

ORDER DEFINING THE PROVISION OF BOARD AND LODGING AS A BENEFIT OR ADVANTAGE WHICH MAY BE RECKONED AS PAYMENT OF WAGES IN LIEU OF PAYMENT IN CASH.

The Somerset Agricultural Wages Committee, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Agricultural Wages Committees Regulations, 1924, do by this Order define the following benefit or advantage (not

being a benefit or advantage prohibited by law) as a benefit or advantage which may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash for the purpose of the application of any minimum rate of wages fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative County of Somerset which for the purposes of the said Act shall be deemed to include the City and County Borough of Bath, and the value at which it may be so reckoned, viz.:—
