LAND TRANSFER ACT, 1897.

TO THE COUNCIL OF THE COUNTY BOROUGH OF EASTBOURNE.

Whereas by a petition to the King's Most Excellent Majcsty in Council, dated the 1st day of December, 1924, the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Eastbourne, acting by the Council of the said County Borough under their common seal, prayed that His Majesty should by Order in Council declare, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the 20th section of the Land Transfer Act, 1897, as respects the County Borough of Eastbourne that registration of title to land should be compulsory on sale:

And whereas by sub-section (5) of the said section it is enacted that in the case of every Order proposed to be made under the said section notice shall six months before the Order is made be given to the Council of the County (which by sub-section (11) of the said section includes the Council of the County Borough) to which such Order is proposed to be applied and that a draft of the proposed Order, together with the name of at least one place within or conveniently near to the County, where a District Registry Office should be established shall accompany the notice:

And whereas it is proposed to make the Order prayed for:

Take notice in pursuance of the said subsection as follows:—

 It is proposed to make the Order, a draft of which accompanies this notice.

2. A District Registry Office will be established at the building of the existing Land Registry situated in Lincoln's Inn Fields, in the County of London, being a place conveniently near to the said County Borough.
