**DRESS—LEVÉE DRESS.**

*Navy.*—Officers, R.N., R.N.R., and R.N.V.R., in possession of Full Dress Uniform—No. 1 Dress (Full Dress).

Officers, R.N., R.N.R., and R.N.V.R., not in possession of Full Dress Uniform—No. 3 Dress (Frock Coat with Epaulettes).

*Army.*—Officers in possession of Full Dress of their rank—Levée Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform of their rank—Service Dress.

*Air Force.*—Officers in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Full Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Service Dress.

The following are the Regulations to be observed:—

1. Gentlemen who have been presented and who wish to attend a Levée, should make a written application, as detailed below.

2. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of

Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all gentlemen other than those mentioned hereafter, should communicate with the Comptroller, Ceremonial Department, St. James's Palace. No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

3. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.

4. All Officers on the active, retired, and reserve lists of the Regular Army, the Militia, and the Territorial Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Under-Secretary of State, War Office.

Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller, Ceremonial Department, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for attendance or presentation.

5. All Officers of the Royal Air Force, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for

attendance or presentation, through the usual channels.

6. All Officers of the Indian Services and of the Indian Army, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or for presentation, from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

7. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Under-Secretary of State, the War Office, for their cards for attendance or for presentation, supporting their application, in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

8. Lord Mayors and Mayors, High Sheriffs, Sheriffs, Recorders, Chairmen of Quarter Sessions, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and all gentlemen connected with the Home Office, will make their applications, whether for attendance or for presentation, through the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for the Home Department.

9. Chairmen of County Councils, and all gentlemen connected with the Ministry of Health, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Minister of Health.

10. Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, other than those already mentioned, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

11. All gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office or any other Government Department will adopt the same procedure, and will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation from the Department under which they serve.

12. The names both for attendance and presentation must be received at the various Offices above indicated not later than ten days prior to the date of each Levée.

PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES  
FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with the regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918 and 1st August, 1922, respectively, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, in Great Britain for the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade, as specified in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1924, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO FIX Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Workers in those branches of the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade included by the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1924, which are not included by the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919.

Information as to the rates proposed to be fixed may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board at the address shown below.

Objections to the Trade Board's Proposal may be lodged with the Trade Board within two months of the date of this Notice. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Trade Board at the address shown below.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely and so far as possible with reasons what is objected to.
