SALMON AND FRESHWATER FISHERIES ACT, 1923.

FRESHWATER FISHERIES (AVON BRUE AND PARRET FISHERY DISTRICT) ORDER, 1925.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the above Order under Section 65 of the Salmon and Freshwater Fisheries Act, 1923. The effect of the Order is to extend to "freshwater fish" within the District the provisions of Sections 61 to 64 of the Act relating to licences and licence duties, and to render it an offence against the Act for any person to take freshwater fish otherwise than by means of an instrument which he is duly licensed to use for the purpose.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 27TH MARCH, 1925.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Authorisation of Landing of Animal for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of the Animal described in the First Schedule hereto, which is intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed, subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animal described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination Before Landing.

3. No such animal as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animal has been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulation Applicable to the Animal on Landing.

4. The animal on being landed shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animal shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

ORDER DEFINING THE BENEFITS OR ADVANTAGES WHICH MAY BE RECKONED AS PAYMENT OF WAGES IN LIEU OF PAYMENT IN CASH.

and the values at which they may be reckoned shall be as follows:—

1. (a) *Lodgings*, except in any case in which the Agricultural Wages Committee shall have determined that the lodging accommodation so provided is so defective as to be injurious to health.
- (b) *Board*, including any meals but not including intoxicating drink.
- (c) *Cottage*, including any garden provided with the cottage except where the cottage is one in regard to which the Medical Officer of Health has reported that it is in a state so dangerous or injurious to health as to be unfit for human habitation.
2. *Values*.
 - (a) Board and Lodging for a 7 day week—15s.
Board and Lodging for a 6 day week—12s. 6d.
 - (b) Board only for a 7 day week—11s.
Board only for a 6 day week—9s.
 - (c) Cottage—3s. per week, less any rent or rates paid by the occupier, provided that in the case of a cottage with regard to which the Committee, on an application by or on behalf of a worker have certified that by reason of inadequate accommodation, want of repair or sanitation, the value of such cottage is less than 3s., the value shall be such sum less than 3s. as the Committee shall determine on consideration of the defects.

3. This Order shall become effective on the 6th of April, 1925.
