The KING has been pleased to give and grant unto Harold Walmsley, Esq., District Engineer, Railways and Steamers, Sudan Government, His Majesty's Royal licence and authority to wear the Insignia of the Fourth Class of the Order of the Nile, which Decoration has been conferred upon him by His Majesty the King of Egypt, in recognition of valuable services rendered by him.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Joseph John D Santos, a Chargeman in the General Iron Foundry at the workshops of the East Indian Railway at Jamalpur, in the following circumstances:—

On the 23rd September, 1924, while a cupola for melting pig iron was being charged at the workshops of the East Indian Railway at Jamalpur a labourer named Tofi overbalanced and fell head foremost into the cupola, D'Santos, who was working near by, immediately seized a rope and jumped into the cupola in order to effect a rescue. He found Tofi unconscious and suffering from burns but succeeded in tying a rope round him and then attempted to climb back. D'Santos was him-

self affected by the carbon monoxide fumes but other workers coming on the scene succeeded in drawing him out. He displayed great presence of mind in retaining his hold of the rope and this allowed of Tofi being rescued. Both men were badly gassed and Tofi expired shortly after his removal to a hospital.

D'Santos showed great promptitude and his conduct was undoubtedly very courageous.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Albert Medal to Veladi Sammai, of Murvai Ferest Village, in recognition of his gellantry in saving life

nition of his gallentry in saving life.

On 9th November, 1624, Mr. H. S. George, Deputy Conservator of Forests of the South Chanda Division of the Central Provinces, had just completed his inspection of a piece of forest and was returning to camp along a jungle path accompanied by Veladi Sammai, a Gond villager of the district who was carrying Mr. George's gun and walked in front. Suddenly and without warning a man-eating tiger jumped upon Mr. George's back, seized him by the neck and proceeded to drag him into the jungle. Veladi Sammai behaved with extraordinary gallantry: he rushed at the

tiger, placed the muzzle of the gun against it and pulled the trigger but was unable to discharge the weapon owing to the safety catch with which he was not familiar. He then shouted and waved his arms thus driving the tiger off for a short distance. Mr. George was badly bitten in the neck and covered with blood but with the Gond's assistance he managed to stagger slowly along and reached his camp which was about two miles away. The tiger followed them for some distance but was kept off by the shouts and demonstrations of the Gond.

It was known that a man-eating tiger was in the neighbourhood and had killed several villagers but it had never attacked anyone on the path used by the forest officer; and neither Mr. George nor the Gond had any suspicion of the tiger's presence until the attack was made. Veladi Sammai's action was an extremely brave one and he gravely imperilled his own life. He certainly saved Mr. George's as only his prompt and gallant action prevented the tiger dragging the forest officer into the jungle and eating him.

Whereas by the Extradition Acts, 1870(a) to 1906,(b) it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's Dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

AND WHEREAS a Treaty was concluded on the 30th day of May, 1924, between His Majesty and the President of the Republic of Finland for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

His Majesty the King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the President of the Republic of Finland, having determined, by common consent, to conclude a treaty for the extradition of criminals, have accordingly named as their plenipotentiaries:

#### ARTICLE 1.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under certain circumstances and conditions stated in the present treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article 2, committed within the jurisdiction of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party.

#### 1 ARTIKLA.

# ARTIKEL 1.

#### ARTICLE 2.

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Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or offences:

- 1. Murder (including assessination, parricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt to murder.
  - 2. Manslaughter.

#### 2 ARTIKLA.

- 6. Kidnapping and false imprisonment.
- 7. Child stealing, including abandoning, exposing or unlawfully detaining.
  - 8. Abduction.
  - 9. Procuration.
  - 10. Bigamy.
- 11. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grievous bodily harm.
- 12. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm.
- 13. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.
- 14. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
  - 15. Arson.
- 16. Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny or embezzlement.
- 17. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any company, or fraudulent conversion, if such crimes or offences, according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are extradition crimes or offences.

- 18. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences, receiving any money, valuable security, or other property, knowing the same to have been stolen or feloniously obtained, if such crimes or offences, according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are extradition crimes or offences.
- 19. Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.
- 20. Forgery, or uttering what is forged.
- 21. Crimes against bankruptcy law, which, according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are extradition crimes.
- 22. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any persons travelling or being upon a railway.
- 23. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.
- 24. Piracy and other crimes or offences committed at sea against persons or things which, according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are extradition crimes or offences.
- 25. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute a crime or offence against the laws of both States.

The extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes or

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the State applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the laws of both the Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant can be made.

#### ARTICLE 3.

In no case nor on any whatever consideration shall the High Contracting Parties be bound to surrender their own sub- . maan omia kansalaisiaan, jects, whether by birth or naturalisation.

# ARTICLE 4.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the State applied to, for the crime or offence for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed should be under examination or under punishment in the State applied to for any other crime or offence, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial and the full execution of any punishment awarded to him.

Myöskin voidaan luovutus myöntää sen valtion harkinnan mukaan, jolta sitä pyydetään, mistä muusta rikoksesta tahansa, josta luovutus molempain sopimuspuolten silloin voimassa olevien lakien mukaan voi tapahtua.

#### 3 ARTIKLA.

Korkeat sopimus puolet eivät missään tapauksessa eivätkä millään ehdoilla ole velvollisia luovuttaolivatpa he syntyperäisiä tahi kansalaistutettuja.

#### 4 ARTIKLA.

Luovutusta ei tapahdu, jos luovutettavaksi pyydetty henkilö on siinä valtiossa, jolta luovuttamista pyydetään, jo ollut syytettynä ja vapautettu tai rangaistu tahi jos syyte siitä rikoksesta, jonka nojalla hänen luovuttamistaan pyydetään, vielä on vireillä.

Jos luovutettavaksi pyydetty henkilö on siinä valtiossa, jolle luovutuspyyntö on esitetty, tutkittavana tahi kärsimässä rangaistusta jostakin muusta rikoksesta on luovuttamisensa hänen lykättävä siksi, kunnes oikeudenkäynti on päättynyt ja, jos hän on rangaistuksen tuomittu, tämän täydelleen kär-. sinyt.

Enligt prövning av den stat, av vilken utlämning begäres, må utlämning även äga rum för varje annat brott, som enligt de båda fördragsslutande parternas för tiden gällande lagar kan föranleda utlämning,

#### ARTIKEL 3.

De höga fördragsslutande parterna skola i intet fall och under inga omständigheter vara förpliktade att utlämna sina egna undersåtar, varken infödda eller naturaliserade.

#### ARTIKEL 4.

Utlämning äger icke rum, därest den återfordrade personen redan blivit i den stat, av vilken utlämning begäres, efter anställt åtal frikänd eller fälld till straff eller fortfarande står under tilltal för det brott, för vilket hans utlämnande begärts.

Därest den återfordrade personen är i den stat, av vilken hans utlämning begäres, föremål för rannsakning eller avtjänar straff för något annat brott, skall utlämningen uppskjutas tills rättegången avslutate och, ifall straff ådömts, detta till fullo verkställts.

#### ARTICLE 5.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime or offence or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applying or applied to.

#### ARTICLE 6.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the crime or offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political character, or if he proves that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for a crime or offence of a political character.

# ARTICLE 7.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in custody or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made for any other crime or offence, or on account of any other matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored, or has had an opportunity of returning, to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes or offences committed after the extradition.

#### 5 ARTIKLA.

# 7 ARTIKLA.

#### ARTIKEL 5.

Förrymd brottsling skall icke utlämnas, om brottet, för vilket hans utlämning begäres, är av politisk natur eller om han ådagalägger att begäran om hans utlämning i själva verket gjorts i avsikt att åtala eller straffa honom för brott av politisk natur.

# ARTIKEL 7.

Utlämnad person kan i ingen händelse i den stat, till vilken utlämning skett, hållas häktad eller åtalas för något annat brott, eller av andra orsaker än de, vilka föranlett utlämningen, intill dess han blivit återlämnad eller försatt i tillfälle att återvända till den stat, som utlämnat honom.

Denna bestämmelse är icke tillämplig å brottbegångna efter utlämnandet.

#### ARTICLE 8.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the diplomatic agents of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime or offence had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent court of the State that makes the requisition for extradition, provided that a sentence passed in contumaciam is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

#### ARTICLE 9.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

#### 8 ARTIKLA.

Luovutuspyyntö on tehtävä korkeiden sopimuspuolten diplomaattisten asiamiesten välityksellä.

# 9 ARTIKLA.

#### ARTIKEL 8.

#### . ARTIKEL 9.

#### ARTICLE 10.

criminal fugitive be apprehended under a warrant issued by any police magistrate, justice of the peace, or other competent authority in either State, on such information or complaint and such evidence, or after such proceedings, as would, in the opinion of the authority issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime or offence had been committed or the person convicted in that part of the dominions of the two Contracting Parties in which the magistrate, justice of the peace, or other competent authority, exercises jurisdic-He shall, in accordance with this article, be discharged, if within the term of thirty days a requisition for extradition shall not have been made by the diplomatic agent of the State claiming his extradition in accordance with the stipulations of this treaty. The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences specified in this treaty, and committed on the high seas on board any vessel of either State which may come into a port of the other.

# ARTICLE 11.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied

#### 10 ARTIKLA.

#### ARTIKEL 10.

#### ARTIKEL 11.

Utlämning äger rum endast om bevismaterialet enligt lagarna i den stat, till vilken framställningen riktats, be-

to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime or offence had been committed in the territory of the same State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime or offence of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to; and no criminal shall be surrendered until after the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his committal to prison to await the warrant for his surrender.

# ARTICLE 12.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the State applied to shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or the affirmations of witnesses taken in the other State, or copies thereof, and likewise the warrants sentences issued therein, or copies thereof, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating the fact of a conviction,. provided the same are authenticated as follows:-

1. A warrant, or copy thereof, must purport to

- 3. A certificate of, or judicial document stating the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a judge, magistrate, or officer of the other State.

In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated, either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice, or some other Minister of the other State, or by any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law of the State to which the application for extradition is made.

# ARTICLE 13.

If the individual claimed by one of the High Contracting Parties

# ARTIKEL 13.

Har beträffande en person, om vars utlämnande någondera av de in pursuance' of the present treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed within their respective jurisdictions, his extradition shall be granted to the State whose claim is earliest in date, unless such claim is waived.

# ARTICLE 14.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not within two produced months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper tribunal thereof, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

#### ARTICLE 15.

seized All articles which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension, and any articles that may serve as a proof of the crime or offence shall be given up when the extradition takes place, in so far as this may be permitted by the law of the State granting the extradition.

#### ARTICLE 16.

#### 17 ARTIKLA.

#### ARTICLE 18.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal, who has taken refuge in any of His Britannic Majesty's self-Dominions. governing Colonies, or Possessions which this treaty applies shall be made to the Governor-General, Governor, or chief authority, of such selfgoverning Dominion, Colony, or Possession by the chief consular officer of Finland in such selfgoverning Dominion. Colony, or Possession.

Such requisition may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such self-governing Dominion, Colony, or Possession will allow, to the provisions of this treaty, by the said Governor-General, Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to His Britannic Majesty's Government.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any self - governing Dominion, Colony, or Possession of His Britannic Majesty shall be governed, as far as possible, by the rules laid down in the preceding articles of the present treaty.

#### ARTICLE 19.

It is understood that the stipulations of the

#### ARTIKEL 18.

It is also understood that if, after the signature of the present treaty, it is considered advisable to extend its provisions to any British protectorates other than those mentioned above, or to any British-protected State, or to any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Britannic Majesty the stipulations of the two preceding articles shall be deemed to apply to protectorates or such States or mandated terrifrom the date prescribed in the notes to be exchanged for the purpose of effecting such extension.

It is further under stood that the provisions of the present treaty which apply to British subjects shall be deemed also to apply to natives of any British protector-

It shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective plenipotentiaries have signed the treaty and have affixed thereto their respective seals.

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 23rd day of May, 1925, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Finland under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 30th May, 1924.

Provided always that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada, being Part I of Chapter 155 of the revised Statutes of Canada, 1906, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

Provided further that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the self-governing Dominions hereinafter named, that is to say, the Commonwealth of Australia (including for this purpose Papua and Norfolk Island), the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, the Irish Free State and Newfoundland, and India, until notification shall have been made in the London Gazette that the Treaty has been made applicable thereto, and that on such notification being made in respect of any such Dominion or India the said Acts shall apply in such Dominion or India in the case of Finland under and in accordance with the said Treaty as from the date of the said notification.

This Order may be cited as the "Finland (Extradition) Order in Council, 1925."

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANTS IN THE ROYAL SCOTTISH MUSEUM. (UNDER THE SCOTTISH EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.)

- N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions under these Regulations do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held from time to time on the occurrence of vacancies.
- 1. Candidates must have attained the age of twenty-six and shall as a rule not exceed the age of thirty on the 1st January in the year in

which the competition is held, but in special circumstances candidates above thirty or below twenty-six may be admitted with the approval of the Treasury and the Civil Service Commissioners.

- 2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and born of a father also a natural-born British subject, provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.
- November, 1918.
  3. Until further order preference will be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces in the War.

No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

- 4. The Scottish Education Department will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.
- 5. Application shall be made in the first instance to the Director of the Royal Scottish Museum, who, after examining the candidates' credentials and interviewing personally any or all of the candidates, will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications for the posts in question to the Vice-President of the Scottish Education Department for nomination. Candidates thus nominated shall be submitted to the Civil Service Commissioners who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.
- 6. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education, general or technical, or general and technical together, as in the Commissioners' opinion fits them for the post. Candidates thus nominated, unless they have passed an examination qualifying for a University Degree, shall be submitted to a qualifying examination in English (including Essay and Precis Writing) and Translation from two of the following languages—Latin, Greek, French, German, Italian. The Commissioners may, if in doubt, submit any or all of the candidates to examination in other subjects to test technical education.
- 7. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

Until further order, and other things being equal, preference will be given by the Selection Board to candidates who are debarred from active employment by a physical impairment due to the War and not of a nature to interfere with the discharge of ordinary administrative duties.

- 8. Candidates who have been admitted to and have passed the Qualifying Examination or have been exempted from that examination will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Department who shall be represented on the Selection Board. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by any candidate as having direct knowledge of his or her work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.
- 9. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces, or otherwise.

10. Every Candidate before entry to the Qualifying Examination shall pay the regulation fee of £6; candidates exempted from the Qualifying Examination, if selected for appointment, shall pay the fee before the issue of certificates of qualification in their favour.
