THE PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS, 1925.

Notice is hereby given, under Section 3 (3)
of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that the

England and Wales.

The effect of the regulations will be to con-

Health (Foreign Meat) Amending Regulations,
1909.
