**NOTICE** is hereby given, that by an Order dated the 6th day of March, 1925, the Court has directed separate Meetings to be convened of (1) the holders of the First Debentures and (2) the holders of the Special Debentures respectively of the above named Company for the purpose of considering and, if thought fit, approving (with or without modification) the Scheme of Arrangement proposed to be made between the said Company and the holders of the First and the holders of the Special Debentures of the said Company.
