NAVAL DISCIPLINE ACT, 1866.

Notice is hereby given that, after the expiration of 40 days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council, in pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, the Draft of an Order in Council approving Revised General Orders framed by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty for regulating the procedure and practice of Naval Courts-Martial.

And Notice is hereby further given that, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, copies of the proposed Draft Order in Council can be obtained by any Public Body, within 40 days of the date of this Notice, at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.

#### Westminster, 13th May, 1925.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that The Lords, authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to the Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canter-

bury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to:—

Gold Standard Act, 1925. Advocates Widows' Fund (Widowers' Provisions) Order Confirmation Act, 1925.
