MERCHANT SHIPPING ACTS,
1894 to 1906.

RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

Notice is hereby given, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that after the expiration of forty days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council the draft of an Order in Council under section 80 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, to provide for the registration as British Ships of vessels (not being Ships of War forming part of the Royal Navy) belonging to the Government of the Colony of the Falkland Islands.

And notice is hereby further given, that copies of the draft Order in Council can be obtained by any public body within forty days of the date of this notice at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's

Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 1st May, 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £30,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 4th May, 1925, to Saturday, the 9th May, 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000. and must specify the date

on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 31st March, 1925, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 4th May, 1925, to Saturday, the 9th May, 1925, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th October, 1925, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

MERCHANT SHIPPING.

WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY.

THE MERCHANT SHIPPING (WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY) RULES AMENDMENT RULES, 1925, DATED 21ST APRIL, 1925, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE MERCHANT SHIPPING (WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY) ACT, 1919 (9 & 10 GEO. 5, c. 38).

The Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by sub-section (2) of Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping (Wireless Telegraphy) Act, 1919, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf after consultation with the Postmaster-General hereby make the following rules:—

1. These rules may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Wireless Telegraphy) Rules Amendment Rules, 1925, and shall come into force on the first day of July, 1925.

2. In paragraphs (ii) and (iii) of Article 10 (2) of the Merchant Shipping (Wireless Telegraphy) Statutory Rules dated the 10th July, 1920 (S.R. & O. 1920, No. 976) the words "six months' experience" shall be substituted for the words "one year's experience."

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Facilities to be given to Inspectors.

1.—(1) The occupier of any premises, or in his absence any person in charge of the premises, to which imported animals have under a licence been brought for the purposes of detention shall, on demand by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority, provide all reasonable assistance and facilities to enable the Inspector to examine the animals on such premises or such of them as the Inspector may desire to examine, in order that he may ascertain whether the animals are marked in accordance with the Importation of Animals Act, 1922 (Session 2), or any Order of the Minister made thereunder, and the numbers of the tags on such animals as are tagged, and generally to satisfy himself that the provisions of the said Act or any Order made thereunder are being complied with.

(2) Any person who fails to comply with the provisions of this Order shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the IMPORTED ANIMALS ORDER OF 1925.

4. The animals on being landed shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and

shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

(b) The wages payable for employment in agriculture of male workers of 21 years of age and over employed wholly or mainly as Stockmen or Shepherds and not being householders and not receiving board and lodging provided by the employer shall be not less than 37s. 10½d. per week, for hours customarily spent in attention to stock.

(c) The wages payable for employment in agriculture of male workers of 21 years of age and over employed wholly or mainly as Stockmen or Shepherds and receiving board and lodging provided by the employer shall be not less than 36s. (which sum shall include the value of such board and lodging as defined by the Committee) per week, for hours customarily spent in attention to stock.

3. *Other Male Workers of 21 years of age and over.*

The wages payable for employment in agriculture for all other male workers of 21 years of age and over shall be not less than 32s. per week of 50 hours (excluding Sundays).

1. This Order may be cited as the Walsall Registration of Births, &c. (Alteration of Sub-districts) Order, 1925, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of May, 1925.

2. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The Birchills Ward of Walsall County Borough shall cease to form part of the Walsall Sub-district of Walsall Registration District and shall be transferred to and form part of the Bloxwich Sub-district of the same Registration District.

4. The Hatherton Ward of Walsall County Borough shall cease to form part of the Aldridge Sub-district of Walsall Registration District and shall be transferred to and form part of the Bloxwich Sub-district.

5. The Civil Parish of Pelsall shall cease to form part of the Bloxwich Sub-district and shall be transferred to and form part of the Aldridge Sub-district.

6. The Registrar of the existing Aldridge Sub-district shall be the Registrar of the Walsall Sub-district as altered by this Order.

7. The Registrar of the existing Bloxwich Sub-district shall be the Registrar of that Sub-district as altered by this Order.

BOLLINGTON GAS

(Application for Special Order under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act 1920).

NOTICE is hereby given that the Urban District Council of Bollington whose address is at the Council Offices, Bollington, in the County of Chester (hereinafter called " the Council ") have applied to the Board of Trade for a Special Order under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act 1920 for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

To extend the limits within which the Council are authorised to supply gas by the addition thereto of the following area (hereinafter referred to as " the added area ") namely the Parishes of Pott Shrigley and Adlington in the rural district of Macclesfield and so much of the parish of Rainow in the said rural dis-

trict as lies to the north and west of an imaginary line drawn from the extreme south-western boundary of the Inclosure numbered 243 on the ¹/₂₅₀₀ Ordnance Map Cheshire Sheet XXIX 13 (Edition of 1909) in a north-easterly direction along the southern boundary of the said Inclosure and of the Inclosures numbered 242 and 240 to and along the western boundary of 247 to a point immediately opposite the weir of the Clough Pool thence across the said Inclosure numbered 247 and along the said weir and the south-western and southern boundary of 238 and the southern and eastern boundary of 235a the eastern boundary of 235 the northern boundary of 205, 204 and 203 to the eastern side of the road leading from Rainow past High Cliff to Pott Shrigley thence following the eastern boundary of the road to and along the southern boundary of 176 the eastern boundary of 168, 169 and 171a across the road known as Blaze Hill to and along the southern and western boundaries of 149 the western and north-western boundaries of 150 across the road known as Hedge Row to and along the north-eastern boundary of 122 and the eastern boundary of 118 and 120 to Harrop Brook (The numbers in the above description refer to the numbers in the Inclosures on the said Ordnance Map).

To authorise the Council to exercise within the added area all and the like rights, privileges and authorities for and in relation to the supply of gas as they now have and may exercise within their existing limits of supply, and to authorise the Council to continue, maintain and use any mains pipes and other works belonging to them at the date of the Order within the added area as if the same had been laid down or constructed under the powers of the Order, and to amend Section 6 of the Macclesfield Corporation Act 1882 so as to exclude the portion of the Parish of Rainow described in the preceding paragraph of this notice from the limits of gas supply of the Macclesfield Corporation.

To enable the Council to purchase additional lands by agreement and to make provision in regard to the retention and disposal of the lands and as to the proceeds of sale of surplus lands.

To enable the Council to lay pipes in streets not dedicated to public use, and to lay down pipes for ancillary purposes, and to provide dwelling houses for their employees and offices, show rooms and other buildings for the purposes of their gas undertaking.

To provide for (a) the repeal of any enactments or other provisions requiring the Council to supply gas of any particular illuminating or calorific power and the substitution thereof of power to charge for thermal units supplied in the form of gas; (b) the modification of the statutory or other provisions affecting the charges which may be made by the Council by substituting for the maximum price per 1,000 cubic feet now authorised with an addition to meet increases in the cost and charges of and incidental to the production and supply of gas as by the Council since 30th June 1914 a maximum price per therm (i.e. 100,000 British Thermal Units) and (c) the charging of a differential price in the added area before and after the introduction of the proposed thermal basis of charge.

The maximum price now authorised in respect of the supply of gas by the Council is 6s. per 1,000 cubic feet and the maximum price which the Council propose should be prescribed in respect of the supply of gas by the Council is fourteen decimal four pence per therm within the existing limits of supply and fifteen decimal six pence per therm within the added area, subject to the provision that the price for the supply of gas within the added area shall not exceed by more than one decimal two pence per therm the price for the time being charged by the Council for gas supplied within the existing limits of supply.

To provide that gas fittings let on hire shall not be subject to distress or liable to be taken in execution in bankruptcy and shall remain the property of the Council.

To enable the Council to make regulations in regard to the construction and placing of pipes &c. between mains and meters; to empower the Council to refuse to supply gas to persons in debt for other premises; and to make further provision in regard to the cutting off and re-connecting of supplies and expenses thereof, and in regard to the supply of gas where the consumer has a separate supply; to relieve the Council from the obligation to supply gas in certain cases; for the removal of fittings where gas supply discontinued; to require gas consumers to give notice to the Council before removing, and to make provision in regard to notices of discontinuance of supply of gas; to provide for period of error in defective meters; to require anti-fluctuators to be used with gas engines, and to make provision of valve where high pressure air is used.

To enable the Council to enter into contracts with local authorities, companies or persons for the supply by the Council to them or for the supply to the Council by them of gas in bulk and to take out licences for the use of patents.

To enable the Council to borrow moneys for the costs of the Order and, with the sanction of the Ministry of Health, for the purposes of their gas undertaking, including working capital, and to make provision in regard to the borrowing and re-borrowing and the repayment of the moneys so borrowed and to enable the Council to use the Sinking Fund instead of borrowing, and to make other financial provisions.

To make provision in regard to the authentication and service of notices by the Council and for the recovery of demands and penalties.

To vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would interfere with the objects of the intended Order and to confer other rights and privileges.

To incorporate and apply, with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871, the Public Health Act, 1875, and any Acts amending the same, and the Local Loans Act, 1875, and to repeal, alter, amend or re-enact all or any of the provisions of the Bollington Improvement and Lighting Act, 1862, and the Bollington Order, 1910, confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders (No. 14) Act, 1910, and any other Act or Order relating to the gas undertaking of the Council.
