## NAVAL DISCIPLINE ACT, 1866.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 22nd May, 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loans Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as their Lordships may determine.

#### TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 25th May, 1925, to Saturday, the 30th May, 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

#### 4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 31st March, 1925, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 25th May, 1925, to Saturday, the 30th May, 1925, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th October, 1925, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

#### TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

#### FLAX AND HEMP TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

#### PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE SPINNERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for the Flax and Hemp Trade in Great Britain as specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, HEREBY

GIVE NOTICE as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in their Notice F.H. (15) dated 25th July, 1922, in their application to certain classes of Female Spinners, the proposed variations being as shown in the Schedule below.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### PART I.

#### PROPOSED VARIATION OF GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE SPINNERS.

The Trade Board PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Workers set out in Section III of Part I of the Schedule to their Notice F.H. (15) dated 25th July, 1922, in their application to certain classes of Female Spinners by providing that the General Minimum Time-Rate of 29s. per week at present applicable to Female Spinners of 18 years of age and over (other than learners) and set out in Section I of Part I of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice F.H. (15) shall apply to

(a) Female Spinners of 18 years of age and over (other than learners); and

(b) *Female Spinners under 18 years of age who have completed two years' employment (including any period of learnership) in some or all of the following processes, viz.: bobbin carrying, doffing, piecing, or assisting at spinning frame, and who are in charge of a frame.*

##### PART II.

#### PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES.

Overtime Rates calculated on the General Minimum Time-Rate proposed in Part I of this Schedule in the manner specified in Part VII of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (15) dated 25th July, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the above proposed Minimum Rate of Wages in respect of all time worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the before-mentioned Notice F.H. (15) to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

NOTE.—The Proposals contained in this Notice are in substitution for the Proposals contained in Part I of the Schedule to the Notice F.H. (21 A) dated 30th March, 1925, which are withdrawn.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above PROPOSAL TO VARY which may be lodged with them within two months from the 15th day of May, 1925. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Flax and Hemp Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

## BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Great Britain) issued, on 9th May, 1925, a Notice D. (29) setting out Minimum Rates of Wages for Male Indentured Apprentices, which are effective under an Order of the Minister of Labour as from 11th May, 1925. Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding 7 days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 17th May, 1925.

The Notice D. (29) supersedes the Notice D (25) previously issued by the Trade Board.
