dissolved;

(2) The Townships of Churwell and Gildersome shall be added to and form part of the Dewsbury Union;

(3) The Townships of Oulton-with-Woodlesford and Rothwell shall be added to and form part of the Wakefield Union;

(4) The Townships of Templenewsam and Thorpe Stapleton shall, together with the Township of Leeds, be united to form a union for the purpose of the administration of the laws relating to the relief of the poor, to be called the Leeds Union.

5. The Board of Guardians of the Leeds Union shall consist of fifty-four elective members, of whom fifty-one guardians shall represent the Township of Leeds, two rural district councillors shall represent the Township of Templenewsam, and one rural district councillor shall represent the Township of Thorpe Stapleton.

6.—(1) The rural district councillors for the Townships of Templenewsam and Thorpe Stapleton, elected at the ordinary election in the year 1925 of councillors of the Hunslet Rural District, shall, on and after the 15th day of April, 1925, represent those Townships on the Leeds Guardians.

(2) Any person who, immediately before the appointed day, is in office as a rural district councillor for either of the Townships aforesaid, shall, on and after the appointed day and until the 15th day of April, 1925, represent that Township on the Leeds Guardians.

7.—(1) The number of elective members of the Dewsbury Guardians shall be increased by two guardians, of whom one shall represent the Township of Churwell, and one shall represent the Township of Gildersome, and at the ordinary election in the year 1925 of the Dewsbury Guardians, one guardian shall be elected for each of the Townships of Churwell and Gildersome.

(2) The guardians so elected shall come into office on the 15th day of April, 1925.

(3) Any person who, immediately before the appointed day, is in office as a guardian for the Township of Churwell, or for the Township of Gildersome, shall on and after that day and until the guardians elected in pursuance

of this Article come into office, represent that Township on the Dewsbury Guardians.

8.—(1) The number of elective members of the Wakefield Guardians shall be increased by three guardians who shall represent the Township of Rothwell, and by two councillors of the Hunslet Rural District who shall represent the Township of Oulton-with-Woodlesford on the Wakefield Guardians.

(2) At the ordinary election in the year 1925 of the Wakefield Guardians, three guardians shall be elected for the Township of Rothwell, and shall come into office on the 15th day of April, 1925.

(3) The two rural district councillors for the Township of Oulton-with-Woodlesford, elected at the ordinary election in the year 1925 of councillors of the Hunslet Rural District, shall, on and after the 15th day of April, 1925, represent that Township on the Wakefield Guardians.

(4) Any person who, immediately before the appointed day, is in office as—

(a) A guardian for the Township of Rothwell; or

(b) A councillor of the Hunslet Rural District for the Township of Oulton-with-Woodlesford;

shall on and after the appointed day and until the 15th day of April, 1925, represent the Township of Rothwell or the Township of Oulton-with-Woodlesford (as the case may be) on the Wakefield Guardians.

9.—(1) For the purpose of the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1894, relating to the qualification of guardians, the Townships of Churwell and Gildersome shall be deemed to have formed part of the Dewsbury Union, and the Township of Rothwell shall be deemed to have formed part of the Wakefield Union, since the 1st day of January, 1924.

(2) For the purpose of the provisions of the Act aforesaid relating to the qualification of rural district councillors, the Townships of Templenewsam and Thorpe Stapleton shall be deemed to have formed part of the Leeds Union since the 1st day of January, 1924, and the Township of Oulton-with-Woodlesford shall be deemed to have formed part of the Wakefield Union since that day.

10. Any person elected in pursuance of this Order as a guardian for any of the Townships of Churwell, Gildersome and Rothwell, shall continue in office until and shall retire on the 15th day of April, 1928, and the guardians for those Townships shall retire on the 15th day of April in every third year thereafter.

11.—(1) The first meeting of the Leeds Guardians shall be held on the 1st day of April, 1925, at such time and place as may be fixed by the Chairman of the Guardians of the existing Township of Leeds, or in case of the inability or default of the Chairman, by the Vice-Chairman of those Guardians.

(2) The Clerk to the Guardians of the existing Township of Leeds shall give at least three days' notice of the date, time and place of the first meeting of the Guardians of the Leeds Union, and of the business to be transacted at that meeting, to each guardian elected at

the first election of the Leeds Guardians and to any person who, by this Order, is constituted a member of the Leeds Guardians.

(3) The first meeting of the Leeds Guardians shall be deemed the annual meeting of those Guardians for the year 1925, and for the purposes of section 2 of the Union Assessment Committee Act, 1862, shall be deemed the first meeting of the Leeds Guardians after the annual election of guardians.

### PART III.

#### ADMINISTRATION OF RELIEF, TRANSFER OF INSTITUTIONS, &c.

12.—(1) Any district of the existing Township of Leeds for the purpose of the relief of the poor or vaccination, as such district exists immediately before the appointed day, shall be a district of the Leeds Union for the like purpose, until such district shall be altered in pursuance of any provision in that behalf.

(2) The Leeds Guardians shall, at their first meeting, provide for the relief of the poor in the parishes of the Bramley Union, the Holbeck Union and the Hunslet Union, which by virtue of the Act of 1924 or this Order will form part of the Leeds Union, by the addition of the whole or any part of the transferred areas to an existing district, for the like purpose, of the existing Township of Leeds, or by the constitution for such purpose of a district or districts of the Leeds Union, consisting of the whole or any part of the transferred areas.

(3) The Dewsbury Guardians shall at a meeting in March, 1925, provide for the relief of the poor, on and after the appointed day, in the Townships of Churwell and Gildersome by adding the whole or any part of those Townships to an existing district, for the like purpose, of the Dewsbury Union, or by the constitution for such purpose of a district of the Dewsbury Union consisting of the whole or any part of the Townships of Churwell and Gildersome.

(4) Paragraph (3) of this Article shall extend to the Wakefield Guardians, in relation to the Townships of Rothwell and Oulton-with-Woodlesford, with the substitution of those Guardians for the Dewsbury Guardians, and of the Wakefield Union for the Dewsbury Union, and with such other modifications as may be necessary.

13.—(1) On the appointed day, the estate or interest of the Bramley Guardians, the Holbeck Guardians, the Hunslet Guardians, or the Guardians of the existing Township of Leeds, in any institution or buildings or other premises, which at the passing of the Act of 1924 were vested in any of the Guardians aforesaid, shall, by virtue of this Order, be transferred to and vest in the Leeds Guardians, but this transfer shall not affect any financial adjustment which, but for this Article, would have been made of the property and liabilities in respect of such institution, buildings or premises, under the provisions of section 62 of the Local Government Act, 1888, as applied with modifications by this Order.

(2) The Leeds Guardians may, within six months after the appointed day, convey to the

Dewsbury Guardians or the Wakefield Guardians their estate or interest in any institution, buildings or other premises vested in them by this Article, upon such terms as may be agreed upon.

(3) Where any office of the board of guardians of a union dissolved by this Order is transferred to the Leeds Guardians by this Article, any officer duly authorised in writing by the last acting guardians of that union shall be entitled at all reasonable times to the use of that office, and to access to any books and papers therein of the dissolved union, for the purpose of the performance of the powers and duties of the last acting guardians.

(4) Paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Article shall extend to any parish workhouse vested in the Bramley Guardians, the Holbeck Guardians or the Hunslet Guardians but shall not extend to any other property vested in any of those Guardians in trust for a parish of their union.

(5) Nothing in this Article shall preclude a sale, exchange, letting or other disposition by the Leeds Guardians of any premises vested in them by this Article, or any part of premises so vested, under any enactment relating to the disposition of union property.

14.—(1) The Leeds Guardians, on and after the appointed day, shall provide for the maintenance of the inmates of all institutions which are transferred to them by this Order, subject however to the cost of the maintenance of all such inmates as are hereinafter referred to being repaid to the Leeds Guardians by the Dewsbury Guardians or by the Wakefield Guardians, at such reasonable rate as may be agreed upon, or in default of agreement may be prescribed by the Minister.

(2) The Dewsbury Guardians shall repay to the Leeds Guardians the reasonable cost as aforesaid of the maintenance in any such institution of any inmate who resided in the Township of Churwell, or in the Township of Gildersome, immediately before he last became chargeable, and of any inmate who is legally settled in either of the Townships aforesaid, but who did not reside in the Bramley Union or in the Holbeck Union, immediately before he last became chargeable.

(3) The Wakefield Guardians shall repay to the Leeds Guardians the reasonable cost as aforesaid of the maintenance in any institution, mentioned in paragraph (1) of this Article, of any inmate who resided in the Township of Oulton-with-Woodlesford or the Township of Rothwell immediately before he last became chargeable, and of any inmate who is legally settled in either of the Townships aforesaid, but who did not reside in the Hunslet Union immediately before he last became chargeable.

15.—(1) The Dewsbury Guardians and the Wakefield Guardians shall assume liability for the cost of maintenance, accruing on and after the appointed day, of any inmate of an institution which is not transferred to the Leeds Guardians by this Order, whose maintenance, before that day, falls to be defrayed by the Bramley Guardians, by the Holbeck Guardians, or by the Hunslet Guardians, as the case may be, and the cost of whose maintenance would be repayable

under the preceding Article of this Order by the Dewsbury Guardians or by the Wakefield Guardians, if such person were an inmate of an institution transferred by this Order to the Leeds Guardians.

(2) The cost of the maintenance in any institution which is not transferred to the Leeds Guardians of any inmate whose maintenance before the appointed day falls to be defrayed by the Bramley Guardians, the Holbeck Guardians or by the Hunslet Guardians or by the Guardians of the existing Township of Leeds, and is not by this Article transferred to the Dewsbury Guardians or to the Wakefield Guardians, shall be defrayed by the Leeds Guardians.

16. Nothing in the foregoing provisions in this Part of this Order shall affect the power of a board of guardians to obtain an order for the removal, or an adjudication of the chargeability, in accordance with the statutory provisions in that behalf, of any person who is in receipt of poor relief.

17.—(1) The Leeds Guardians, on and after the appointed day, shall provide for the administration of relief to all destitute persons who may be resident in any Township comprised within the Leeds Union.

(2) The Dewsbury Guardians, at a meeting in March, 1925, shall provide for the administration, on and after the appointed day, of relief to all destitute persons who may be resident in the Township of Churwell or the Township of Gildersome, and the Wakefield Guardians, at a meeting in March, 1925, shall provide for the administration of relief, on and after the appointed day, to all destitute persons who may be resident in the Township of Oulton-with-Woodlesford or the Township of Rothwell.

18. The Leeds Guardians, at their first meeting, shall provide for the administration of the Vaccination Acts, 1867 to 1907, within each parish comprised within the Leeds Union, and the Dewsbury Guardians and the Wakefield Guardians, at meetings in March, 1925, shall provide for the administration of those Acts within the Townships by this Order added to the Dewsbury Union and to the Wakefield Union.

#### PART IV.

##### PROVISIONS AS TO OFFICERS.

19.—(1) Any officer in the service immediately before the appointed day of the Holbeck Guardians, or of the Bramley Guardians, who acts for a district wholly comprised in or co-extensive with the Township of Churwell or the Township of Gildersome, shall be transferred to and become an officer of the Dewsbury Guardians.

(2) Any officer in the service immediately before the appointed day of the Hunslet Guardians, who acts for a district wholly comprised in or co-extensive with the area of the existing Townships of Rothwell and Oulton-with-Woodlesford, shall be transferred to and become an officer of the Wakefield Guardians.

(3) Save as hereinbefore provided, all officers in the service immediately before the appointed day of the Bramley Guardians, the Holbeck

Guardians or the Hunslet Guardians (except the clerk or treasurer of any of those Guardians, and any collector of poor rates or other officer by section 20 of the Act of 1924 transferred to the Leeds Corporation) shall be transferred to and become officers of the Leeds Guardians.

20. The Leeds Guardians, by an agreement with the Dewsbury Guardians or the Wakefield Guardians, may provide for the transfer to the Dewsbury Guardians or the Wakefield Guardians (as the case may be) of any officer who is transferred to the Leeds Guardians by this Order:

Provided that the consent of the officer to whom any such agreement relates shall be obtained before the agreement shall come into operation.

21. Any officer transferred by this Order, or by any agreement made under the preceding Article of this Order, shall remain subject to those provisions of sections 19 and 21 of the Act of 1924 which apply to transferred officers, and if any such officer was appointed under the authority of any special order made by the Minister, or his predecessors, that order shall, subject to the provisions aforesaid, continue to apply to him, with the substitution of the board of guardians to whom the officer is by this Order transferred for the board of guardians from whom the officer is by this Order transferred.

22. Where any officer is transferred by this Order to the Dewsbury Guardians, the Leeds Guardians, or the Wakefield Guardians, the contributions which have been made by the officer under the Poor Law Officers' Superannuation Act, 1896, shall, in so far as such contributions have been received by the Guardians of the Union from whom the officer is transferred, be paid to the Guardians of the Union to whom the officer is transferred by this Order.

#### PART V.

##### SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS.

23. For the purpose of any adjustment of property, income, debts, liabilities, expenses and financial relations which may become necessary in consequence of the alteration of poor law unions effected by section 6 of the Act of 1924 or by this Order—

(1) Section 62 of the Local Government Act, 1888, shall apply, subject to the modifications specified in the First Schedule to the Poor Law (Dissolution of School Districts and Adjustments) Act, 1903;

(2) The provisions of the Local Government (Adjustments) Act, 1913, shall not apply, notwithstanding the application by this Article of the said section 62.

24. Subject to the provisions of the Act of 1924 and of this Order, the Dissolved Boards of Management and Guardians Act, 1870, the Poor Law (Dissolution of School Districts and Adjustments) Act, 1903, and the Poor Law Authorities (Transfer of Property) Act, 1904, shall apply as if the alterations of area made by this Order were made under an Act relating to the relief of the poor, and nothing in the Act of 1924, or in this Order, shall affect the

continuance in office of any member of a dissolved board of guardians under and for the purposes of any of the Acts of 1870, 1903 and 1904, mentioned in this Article.

25. For the purpose of making such adaptations or amendments of the provisions in Part II of the Act of 1924 as are necessary to give effect to this Order, the adaptations or amendments set out in the Schedule to this Order are hereby made, and in the construction of any such adaptation or amendment the expression "the Leeds Union" shall mean the Leeds Union formed by this Order.

26. Section 9 of the Act of 1924, which relates to the preparation, alteration or re-arrangement of registers of electors for any area affected by that Act, shall extend to registers of electors for any area affected by this Order, and an order of the Secretary of State under subsection (4) of that section may be made for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of this Order, as if those provisions were contained in Part II of the Act of 1924.

27. Subject to the provisions of the Act of 1924 and of this Order, all poor law orders issued by the Minister or his predecessors which, immediately before the appointed day, are in force in—

(1) The Dewsbury Union, shall extend and apply to the Townships of Churwell and Gildersome;

(2) The Wakefield Union, shall extend and apply to the Townships of Rothwell and Oulton-with-Woodlesford.

28. Every person who at any time before the appointed day has acquired, or who immediately before that day is in the course of acquiring, a status of irremovability from—

(1) The Hunslet Union, by reason of residence in the Township of Templenewsam or the Township of Thorpe Stapleton;

(2) The Hunslet Union, by reason of residence in the Township of Oulton-with-Woodlesford or the Township of Rothwell; or

(3) The Holbeck Union, by reason of residence in the Township of Churwell, or the Bramley Union, by reason of residence in the Township of Gildersome;

shall be deemed to have acquired, or to be in the course of acquiring, a status of irremovability in the cases mentioned in paragraph (1) from the Leeds Union, in the cases mentioned in paragraph (2) from the Wakefield Union, and in the cases mentioned in paragraph (3) from the Dewsbury Union.

29.—(1) This Order shall not affect the continuance of any contract, deed, bond, agreement or other instrument entered into or made by the Bramley Guardians, the Holbeck Guardians or the Hunslet Guardians, and subsisting immediately before the appointed day:

Provided that—

(a) any debt or liability incurred, under any such instrument, by any of the Guardians aforesaid and accruing before the appointed day shall be paid and discharged by the last acting guardians of the Bramley Union, the Holbeck Union or the Hunslet Union, as the case may require, and any

money or other property accruing before the appointed day, under any such instrument, to the Bramley Guardians, the Holbeck Guardians or the Hunslet Guardians shall be paid to and recovered by the last acting guardians of such one of the said Unions as the case may require;

(b) any such instrument relating exclusively to the areas by this Order added to the Dewsbury Union or the Wakefield Union, or exclusively to any part of such area, shall, on and after the appointed day but subject to the foregoing proviso (a), have effect as if the Dewsbury Guardians or the Wakefield Guardians (as the case may be) were substituted for the board of guardians by whom the instrument was entered into or made;

(c) any such instrument not relating exclusively to the areas, or part of the areas, by this Order added to the Dewsbury Union or the Wakefield Union shall, on and after the appointed day but subject to the foregoing proviso (a), have effect as if the Leeds Guardians were substituted for the board of guardians by whom the instrument was entered into or made.

(2) This article, in its application to contracts or agreements with officers, or bonds relating to officers, shall have effect subject to the provisions of Part IV of this Order relating to officers.

30.—(1) The accounts of the Bramley Guardians, the Holbeck Guardians and the Hunslet Guardians, and the accounts of the Guardians of the existing Township of Leeds, for the year ending the 31st day of March, 1925, shall be audited by the district auditor in like manner and subject to the like incidents and consequences, as if this Order had not been made.

(2) Paragraph (1) of this Article shall extend to the accounts of any officer of any of the Guardians above-mentioned, as that paragraph applies to the accounts of the Guardians.

31. For the purpose of contributions to the common fund of the Dewsbury Union, of the Leeds Union or of the Wakefield Union, the assessable value of any parish included in any of those Unions by this Order shall be ascertained by reference to the valuation list of that parish until a valuation list for such parish shall have been finally approved by the Assessment Committee of the Union in which the parish is included by this Order.

32. All precepts or contribution orders issued or made before the appointed day shall be as valid in law as if this Order had not been made.

33. Nothing in this Order shall affect the area of any Rural District.

34. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as restricting the powers of the Secretary of State, or of the Minister, or of the council of any county or county borough under the Local Government Act, 1888, or the Local Government Act, 1894.

35. If any question, difference or difficulty arises in relation to any matter dealt with in this Order, the Minister may provide for the determination of the question or difference, or the removal of the difficulty.

*Power to Make Regulations.*

1.—(1) The Local Authorities of the Districts specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the Districts, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

*Confirmation of Regulations.*

2.—(1) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

*Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.*

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by Section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

*Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.*

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);  
Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

C. In the case of male workers other than those specified in B above:—(i) all employment on a Sunday (ii) all employment in excess of 50 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment).

Clause A above shall not apply in the case of any workman (whether of the special classes or not) who under an agreement with his employer is entitled in each half-year either to one week's holiday on full pay or to payment of double pay for one week's work.

the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are:—

(a) In the case of workers employed wholly or mainly on the duties of Stockmen, Teamsters, Carters or Shepherds less than 60 hours; or

(b) In the case of workers, other than those employed as in (a), less than 54 hours.

the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been the full hours mentioned above in the case of that worker.

4. For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal-times but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

5. These rates shall continue in operation up to and including the 1st May, 1925.
