HEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Commission, dated the 17th day of March, 1925, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highness The Prince Henry, K.G., G.C.V.O., His Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, G.C.V.O., the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury, or any two of them, in His Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom, to summon and hold on His Majesty's behalf His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His Majesty's approval of any matter or thing to which His Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 6th day of April, 1925 (N. 775/25), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pension Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was pleased by Order in Council of the 26th September, 1891, to authorize the payment of Prize Money for Pistol Firing to Working Petty Officers, Seamen and Stokers of Your Majesty's Fleet at the rate of 1d. per head of authorized complement:

"And whereas by Order in Council of the 6th February, 1922, all Naval Ratings in vessels of Your Majesty's Navy were made eligible for payment of this Prize Money:

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HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE HENRY.

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"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 2nd day of August, 1918, to sanction the grant, at our discretion, of Temporary Commissions as Acting Chaplains to Ministers of Religious Bodies, not in conformity with the Church of England, who rendered full time service in the Royal Navy during the period of the late war:

'And whereas The Reverend Thomas P. Kent and the Reverend James Cassar were granted Temporary Commissions as Acting Roman Catholic Chaplains with seniority of 2nd August, 1914, under the terms of Your Majesty's aforesaid Order in Council, and served in Your Majesty's Naval Service until 31st August, 1924, and 4th December, 1924,

And whereas we consider that such service should render these Officers eligible for

retired pay:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposals:

" (1) The retired pay granted to each Officer to be based on a standard rate of £225 a year, and to be awarded at the rate of £212 10s. 0d. a year as from the date of their

respective retirements.

" (2) The standard rate of £225 a year to be regarded as comparable with rates authorized in Schedule V, Section IX of Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, and to be subject to revision at the same dates and in the same manner as retired pay authorized by that Order.

" The Lords Commissioners of Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in these proposals.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000 They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 31st March, 1925, rank pari passu with those issued under the prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. LONDON TRAFFIC.

THE LONDON TRAFFIC (RESTRICTED STREETS)
REGULATIONS, 1925, DATED APRIL 6, 1925,
MADE BY THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT UNDER
THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924 (14 & 15
GEO. 5. c. 34).

Whereas by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1925 (S.R. & O. 1925, No. 179), the Minister of Transport declared certain streets within the London Traffic Area to be and the same are hereinafter referred to as "restricted streets."

Now therefore the Minister of Transport, under and in pursuance of the powers given to him under Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and without prejudice to any further exercise of the said powers, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as "The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1925."
- 2. Subject as in these Regulations provided, it shall not be lawful for any person to use or allow to be used at any time upon a weekday in any restricted street or part thereof for the purpose of plying for hire along that street or part thereof any greater number of omnibuses than might, under and in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924 and the Schedule or Schedules deposited by him under that Section with the licensing authority and in force on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, have been used by him at that time on that week-day in that street or part thereof for the purpose of maintaining along that street or part thereof the regular service or services which were shown in such Schedule or Schedules.
- 3. The restrictions and limitations imposed by the foregoing Regulation shall be subject to the following modifications and exceptions:—
 - (a) The provisions of Regulation 2 hereof shall not apply:—
 - (i) on Good Friday, the day following Good Friday, Bank Holidays and days appointed by Proclamation to be Bank Holidays;
 - (ii) in the case of the streets or parts of streets shown in the First Schedule to these Regulations on Saturdays from and after 12 o'clock noon.
 - '(b) On Saturdays, from and after 12 o'clock noon, the number of omnibuses

- which it shall be lawful under Regulation 2 hereof for any person to use for the purpose of plying for hire along any restricted street or part of a restricted street shall be increased by 10 per cent.;
- (c) On the days on which the British Empire Exhibition is open to the public, any person maintaining a regular service in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924 upon a new route shown in the first column of the Second Schedule to these Regulations may, if such excess as is hereinafter mentioned is due solely to the use of omnibuses by him for the purpose of maintaining such regular service on such new route, use in any of the restricted streets or parts thereof shown opposite to such new route in the second column of the said Schedule a number of omnibuses exceeding the number of omnibuses which he may use in that street or part thereof under Regulation 2 hereof by not more than 25 per cent. of the number of omnibuses which might, under and in accordance with the said Section 6 and the Schedule or Schedules deposited by him and in force on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, have been used by him for the purpose of maintaining along that restricted street or part thereof the regular service or services shown in such Schedule or Schedules on the old approved routes set out in the third column of the Second Schedule hereto opposite to such new route;
- (d) Where between the first and the thirteenth days of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five (both inclusive), any person substituted, under and in accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924 another schedule or other schedules (hereinafter called "his substituted schedules") for the schedule or schedules deposited by him under that section with the licensing authority and in force on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty - five (hereinafter called schedules of the 1st January, 1925 "), and the total number of omnibuses which might have been used by him on restricted streets under his substituted schedules did not exceed the number of omnibuses which might have been so used under his schedules of the 1st January, 1925, and he has within eight days of the date on which these Regulations are made given notice in writing to the Minister of Transport of his desire that the use by him of omnibuses in restricted streets shall be limited by reference to his substituted schedules and not by reference to his schedules of the 1st January, 1925, these Regulations shall in their application to him have effect as though the references therein to his schedules of the 1st January, 1925, were references to his substituted schedules.
- 4. The Minister of Transport may, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee, by notice published in the London Gazette, dispense with or relax on any occasion the restrictions imposed by these Regulations, either generally or in the case of particular streets or parts thereof.

LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Minister of Transport proposes to make an Order under Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, declaring streets specified in the Schedule hereto to be restricted streets, that is to say, streets in which the plying for hire by omnibuses ought to be prohibited or restricted either generally or during particular hours.

NOTICE IS HEREBY AND ALSOGIVEN that the Minister proposes to make Regulations under the same Section restricting the plying for hire by omnibuses in such streets so shall not be lawful for any person to use or allow to be used at any time upon any day (other than Good Friday, the day following Good Friday, Bank Holidays and days appointed by proclamation to be Bank Holidays), in any restricted street or part thereof for the purpose of plying for hire along that street or part thereof any greater number of omnibuses than might, under and in accord-ance with Section 6 of the said Act, and the Schedule or Schedules deposited by him under

that Section with the licensing authority and in force on the 17th day of April, 1925, have been used by him at that time, on that day in that street or part thereof for the purpose of maintaining along that street or part thereof the regular service or services which were shown in such Schedule or Schedules. The Regulations will also provide for a modification of the foregoing restriction on the days on which the British Empire Exhibition is open to the public.

Before making the Order or the Regulations above referred to the Minister will refer the matter to the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee for their advice and report.

Any person affected who desires to make representations in connection with the proposed Order or Regulations should forward such representations in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Transport, London Traffic

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ROADS ACT, 1920.

COUNTY OF WEST SUSSEX.

Notice is hereby given that on the fourth day of April, 1925, the Minister of Transport made an Order under Section 7 (4) of the Roads Act, 1920, in respect of certain highways in the County of West Sussex.

The Order will come into force upon the first day of May, 1925, and is to the following

During the period of five years from the date on which this Order comes into force, no person shall drive or cause to be driven on the highways or portions of highways specified in the First Schedule hereto any locomotive, any heavy motor car (as defined by Article II of the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904), or any motor car with seats for more than fourteen persons exclusive of the driver:

During the period of two years from the date on which this Order comes into force, no person shall drive or cause to be driven on the highways or portions of highways specified in the Second Schedule hereto any locomotive, any heavy motor car (as defined by Article II of the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904), or any motor car with seats for more than fourteen persons exclusive of the driver.

During the period of five years from the date on which this Order comes into force, no person shall drive or cause to be driven on the highways or portions of highways specified in the Third Schedule hereto any mechanically-propelled vehicle which has an unladen weight exceeding three tons or which has seats for more than twenty persons exclusive of the driver.

Provided that during the period in each year commencing one week before the first day of the annual race meeting at Goodwood Park and terminating one week after the last day of the meeting the provisions of this Order shall not apply to the following roads in the First Schedule:-

Road from the Chichester—Eastergate Road near Tangmere Hotel, Oving, Oving and Longport Cottage to its junction with the Chichester-Bognor Road at Colworth Farm.

Road from the road junction at Waterbeach near the south-eastern corner of Goodwood Park viâ Westerton to its junction with the Westhampnett-Goodwood road at Woodcote Cottage.

Nothing in this Order contained shall prevent the driving on the highways or portions of highways specified in the Schedules hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said roads")

(i) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said roads or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;

(ii) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said roads,

(iii) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improve-ment or reconstruction of the said roads or the laying, alteration or repair in or near to the said roads of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas. water or electricity.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES. (DATED 15TH APRIL, 1925.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:

Authorisation of Landing of Sheep for Exceptional Purposes.

 The landing of the sheep described in the First Schedule hereto which are intended for exhibition is hereby allowed subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of the sheep under this Order.

Regulations Applicable to Animals on Landing.

- 3.—(1) The sheep, before being landed, shall be examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and if found by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease, shall forthwith be landed and moved under the supervision of the Inspector, from the place of landing to the Foreign Animals Quarantine Station described in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (2) The animals shall be detained in the said Quarantine Station until the expiration of a period of twenty-eight days after their arrival therein.
- (3) Whilst detained in the said Quarantine Station the animals shall be under the control of a Veterinary Inspector appointed by the Ministry.
- (4) During such period of detention no other animals shall be moved into the said Quarantine Station, and the animals landed under this Order shall be kept separate from all other
- (5) During such period of detention the animals and the Foreign Animals Quarantine Station hereby defined shall be subject to such rules as may be prescribed by the Ministry for the purpose of preventing the spread of disease.
- (6) In the event of foot-and-mouth disease, sheep-pox, or cattle plague being found to exist during the prescribed period of detention in any animal referred to in this Order, the Ministry shall cause to be slaughtered all the animals in

the consignment, and in the event of any such disease being suspected to exist in any such animal, the Ministry may cause the slaughter of such of the animals as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of diagnosis. No compensation shall be payable by the Ministry in respect of any animal slaughtered under this Order.

Disinfection of Vessel, etc.

4. The vessel from which the animals are landed, and the fittings, dung, fodder, litter, and other things used for or about the animals, shall be disinfected or disposed of in accordance with such rules as may be prescribed by the Ministry.
