England, the Court of Session in Scotland, and the High Court in Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, shall extend to the parts of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:—

The Northern Territory of Australia.

The Territory of Norfolk Island.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect the registration or enforcement in the Irish Free State of any judgment in pursuance of Part II of the said Act.

And the Right Honourable Leopold Charles Stennett Amery, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislature of the territory hereinafter mentioned in respect of which a mandate is being exercised by the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia has made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within that territory of judgments obtained in the High Court in England, the Court of Session in Scotland, and the High Court in Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, shall extend to the territory hereunder mentioned in respect of which a mandate is being exercised by the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia:—

The Territory of New Guinea.

(2) Nothing in this Order shall affect the registration or enforcement in the Irish Free State of any judgment in pursuance of Part II of the said Act.

**WHEREAS** by Section 84, Sub-Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that wherever it appears to His Majesty in Council that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by

any foreign country and are in force there, His Majesty in Council may order that the ships of that country shall, without being remeasured in His Majesty's Dominions, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by the Government of Iceland, and are in force in that country:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Icelandic Tonnage Order, 1925.

2. The merchant ships of Iceland shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry or other national papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 19th day of March, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of three neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Cheselbourne, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Hilton and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Melcombe Horsey, otherwise Melcombe Bingham (hereinafter referred to as the Benefice of Melcombe Horsey) all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Dorset and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said three Benefices of Cheselbourne, Hilton and Melcombe Horsey, duly made their report to the said Bishop of Salisbury and therein recommended the union of the said three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Salisbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said three Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas all of the said three Benefices are now full, the Reverend Frederick Sherriff Beale being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Cheselbourne, the Reverend Harry Alexander Caryl being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hilton and the Reverend William Fenn being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Melcombe Horsey:

" And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Cheselbourne and Melcombe Horsey now belongs to one and the same Patron:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Cheselbourne, the said Benefice of Hilton and the said Benefice of Melcombe Horsey shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Hilton with Cheselbourne and Melcombe Horsey' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Archdeaconry of Dorset and the Rural Deanery of Milton but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That with the consent of the said Harry Alexander Caryl and of the said William Fenn (testified by their signing this Scheme), if the said Benefice of Cheselbourne shall be the first of the said three Benefices to be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme then the union of the said three Benefices shall take effect on the next avoidance either of the said Benefice of Hilton or of the said Benefice of Melcombe Horsey following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Cheselbourne, but if either the said Benefice of Hilton or the said Benefice of Melcombe Horsey shall be the first of the said three Benefices to be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme then the union of the said three Benefices shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Cheselbourne following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Hilton or of the said Benefice of Melcombe Horsey as the case may be, and in the meantime (A) if the said Benefice of Cheselbourne is the first of the said three Benefices to be avoided as aforesaid: (a) the said Benefice of Cheselbourne and the said Benefice of Melcombe Horsey shall thereupon and until the union of all the said three Benefices takes effect be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Cheselbourne with Melcombe Horsey' but the Parishes of the said Benefice shall continue distinct in all respects: (b) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Cheselbourne and

Melcombe Horsey taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Melcombe Horsey shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Cheselbourne with Melcombe Horsey and the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Cheselbourne and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the fund established under the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and (B) if either the said Benefice of Hilton or the said Benefice of Melcombe Horsey is the first of the said three Benefices to be avoided as aforesaid: (a) the said Benefice of Hilton and the said Benefice of Melcombe Horsey shall thereupon and until the union of all the said three Benefices takes effect be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Hilton with Melcombe Horsey' and such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Archdeaconry of Dorset and the Rural Deanery of Milton, but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects: (b) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Hilton and Melcombe Horsey taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hilton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Hilton with Melcombe Horsey: (c) after the union of the said two Benefices of Hilton and Melcombe Horsey has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Hilton with Melcombe Horsey if it shall fall vacant before the union of all the said three Benefices takes effect shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation or nomination shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices of Hilton and Melcombe Horsey alternately, and the first turn shall belong to the Patron of that one of the said two Benefices the Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Hilton with Melcombe Horsey under the provisions of this Scheme.

" 3. That upon the union of all the said three Benefices taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hilton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Cheselbourne and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith, if not previously sold under the provisions of Clause 2 (A) (b) of this Scheme, shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the fund established under the 32nd section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 4. That a Curate be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the

United Benefice of Hilton with Cheselbourne and Melcombe Horsey at a stipend of £250 per annum, and that a part of the endowment of the United Benefice, namely the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge and other endowments derived from the Benefice of Melcombe Horsey be appropriated as a fund for securing the provision of such stipend as aforesaid for a Curate so to assist the Incumbent of the United Benefice as aforesaid and the income arising from the said fund shall be received by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice as part of the income thereof subject to and charged with the payment of such stipend as aforesaid.

" 5. That after the union of all the said three Benefices has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice the Patron of the said Benefice of Hilton shall have one turn and the Patron of the said Benefices of Cheselbourne and Melcombe Horsey shall have two turns, and if an Incumbent presented or nominated by the Patron of the said Benefice of Hilton to the said Benefice of Hilton, or to the said United Benefice of Hilton with Melcombe Horsey as the case may be, becomes under the provisions of this Scheme the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Hilton with Cheselbourne and Melcombe Horsey, the first and third turns in every such series of three turns shall belong to the Patron of the said Benefices of Cheselbourne and Melcombe Horsey and the second turn to the Patron of the said Benefice of Hilton, but if an Incumbent presented or nominated by the Patron of the said Benefices of Cheselbourne and Melcombe Horsey to the said Benefice of Melcombe Horsey or to the said United Benefice of Cheselbourne and Melcombe Horsey or to the said United Benefice of Hilton with Melcombe Horsey, becomes under the provisions of this Scheme, the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Hilton with Cheselbourne and Melcombe Horsey, the first turn in every such series of three turns shall belong to the Patron of the said Benefice of Hilton and the second and third turns to the Patron of the said Benefices of Cheselbourne and Melcombe Horsey.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or Measures, or of any other Act of Parliament, or Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Eccle-

siastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Salisbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the three Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

**W**HEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Horwich, in the County of Lancaster, 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in the Civil Parish of Horwich, in the said County of Lancaster, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that Burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 6th February, 1925, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 19th March next, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new Burial Ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, and that burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz. :—

**HORWICH.**—Forthwith and entirely in (1) the Parish Church of Holy Trinity, Horwich, in the said Parish, and in the Churchyard attached thereto, with the exception of the area which was added in 1903, and consecrated in June, 1921. Provided that:—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said portion of the Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said portion of the Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said portion of the Churchyard in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for whom such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

And (2) the Lee Congregational Chapel, Horwich, in the said Parish and in the burial ground attached thereto. Provided that:—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said burial ground burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said burial ground the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said burial ground in grave spaces in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the bodies of John Berry, Peter Holmes, Sarah Ann Davis, William Polkinghorne, James Watts and William Evans, respectively at their decease, and of the body of any member of his or her family, subject, in each case, to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 15th May, 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £30,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £2,500,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

#### TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 18th May, 1925, to Saturday, the 23rd May, 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

#### 4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 31st March, 1925, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the

option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 18th May, 1925, to Saturday, the 23rd May, 1925, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th October, 1925, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

#### ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACTS, 1882 TO 1922.

For the purposes of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, and the Orders made and issued thereunder, and all Special Acts relating to the supply of electricity, the Electricity Commissioners approve of the system of supply described hereunder, subject to the Regulations made by the Electricity Commissioners for securing the safety of the public and for ensuring a proper and sufficient supply of energy.

#### *System of Supply.*

A three phase alternating current supply at an Extra High Pressure of 6,600 volts (or 11,000 volts, or 33,000 volts, or 49,500 volts, or 66,000 volts, as the case may be).

(1) The supply will be given—

(a) for general supply at high pressure to transformers, converters or motors on the consumers' premises, or at medium or low pressure;

(b) for traction purposes at medium pressure.

(2) The extra high pressure and high pressure supply will be given by alternating current, and the medium pressure and low pressure supply will be given by alternating current or by direct current.

(3) All alternating current will be at a frequency not varying from 50 complete cycles per second by more than 2½ per cent. plus or minus.

#### *Mains.*

(4) The mains will consist of insulated conductors laid together and enclosed in a lead sheath, and

either (a) braided, compounded and armoured, and laid direct in the ground, and covered with—

- (i) wooden planks 2 inches thick, and (except for making up pieces and at bends) 10 feet long, and treated with preservative compound to prevent decay; or
- (ii) reinforced concrete slabs, 3 feet long by 2 inches thick, and 6 inches wide, and suitably interlocked so as to prevent lateral displacement; or
- (iii) concrete, made in situ, 3 inches thick, of a minimum width of 9 inches, and overlapping the breadth of the mains by at least 2 inches on each side.

or (b) drawn into pipes or ducts of approved design;

or (c) laid in troughs filled in with composition and covered with hard burned tiles or other approved protection held in position through contact with the filling in composition.

Any joint electricity authority or authorised undertakers within the meaning of the above-mentioned Acts adopting an extra high pressure system of supply in pursuance of this General Approval must notify the Electricity Commissioners in order that the Regulations as to Extra High Pressure for securing the safety of the public and for ensuring a proper and sufficient supply of electrical energy may be prescribed on such authority or undertakers where necessary.

Any extra high pressure system of supply other than that described above will require special approval by the Electricity Commissioners.

2. For the purpose of the rates specified in Clause 1 (a) above the expression " week of customary hours " means a week of sixty-two hours (including any employment on Sundays).

Where a whole-time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are in the case of a male worker hired on Half-yearly or Yearly engagements less than 62 or in the case of other male workers less than 54 in Summer or 48 in Winter, as the case may be, the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to that worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been the full hours mentioned above in the case of that worker.
