A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.I.

**W**HEREAS by a Proclamation made by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria on the 12th day of August, 1876, it was amongst other things ordained that such silver, copper or bronze tokens as might from time to time be specified by the Governor of Our Colony of Mauritius by Proclamation acting under the authority of the Secretary of State should be a legal tender within Our said Colony and its dependencies for such sum as might be named in the said Proclamation, provided always that such sum should not in any case exceed five rupees:

And whereas by Our Proclamation dated the 17th day of May, 1920, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, did declare and ordain that the said Proclamation of Her late Majesty should have effect as if nickel tokens were therein mentioned in addition to silver, copper and bronze tokens:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision with respect to the calling in of tokens which by virtue of a Proclamation made by the Governor of Our said Colony are a legal tender within Our said Colony and its dependencies:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby declare and ordain that the Governor of Our said Colony may at any time by Proclamation made with the approval of the Secretary of State, and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed by the Proclamation, call in any such tokens as aforesaid.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this second day of *May*, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, and in the fifteenth year of Our Reign.
