"And whereas the said Benefices of Spilsby with Eresby and Hundleby are now held in plurality by the Reverend Bernard Steinmetz:

"And whereas the said Bernard Steinmetz has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"And whereas there is no Parsonage House now belonging to the said Benefice of Hundleby:

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Spilsby with Eresby and Hundleby now belongs to one and the same Patron or Patrons:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the Diocesan Committee of the Diocese of Lincoln appointed pursuant to the first section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, (signified by a Resolution of the said Diocesan Committee dated the 9th January, 1925, and duly communicated to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Spilsby with Eresby and the said Benefice of Hundleby shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Spilsby with Hundleby' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Bernard Steinmetz if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Spilsby with Eresby and Hundleby shall be the first Incumbent of

the United Benefice.
"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Spilsby with Eresby shall become and be the house of residence for the

Incumbent of the United Benefice.
"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure, of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or Act of Parliament."

Bishop of Oxford, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said Archdeaconries of Buckingham and Oxford and with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within such Archdeaconries are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that

the same may be properly carried into effect:
"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the Parish of Kingsey shall be transferred from the Rural Deanery of Aylesbury, in the said Archdeaconry of Buckingham, to the Rural Deanery of Aston, in the said Archdeaconry of Oxford: and that the said Parish of Kingsey shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery and of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry in which it is hereby included and to which it is hereby transferred, and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery or Archdeaconry, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean or of any other Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of

any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas notices of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act been transmitted to the Archdeacons affected by the Scheme, that is to say, to the Archdeacon of Buckingham and to the Archdeacon of Oxford, and they have severally expressed their approval of the same:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Oxford.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of York, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Report, dated the 5th day of March, 1925, to His Majesty in Council, in the following terms:—

"We, the undersigned Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of York, Primate of England and Metropolitan, in pursuance of the 26th Section of an Act passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, hereby reports to Your Majesty in Council as follows:—

"1. That there are in the County and Diocese of York the Parishes of West Acklam, St. Hilda, Middlesbrough, and St. John the Evangelist, Middlesbrough, the boundaries whereof are well known and defined. And that the portion edged round with green color on the plan marked 'A' annexed hereto is a detached part of the Parish of West Acklam and that edged round with mauve color on the plan marked 'B' also annexed hereto is a detached part of the Parish of St. John the Evangelist, Middlesbrough.

"2. That the Parish of West Acklam con-

"2. That the Parish of West Acklam contains a population of 1,081 people according to the most recent estimation, is of the annual value of £231 and that the Patronage thereof is vested in William Hustler Hustler, Esq., and the present Vicar is the Reverend Arthur

Sumner Wetherall, M.A.

"3. That the said Parish of St. Hilda, Middlesbrough, contains a population according to the most recent estimation of 7,009 people, is of the net annual value of £337 and the Patronage thereof is vested in the Archbishop of York by virtue of his Archbishopric and the present Vicar is the Reverend Canon William Thomas Lawson, WA

M.A.

"4. That the said Parish of St. John the Evangelist, Middlesbrough, contains a population according to the most recent estimation of 25,663 people, is of the annual value of £600, the Patronage thereof is vested in the Archbishop of York by virtue of his Archbishopric and that the present Vicar is the Reverend Frank Morris Sykes, M.A.

"5. That the said Vicars and Patrons are

"5. That the said Vicars and Patrons are as such Vicars and Patrons consenting parties to the separation and re-arrangement and

annexation hereafter proposed.

"6. That it appears to the said Archbishop that under the provisions of the said Act of Parliament and of an Act passed in the second and third years of the Reign of Her late Majesty, Chapter 49, the boundaries of the said Parishes of West Acklam, St. Hilda, Middlesbrough, and St. John, Middlesbrough, may advantageously be re-arranged such rearrangement being in the opinion of the said Archbishop desirable owing to the fact that the portions of the said Parishes hereinafter referred to are in every case nearer to the Parish Church of the Parish to which it is proposed they shall be annexed than to the

Parish Church of the Parish to which they now belong and that such alteration will be for the convenience of the Inhabitants of such portions.

"7. That pursuant to the directions contained in the said first mentioned Act of Parliament the said Archbishop has prepared a Scheme in writing appended to this Report describing the mode in which it appears to him the alterations and re-arrangements of the boundaries of the said Parishes may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereupon in respect of Ecclesiatical Juris-diction, Glebe Lands, Tithe Rent charge and other Ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect of the Patronage may be made with justice to all parties concerned, and the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with such Scheme he doth by this Report to Your Majesty in Council certify the same to Your Majesty in Council with the consents in writing to the said Scheme of the respective Vicars and Patrons of the Parishes to be affected to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it should be expedient and proper so to do may make an Order for carrying such Scheme into effect.

#### " SCHEME.

"1. The separation of the detached part of the Parish of West Acklam colored round with green color as aforesaid on the plan marked 'A' referred to in the said Report from the said Parish of West Acklam and the annexation of the same to the said Parish of St. Hilda, Middlesbrough.

"2. The separation of the detached part of the Parish of St. John the Evangelist, Middlesbrough colored round with mauve color on the plan marked 'B' referred to in the said Report from that Parish and the annexation of the same to the said Parish of West Acklam.

- "3. That the Incumbent of the Parish to which any portion of any other Parish shall be annexed as aforesaid shall have sole and exclusive charge of souls within the limits of the said Parish. That the inhabitants of such portions shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the Parish Churches of the Parish from which such portions shall be so separated and shall be liable for the repair of the Parish Church of the Parish to which such portions shall be respectively annexed subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act, 1868.
- "4. That the fees for Marriages, Churchings and Burials and other Ecclesiastical dues, offerings and emoluments arising from either part of the portions separated and annexed as aforesaid shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Parish to which such portions shall be respectively annexed under the provisions of such Scheme.

"5. That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage or Endowments of any of the Benefices affected by this Scheme.

#### " Consents.

"We, the undersigned being respectively the Incumbents and the Patrons entitled to present to the several Benefices hereunder stated and affected by the foregoing Report and Scheme do hereby give this our consent in writing to the said Report and Scheme and to the several matters and things therein stated as far as the same affect our respective Benefices and Parishes Estates and interests as such Incumbents and Patrons as aforesaid. The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:-

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE Examinations for the situations of Assist-ANT INSPECTOR OF TAXES IN THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT, AND JUNIOR ASSIST-ANT AUDITOR IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 21 and 24. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st March or the 1st September of the year in which they are examined, according as the examination is held in the first or second half of the year.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz.:—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served for two full consecutive years in the Royal Irish Constabulary may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

- (c) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.
- 2. No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of persons serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.
- 3. No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

4. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows, and will be required to resign their

appointments on marriage.

5. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the

competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.
