PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 5th day of February, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Mary, Nunthorpe, situate within the Parish of Ayton, in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Ayton, of the Parish of Marton and of the Parish of Ormesby, both in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie Parish of Marton and of the said Parish of

contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Ayton. of the said Parish of Marton and of the said Parish of Ormesby, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Mary, Nunthorpe, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, as Bishop of the Diocese as the alternate Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Ayton, and as the Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Marton and the Vicarage of the said Parish of Ormesby, and with the consent of Sir William Francis Marwood, K.C.B., of Number 4, Ashburn Gardens, South Kensington, London, as the other alternate Patron of the said Vicarage of the Parish of Ayton (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Ayton, of the said Parish of

Ormesby, which are described in the Schedule ' hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Mary, Nunthorpe, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Nunthorpe.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem

meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Nunthorpe comprising:

"All those continguous portions of the Parish of Ayton, of the Parish of Marton, and of the Parish of Ormesby, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of York, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Gunnergate Lane and Back Lane with the road leading from Stokesley to Middlesbrough, and extending thence first eastward, then northeastward and then south-eastward along the middle of Back Lane (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Marton from the said Parish of Ormesby) for a distance of 1 mile and 33 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Nunthorpe to Guisborough, and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 68 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the Civil Parish of Upsall from the Civil Parish of Morton, and extending thence first south-eastward and then in various directions along such Civil Parish boundary for a distance of 66 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the stream called Main Stell upon the boundary which divides the Parish of Guisborough, in the said County and Diocese, from the said Parish of Ormesby, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the middle of Main Stell (thereby following in one part the last mentioned boundary, in another part the boundary which divides the Parish of Newton, in the said County and Diocese, from the said Parish of Ormesby, and in another part the boundary which divides the said Parish of Newton from the said Parish of Ayton) for a distance of 24 miles or thereabouts to the centre of Tree Bridge which carries the said road leading from Stokesley to Middlesbrough across such stream, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the readway leading to the house and premises known as Tunstall Farm, and extending thence first westward, then north-westward, and then south-westward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the boundary of the Civil Parish of Little Ayton, and extending thence first south-westward and then in various directions along the boundary of the said Civil Parish of Little Ayton (thereby following in part the middle of the River Tame;

in part the boundary which divides the Parish of Stokesley, in the said County and Diocese, from the said Parish of Ayton; in part the boundary which divides the Parish of Seamer, in the said County and Diocese, from the said Parish of Ayton; in part the boundary which divides a detached portion of the said Parish of Stokesley from the said Parish of Ayton; and in part the boundary which divides a detached portion of the said Parish of Seamer from the said Parish of Ayton) for a distance of 2 miles or thereabouts to the point where such Civil Parish boundary meets the boundary which divides the said Parish of Marton from the said Parish of Ayton, and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following in one part the southern side, in another part the western side, and in another part the eastern side of the roadway leading from Sunny Cross past the eastern side of the house and premises known as Brass Castle to the said road which leads from Stokesley to Middlesbrough) for a distance of 59 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the gateway at the eastern entrance to the house and premises known as Rye Hill Farm, and extending thence first northward to and then first northward and then in various directions along the middle of the last mentioned roadway for a distance of 45 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the said road leading from Stokesley to Middlesbrough, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 66½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Gunnergate Lane and Back Lane, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said Representation has

been approved by His Majesty in Council:
Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of York.

THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868.

THE GOVERNING BODY OF RUGBY SCHOOL having, on the 4th day of February, 1925, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, made Statutes in the terms appended hereto amending the existing Statutes of the said School, the said Statutes are hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And Notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Statutes.

STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Rugby School on the 4th day of February, 1925.

Officers of the Governing Body.

II.

That in Statute II the words "and a Bursar" be inserted after the words "Secretary or Clerk."

Religious Service.

III.

That in Statute III the words "Income of the School" be substituted for the words "Trust Income."

IV.

That a similar alteration be made in Statute IV.

Assistant Masters.

VI.

That Clauses 3 and 4 of Statute VI be repealed and in place thereof there be inserted:—

"3. The emoluments of the Masters shall be paid out of the Income of the School."

And that Clause 5 be in future numbered Clause 4

The Foundation.

VII.

That in Statute VII, in place of the Clause "There shall be paid out of the Trust Income to the School Payments Account in respect of every such Foundationer a sum equal to one-half the fees required by the Regulations to be paid on behalf of a Day Boy" there be inserted the following Clause: "There shall be charged against the Income of the School, in respect of every such Foundationer, all the fees required by the Regulations from an Old Foundationer."

IX.

That Statute IX in future read as follows:-

"Every Major Foundationer shall have the instruction of the School free of all charge, and all the fees required by the Regulations from a Major Foundationer shall be charged against the Income of the School."

X.

That Statute X in future read as follows:—

"Every Minor Foundationer shall pay half the fees required by the Regulations from a Major Foundationer, and the other half shall be charged against the Income of the School."

XI.

That Statute XI in future read as follows:-

"The number of Major Foundationers shall be limited to 12, and of Minor Foundationers to 24, except in cases where two Minor Foundationers shall have been appointed instead of one Major Foundationer, or one Major Foundationer instead of two Minor Foundationers, as hereinafter provided."

XII.

That Statute XII in future read as follows: -

"The number of Major and Minor Foundationers shall be filled up by degrees as the number of Old Foundationers diminishes, so that when there are less than 10 Old Foundationers there may be the full number of Major and Minor."

XIII.

That the first sentence of Statute XIII be reworded as follows:—

"In order to be admitted a Minor Foundationer, a boy must be above 12 and less than 14 years old on the 1st of January (for admission at the commencement of the Spring Term), or the 1st of May (for admission at the commencement of the Summer Term), or the 1st of September (for admission at the commencement of the Autumn Term) next preceding his admission."

XIV

That in Statute XIV the words "to the School" be inserted after the words "during the two years preceding his admission."

xv

That Statute XV in future read as follows:-

"If at any time there be an insufficient number of boys qualified according to the last preceding Statute to fill vacancies in the Major Foundationerships, two Minor Foundationers may be appointed instead of one Major Foundationer. If at any time there be an insufficient number of boys so qualified to fill vacancies in the Minor Foundationerships, one Major Foundationer may be appointed for every two of the Minor Foundationerships so vacant."

XVI..

That the last sentence in Statute XVI in future read as follows:—

"In the appointment of Major Foundationers, if the number of boys qualified exceed the number of vacancies, the boy's Record at the Lower School of Lawrence Sheriff shall be taken into account in conjunction with his performance at the Entrance Examination."

The Scholars.

XXIV.

That the first two sentences of Statute XXIV be reworded so as to read as follows:—

"At least twenty of the Scholarships shall be held for proficiency in Classics. The other Scholarships may be held for proficiency in such subjects as the Governing Body may from time to time determine."

General Rules respecting the Foundationers and Scholars.

XXV.

That at the end of Statute XXV the words "Autumn Term" be substituted for the words "Winter Term."

XXVII.

That in Statute XXVII after the words "in case of the grave misconduct" there be inserted the words "or persistent idleness."

The Exhibitioners.

XXXI.

That in Statute XXXI the words "Income of the School" be substituted for the words "Trust Income."

The Trust Income.

XXXIX.

That Statute XXXIX be repealed and in place thereof there be inserted as follows:

" The Trust Income.

" XXXIX.

- "1. The words 'The Trust Income' whether used in these Statutes or in any Regulation made by the Governing Body shall be taken to mean:
 - (a) The yearly income received by the Governing Body from the lands, premises and securities respectively described in the First and Second parts of the Schedule to the Rugby School Act, 1922, or any lands, premises or securities which may be substituted therefor, and from the securities in which any sums paid by the Governing Body to the Official Trustees of Charitable Funds under the provisions of Section 7 of the said Act are from time to time invested, and

(b) The Rent Charge referred to in paragraph (a) (ii) of sub-section (1) of Section 4 of the said Act.

- "2. The Governing Body shall keep an Account, to be called the Trust Income Account, in which shall be shown:—(1) as income The Trust Income as above defined; and (2) as expenditure:-
 - (a) The lawful and necessary charges and expenses of the management, maintenance and repair of the said lands and premises, and any expenses incurred by the Governing Body upon any change or transfer of, or otherwise in connection with, the said securities, and

(b) The annual sum, if any, from time to time paid by the Governing Body to the Official Trustees of Charitable Funds and to the Almshouse Trustees respectively under the provisions of Section 8 and Section 15 of the Rugby School Act, 1922.

(c) The annual sums from time to time paid by the Governing Body to the Governors of the Lower School of Lawrence Sheriff, Rugby, under the provisions of Section 18 of the Rugby School Act, 1922.

(d) The annual sums from time to time

- retained by, or paid to, the Governing Body for the purposes of Rugby School, which last mentioned arnual sums, as and when ascertained, shall be transferred by the Governing Body to the Account hereinafter referred to in connection with 'The Income of the School.
- "3. No payment other than those provided for by the second section of this Statute shall be made directly out of The Trust Income Account.

XL.

That Statute XL be repealed and in place thereof there be inserted as follows: -

> " The Income of the School. " XL.

- "1. The words 'The Income of the School' whether used in these Statutes or in any Regulation made by the Governing Body shall be taken to mean:-
 - (a) That portion of the Trust Income which is received or retained by the Governing Body for the General Purposes of Rugby School.

- (b) All other income whether from investments, rents, fees, or from other sources, received or retained by the Governing Body for the General Purposes of Rugby School.
- "2. The method of the administration of The Income of the School, and the form in which the Accounts in connection therewith shall be kept, shall be determined by the Governing Body from time to time by Regulation.

Provision for Deficient or Surplus Income.

XLT

That Statute XLI be reworded so as to read as follows:-

- "1. In case the Income of the School shall be insufficient in any year to meet the several charges to which it is by these Statutes and by Regulation made applicable, it shall be in the discretion of the Governing Body to determine which of such charges shall be diminished in amount or discontinued: Provided that no diminution shall be made in the payments on behalf of any class of the Foundationers, so long as any other charges on the Income of the School are capable of being diminished or discontinued.
- "2. In case the Income of the School shall be in any year more than is required to satisfy all the charges and purposes hereinbefore authorised, the Governing Body may either invest the surplus, provided it be not less than £100, in any investments from time to time authorised by Law for the investment of trust money, and apply the Income of such investments to the General Purposes of the School, or may apply the surplus in such manner as they may from time to time determine for the General Purposes of the School. Such General Purposes may include the improvement or extension of the School Buildings, the acquiring of property at Rugby for the use and benefit of the School, or the improvement in number or value of the Prizes, Scholarships, or Exhibitions."

Accounts.

XLII.

That Statute XLII in future read as follows:-

" Accounts.

" XLII.

"The Governing Body shall cause to be made out as soon as may be after the close of each financial year an abstract of the Receipts and Disbursements on account of the School during the preceding twelve months, arranged in such manner as they shall deem necessary and convenient, and the said Abstract shall be examined by the Governing Body, and, if approved by them as correct, shall be signed by the Chairman."

Whereas under Section 11 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, the Registrar General with the sanction of the Minister of Health may divide any union into two or more Superintendent Registrars' Districts:

And whereas under Section 21 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, the Registrar General with the sanction of the Minister of Health may alter the boundaries of Regis-

tration Sub-districts:

And whereas by the operation of the Leeds Corporation Act, 1924, the existing Township of Leeds will, on the 1st day of April, 1925, be extended to include the existing Townships of Armley and Bramley, Holbeck and Hunslet, and the existing Parish of Osmondthorpe:

And whereas on the 1st day of April, 1925, by the operation of the Leeds (Alteration of

Unions) Örder, 1925:—

(i) The Bramley Union, the Holbeck Union and the Hunslet Union will be dissolved;

(ii) The Townships of Churwell and Gildersome will be added to and form part

of the Dewsbury Union;

(iii) The Townships of Oulton-with-Woodlesford and Rothwell will be added to and form part of the Wakefield Union;

(iv) The Townships of Templenewsam and Thorpe Stapleton will, together with the extended Township of Leeds be united to form a union to be called the Leeds Union:

And whereas it is expedient that consequential alterations should be made in the constitution of certain Registration Districts and Sub-districts:

Now, therefore, 1, Sylvanus Percival Vivian, Registrar General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Births and Deaths Registration Acts, 1836 to 1901, and with the sanction of the Minister of Health, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Leeds Registration of Births, &c., Order, 1925, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1925.

2. In this Order the expression "existing" means existing immediately before

3. The Interpretation Act. 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

4.—(1) The Township of Churwell shall be transferred from the Holbeck Sub-district of the Holbeck Registration District to the Morley Sub-district of the Dewsbury Registration District.

(2) The Registrar of the existing Morley Sub-district shall be the Registrar of that Sub-district as extended by this Order.

5.—(1) The Gildersome Sub-district of the Bramley Registration District shall cease to exist and the Township of Gildersome shall form a new Sub-district of the Dewsbury Registration District to be known by the name of the Gildersome Sub-district.

(2) The Registrar of the existing Gildersome Sub-district of the Bramley Registration District shall be the Registrar of the

Gildersome Sub-district of the Dewsbury Registration District constituted by this

6.—(1) The Rothwell Sub-district of the Hunslet Registration District shall cease to exist. The Townships of Oulton-with-Woodlesford and Rothwell shall form a new Sub-district of the Wakefield Registration District to be known by the name of the Rothwell Sub-district, and the part of the Township of Hunslet now situated in the Rothwell Sub-district shall be transferred to the Hunslet Sub-district of the Hunslet Registration District.
