The following Addresses were presented to HIS MAJESTY, at Buckingham Palace, on Saturday, the 14th instant:—

CONVOCAION OF CANTERBURY.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

WE, Your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Archbishop, Bishops and Clergy of the Province of Canterbury in Convocation assembled, approach Your Majesty with dutiful assurance of our devotion to Your Majesty's Throne and Person.

It is our privilege for the third time within three years to present an Address to Your Majesty on the occasion of the opening of a new Convocation. Such an opportunity of approaching Your Majesty is always welcome to us, and although, owing to the shortness of the interval since Your Majesty graciously replied to our last Address, the problems to which we then were permitted to refer still confront us, both in Church and State, we desire humbly to assure Your Majesty that by the blessing of Almighty God we have been enabled to make progress towards the solution of some of them.

Especially would we express our thankfulness to God that Your Majesty's Governments have successively re-affirmed the desire which lies near the heart of the people of this Realm for the promotion of peace upon earth. International relations are still so unstable that we

value highly the expression which has been given both in word and deed to our whole-hearted resolve to support the ideals of the League of Nations and to work in all wise ways for international co-operation.

The proportion of the population in our own country out of employment, though still unhappily very large, has grown somewhat smaller. Further, though we seem far from removing what Your Majesty described as the harm caused to the community by the scarcity of houses, the will to alleviate this need has obviously been strengthened during the last twelve months, and we would reassert our hope that a requirement so essential to the wholesomeness of home life may ere long be more adequately met.

Never, we believe, were the bonds which bind the Dominions to each other and to the Motherland in fealty to the Crown and devotion to Your Majesty stronger or firmer than they are to-day, and among the forces which cement those bonds are the visits paid to the Dominions by members of Your Majesty's Family. We assure Your Majesty of the prayers and of the dutiful interest with which we shall follow His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales on his impending visit to Africa, and have watched the visits of Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of York to the Eastern regions of that Great Continent. Nor would it be fitting to pass over in silence the influence of the Exhibition at Wembley, in which Your Majesty has shown so warm and

careful an interest. Your Majesty, as we gratefully remember, took part in the Service of Thanksgiving held there in connexion with the celebration of Empire Day.

In regard to the organic life of the Church of England, we are happy to record the continued success which has attended our deliberations both in Convocation and in the National Church Assembly. Six further Measures passed by the Assembly during the last year have received Your Majesty's assent, and the conclusion of our labours on the Revision of the Prayer Book is now within sight. Three Commissions have already been appointed to inquire in what way the findings of the Report of the Commission on the Administration of the Property and Revenues of the Church may best be embodied in further Measures.

The Assembly is also endeavouring to promote unity of administration in the educational system of this country, if that can be secured without peril to the religious principles whereof we are trustees; and, as a contribution towards the great work of Empire settlement, we are trying to encourage the migration to suitable regions overseas of groups of men, women, and children, who will carry to their new homes the common interests and experiences which they already share.

It may be of interest to Your Majesty to learn that during the past year the Upper Houses of the Convocations of Canterbury and York have sat together for their deliberations to secure the benefit of mutual counsel without impairing the independence of either Province.

We are still engaged to the utmost of our power in the endeavour to promote unity among all the followers of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, and hope, by improving the administration of the Church of England, and quickening the fellowship in which we are bound to all who worship and work in Christ's Name, to advance the fulfilment of the Divine purpose of redemption among men.

We would conclude, as always, with the humble prayer that the blessing of Almighty God our Heavenly Father, through our Lord Jesus Christ, may rest upon Your Majesty and upon every member of the Royal House.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—

It gives me much pleasure to receive this loyal and dutiful Address from Your Grace and the Bishops and Clergy of the Province of Canterbury in Convocation assembled, and I thank you for your prayers on behalf of myself and my House.

I am happy to learn of the progress made, since you last approached me a year ago, in dealing with the problems which then lay before you. It is interesting to hear of the work done and which is still being carried on by Convocation and the National Church Assembly, and to realise that their labours are not limited only to matters of Church organisation and administration but that, within the range of their proper activities, the Assembly endeavour to exercise the power and influence of the Church in forwarding the general welfare of the Community.

I note with satisfaction that the Assembly are considering proposals to secure unity of

administration in the system of public education; and it would indeed be a matter of congratulation were it possible to arrive at a settlement of this important issue acceptable to all parties.

I am especially glad to hear of your endeavours in connection with Empire Settlement. I believe that the Church can render important service in this great work for the material and social well-being of my people both in this country and overseas.

I am touched and gratified by your reference to the visits of my sons to the Dominions. The ties uniting those Dominions to the Mother-Country and to one another are of paramount importance; and it is reassuring to feel that such visits help to strengthen these ties.

I rejoice to learn that now, as last year, the promotion of Christian Unity is foremost in your thoughts and labours. Your efforts in this direction have my cordial sympathy and I pray that the Divine Blessing may rest upon you in this and all your undertakings.

CONVOCAATION OF YORK.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

The Humble Address of the Convocation of the Province of York.

May it please Your Majesty.

WE, Your Majesty's loyal and faithful Subjects, the Archbishop, Bishops and Clergy of the Province of York, in Convocation assembled, approach Your Majesty with the dutiful assurance of our devotion to Your Majesty's Throne and Person.

We welcome the opportunity afforded to us by the election of a new Parliament and Convocation to renew on behalf of the Church in the Northern Province our desire to promote and support all efforts of Your Majesty's Government which may be directed to set forth the welfare, moral and material, of the people.

Alterations in the political aspect of the Country effect little change in the matters which most concern us and our work, for, though in the movements of the national life, the balance of political opinion varies, the broad conditions of social well-being remain ever the same; and it is these, rather than the changes which determine the fortunes of the Government, that come within the sphere of our direct interest and responsibility.

We regret that the problem of Housing continues to be at once most intractable and most urgent, and we trust that in the face of what can no longer be regarded as other than a grave national peril, all classes of the community will be willing to co-operate in a spirit of unselfish readiness to meet a common need.

We regard with anxiety the social dislocation which has flowed from the long continued depression of the national Industries. Unemployment and the high cost of living are without doubt inflicting severe hardships on great multitudes of Your Majesty's subjects, and creating in their minds a discontent which, albeit natural, and indeed in the circumstances almost unavoidable, tends to hinder the growth of a sympathetic and intelligent co-operation between employers and workmen. Yet such co-operation appears to be indispensable if the

formidable difficulties which confront British Industries are to be overcome, and some return of national prosperity made possible. In this situation we believe that there is a special place and value for the efforts of the Church steadily directed towards strengthening the spirit of fraternity in all classes of the Community.

We welcome the indications of increased amity and concord among the Nations, and we trust that, as a result of the deliberations of Your Majesty's Government and the Governments of Your Majesty's Dominions, some means may be devised which will establish upon a more permanent basis the order and security of peace in Europe and throughout the World.

We are glad to notice that Your Majesty's Dominions are offering increased facilities and warm encouragement to Emigrants from this Country who wish to settle, whether in families, or groups of families, and we believe that in promoting the spiritual and moral welfare of such emigrants, the Church of England will play a useful part.

We are, however, of opinion that the restoration of Agriculture in our own Country is one of the first necessities of the present time, and we trust that all who are engaged or concerned in this great national industry will co-operate to promote its welfare.

We offer our earnest prayer that the blessing of Almighty God may rest abundantly on Your Majesty's Person, Home and Realm.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—

I thank Your Grace and the Bishops and Clergy of the Province of York in Convocation assembled for your loyal and dutiful Address.

I heartily agree with you that we must foster a spirit of brotherhood and co-operation between men of different political opinions and schools of thought in order to deal effectively with the grave problems which still confront the nation. As you have rightly said, to do this is essentially the work of the Church of Christ, and I welcome your assurance that you are fully alive to the special duties of the Church in this respect, and that it is your desire to promote and support all efforts of the Government which may be directed towards the moral or physical welfare of my people.

I share your view as to the difficulty and urgency of the Housing Problem. No one can fail to realise the disastrous effects of the present shortage of houses upon our social well-being. This question continues to engage the earnest attention of my Ministers, and I trust that their endeavours to encourage building enterprise and to increase the existing building resources of the country will, with God's help, be crowned with success.

The deplorable results of continued unemployment, combined with the high cost of living, to which your Address also refers, have long caused me deep concern; and the Government is seriously considering what are the best remedies for these evils.

Like you, I believe that the restoration of agriculture in this country is one of the foremost necessities of to-day. It is my earnest hope that all engaged in this great industry

will realise that it is by collaboration that the best interests, national as well as individual, can be served.

I thank you for the affection expressed and for the prayers you offer for myself and my Family. I pray that the Blessing of Almighty God may rest upon you and your labours.

APPOINTMENTS OF STANDINGS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of the Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for Fourteen Hackney Carriages, at Fitzjohns Parade and Broadhurst Gardens, N.W., and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz.:—

In two portions, viz.:—

First Portion.— Eight carriages commencing at North end of Fitzjohns Parade, and extend-

ing Southwards along the kerb on West side of Rest, as far as necessary for eight carriages, keeping clear of foot crossing to end of Triangle.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

Second Portion.—Six carriages in Broadhurst Gardens, on North side, by the iron railings enclosing land owned by the Great Central Railway Company, and extending as far as necessary for six carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriageway, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the Carriageway.
