THE CASUAL POOR (REIJEF) ORDER, 1925.

69.910

The Minister of Health, in pursuance of all powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby Orders that, subject to any departure to which

he may assent, or to any direction which he may hereafter give, the following provisions shall have effect, that is to say :-

INTERPRETATION AND GENERAL.

Title.

1. This Order may be cited as "The Casual Poor (Relief) Order, 1925," and shall come into operation on the 1st day of May, 1925.

Interpretation.

2.—(1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires:-

" Casual " means any destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor

''Casual ward '' means any ward, building. or premises set apart or provided for the

reception, relief or employment of casuals; "Guardians" includes the Board of Management of the Metropolitan Asylum

District;
"The Master" includes the Superintend-

ent of a Casual Ward;
"The Matron" includes the Female

Superintendent of a Casual Ward; "The Medical Officer" me means Medical Officer of the Institution, or where a special Medical Officer is appointed for the Casual Ward, such Medical Officer; "The Metropolis" means the area of the

Metropolitan Asylum District.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Rescission of Existing Orders.

3.—(1) (a) The Orders specified in the first Schedule hereto, and

(b) Any provision in any other Order any Regulation \mathbf{or} issued by the Minister or his predecessors which is substantially to the same effect as a provision in an Order so specified,

are hereby rescinded.

(2) A reference in any Order or Regulation of the Minister or his predecessors to any Order or provision hereby rescinded shall be construed as a reference to the corresponding

provision (if any) of this Order.

(3) Where in pursuance of any Order or provision hereby rescinded a direction or approval has been given or a departure from any provision has been sanctioned by the Minister or his predecessors the direction, approval or sanction shall continue to have effect, until the Minister otherwise directs, as if it were a direction or approval under this Order, or a sanction to a departure from the corresponding provision of this Order, as the case may be.

MANAGEMENT OF THE CASUAL WARD.

Admission of Casuals.

- 4.—(1) A casual shall be admitted only in one of the following ways, that is to say-
 - (a) on an order signed by a relieving officer or an assistant relieving officer; or
 - (b) in a case of sudden or urgent necessity, on an order signed by an Overseer;

(c) by the Master.

- (2) An order of admission to a casual ward:-
 - (a) shall show the hour and place at which it was given;
 - (b) shall be available only on the day on which it was issued.
- (3) If in any case a casual presenting himself for admission is not admitted, the name of the casual, the circumstances in which admission was refused and the date and time of refusal shall be recorded in the book referred to in Article 8 (2) of this Order.

Searching Casuals.

5. Every casual shall immediately upon admission be searched, in the case of a male, by or under the inspection of the Master or other male officer, and in the case of a female. by or under the inspection of the Matron or other female officer, and all articles which may be found upon such casual shall be taken away, and, except as regards any money which may be dealt with in the manner prescribed by Section 10 of the Poor Law Amendment Act, 1848, shall be restored to him at the time of his discharge.

Bath.

6. Every casual shall be bathed as soon as practicable after his admission, with clean warm water, unless there is reason to believe that bathing would be injurious to his health.

Clothing.

7. The clothing worn by a casual shall, after his admission, be taken from him, and if Suitable requisite be dried and disinfected. night clothing shall be supplied to him, and his own clothes shall be returned to him in the morning.

Register, &c.

8.—(1) The Master shall duly keep, or cause to be kept, an Admission and Discharge Book, containing the particulars set forth in the Form in the Second Schedule hereto, and such other particulars as may be required by the Guardians

(2) The Master shall also record, in a suitable book, any other particulars required by this Order, and any other matters which, in his opinion, ought to be brought to the notice of the Guardians. The said book shall be laid before the Guardians, or such Committee as the Guardians may require, at each meeting.

(3) The Master shall report to the Guardians every half-year, either in his general report or otherwise, upon the condition of the Casual Wards and upon the observance of the regu-

lations contained in this Order.

(4) The Medical Officer shall include in any report made by him under Article 59 (12) of the Poor Law Institutions Order, 1913, a report upon the conditions of the Casual Wards.

Discharge.

- 9. A casual shall not be allowed to discharge himself before the time at which he is entitled to do so by Section 4 of the Casual Poor Act, 1882, as set out in the Fifth Schedule hereto, except in the following circumstances:
 - (a) if he represents to the Master that he is desirous of seeking work, in which case, if he has to the best of his ability performed the prescribed task of work, he shall be

allowed to take his discharge at 6.30 o'clock in the morning of the day upon which he

is entitled to take his discharge; or

(b) in accordance with a rule adopted by the Guardians and reported to the Minister for approval, permitting the earlier discharge of a particular class or classes of casuals; or

(c) if there are special circumstances which in the opinion of the Master require that he shall be discharged on a Sunday or otherwise before the time at which he is entitled to discharge himself. The Master shall record the facts of any such case in the book referred to in Article 8 (2) of this Order.

Dietary.

10. Every casual shall be supplied, in accordance with the regulations contained in the Third Schedule hereto, with meals during his detention, and with breakfast and a midday meal on the day of his discharge.

11. The Master shall set every casual not suffering under any temporary or permanent infirmity of body to perform one of the tasks of work prescribed in the Fourth Schedule hereto, or prescribed from time to time by the Guardians with the approval of the Minister:

Provided that a casual shall be excused from the whole or any part of such task of work if it shall appear that the task is not suited to his age, strength, or capacity.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

Female, Casuals.

12. The Matron shall supervise and control the premises set apart for female casuals, and shall assist the Master in the General management and superintendence of the Casual Ward.

· Behaviour of Casuals.

- 13. The following regulations shall be observed by every casual, viz.:—
 - (i) He shall not use obscene or profane language, or act or write indecently or obscenely;
 - (ii) He shall not, by word or deed, insult or revile, or threaten to strike or assault, any officer or servant of the Guardians;
 - (iii) He shall not wilfully disobey any lawful order of any officer or any regulation lawfully made by the (fuardians.

Illness of Casuals.

- 14.—(1) If any casual appears to require medical attention the Master shall, as soon as practicable, obtain the attendance of the Medical Officer, and make arrangement for his transference to an appropriate institution unless he can properly be treated in the Casual Ward.
- (2) Any application by a casual to see the Medical Officer, and any action taken thereon, shall be recorded in the book referred to in Article 8 (2) of this Order.
- (3) The Medical Officer shall report to the Minister any case of dangerous infectious disease or any death occurring in the Casual Ward.

Transference to Institution.

15.—(1) Any casual who is infirm or is a child, and, if the Medical Officer deems it expedient, any other casual, may be trans-

ferred to the Institution, and shall, if so transferred, be deemed to be an ordinary inmate thereof.

(2) If a casual makes application for admission to the Institution, the Master may retain him in the Institution or the Casual Ward until the next meeting of the Guardians, at which the application shall be considered.

Sleeping Accommodation.

- 16.—(1) Proper sleeping accommodation, bed clothing, and means of communication with a responsible officer shall be provided for the casuals.
- (2) Except in the case of a mother and her infant child, more than one casual shall not be allowed to sleep in the same bed or in any room or structure designed for the use of one person only.

Extracts to be Posted.

17. The Guardians shall cause to be affixed in some conspicuous place in the Casual Ward a printed copy of Articles 5, 6, 7, 9, 13 and 14 of this Order, as well as of the Dietary Tables and the Tasks of Work in force for the time being, and the statutory provisions set out in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

Joint Committees.

- 18.—(1) Where the Guardians are represented upon a Committee established for the purpose of the better administration of relief to casuals in any area not within the Metropolis which administers relief in accordance with a scheme approved by the Minister or his predecessors, they may defray such reasonable expenditure as may be necessary for the purposes of the said scheme.

 (2) The accounts of every such Committee
- (2) The accounts of every such Committee shall be made up annually on the thirty-first day of March, and shall be submitted to the district auditor.

METROPOLIS.

Application to Metropolis.

- 19. This Order shall apply to the Metropolis subject to the following modifications:—
 - (1) The Metropolis shall be a Casual Poor District within which the Board of Management of the Metropolitan Asylum District shall administer the relief of casuals.

(2) The Casual Wards of the Board shall continue to be for the common use of the District.

(3) "The Institution" means the Institution of the Union in which the Casual Ward is situated.

(4) An officer appointed for that purpose by the Metropolitan Asylums Board may at his discretion admit a casual without an order signed by a relieving officer or an assistant relieving officer.

(5) The Metropolitan Asylums Board may make rules under Article 9 (b) of this Order.

Effect of Rescission of Orders.

- 20. The rescission by this Order of the Metropolitan Casual Paupers Order, 1911, shall not in any way affect,—
 - (a) the rights of any officer or servant referred to in Article IV (2) of that Order, or
 - (b) the continuing validity of any arrangement or agreement referred to in the said Article IV (2), or in Article III of, and in

Part II of the Schedule to, the Metropolitan Casual Wards (Transfer) Order, 1912. [S.R. & O. 1912, No. 318.]

Disputes.

21. Any difference between the Board of Management of the Metropolitan Asylum District and any Board of Guardians in the Metropolis with reference to any matter arising out of the provisions of this Order shall be settled as the Minister may determine.

22. Nothing in this Order shall affect the provisions of Section 4 of the Metropolitan

Houseless Poor Act, 1865.

2. The dietary of a casual who is sick or infirm shall be such as may be prescribed in

writing by the Medical Officer.

3. The Master may, if he thinks fit in any case, give to a casual an additional allowance (not exceeding 4 oz.) of bread at any meal, and in each such case he shall record his action in the Admission and Discharge Book.

4. In the case of an infant suckled by his mother the allowance for the infant may be given

to the mother instead of to the infant.

5. In the case of each child under 12 years of age the Matron shall cause the allowance of food prescribed in respect of each meal to be prepared in such manner and to be given at such

times and in such way as shall be suitable to the child. 6. Where milk is prescribed, it shall be new milk, whole and undiluted: provided that unsweetened condensed whole cream milk or dried whole cream milk may be substituted for new milk in the proportion of four ounces of condensed milk or one and a half ounces of dried

milk, with the proper addition of hot water, for half a pint of new milk.

Decino

Any pauper who—

- (1) Abscords or escapes from or leaves any casual ward before he is entitled to discharge himself therefrom; or
- (2) Refuses to be removed to any work-house or asylum under the provisions of this Act; or
- (3) Abscords or escapes from or leaves any workhouse or asylum during the period for which he may be detained therein; or
- (4) Refuses or neglects, whilst an inmate of any casual ward, workhouse, or asylum, to do the work or observe the regulations prescribed; or

(5) Wilfully gives a false name or makes a false statement for the purpose of obtaining relief

shall be deemed an idle and disorderly person within the meaning of section three of the Vagrancy Act, 1824.

And every pauper who—

(1) Commits any of the offences before mentioned after having been previously convicted as an idle and disorderly person; or

(2) Wilfully destroys or injures his own clothes or damages any of the property of the Guardians,

shall be deemed a rogue and vagabond within the meaning of section four of the same Act.

Divided Parishes and Poor Law Amendment Act, 1876.

Section 44.

The word "pauper" in Section 7 (5) of the Pauper Inmates Discharge and Regulation Act, 1871, shall include any person who shall obtain relief by wilfully giving a false name, or making a false statement, and such person may be proceeded against as an idle and disorderly person at any time while he continues to receive such relief.

Casual Poor Act, 1882. Section 4.

A casual pauper shall not be entitled to discharge himself from a casual ward before nine o'clock in the morning of the second day following his admission, nor before he has performed the work prescribed for him as mentioned in the Pauper Inmates Discharge and Regulation Act, 1871; and where a casual pauper has been admitted on more than one occasion during one month into any casual ward of the same union, he shall not be entitled to discharge himself before nine o'clock in the morning of the fourth day after his admission, and he may at any time during that interval be removed by any officer of the guardians, or by a police constable, to the workhouse of the union, and be required to remain in such workhouse for the remainder of the period of his detention:

Provided that in computing the number of that the said yearly rectorial tithe comdays during which a casual pauper may be nutation rentcharges expressed to be hereby

detained under this section Sunday shall not be included:

Provided also, with respect to the metropolis as follows:—

- (1) In determining the number of admissions of a casual pauper every casual ward in the metropolis shall be deemed to be a casual ward of the same union.

 (2) The expression "workhouse of the union" in this section shall include any workhouse and any asylum provided under the Metropolitan Poor Act, 1867, for the reception and setting to work of the casual poor, to which the casual poor of the union can be sent.

Section 5.

If any person for the purpose of obtaining relief from the rates raised for the relief of the poor, for himself or for any other person, wilfully gives a false name, or make or uses a false statement to the guardians of any union or any of their officers, he shall be deemed an idle and disorderly person within the meaning of section three of the Vagrancy Act, 1824.
