The following Address was presented to the KING on Saturday, the 9th instant, on the occasion of the reopening by His Majesty of the British Empire Exhibition, Wembley:—

## BRITISH EMPIRE EXHIBITION.

YOUR MAJESTY:

As President I ask you graciously to declare open again to-day the British Empire Exhibition. This date was chosen as being the fifteenth anniversary of the date of Your proclamation as King-Emperor; and the representatives of the territories of Your Empire who are associated together in this great enterprise take this occasion to offer to you their humble duty and to express the hope that Providence will permit long continuance of a reign which has been so auspicious to your peoples.

The benefits which flowed to the Empire from the holding of this Exhibition in 1924 were so marked that it was decided, after mature consideration, to continue it for a second year. We felt that the work of education which the Exhibition represented could usefully be continued during a second season: and with your sanction and that of the majority of the Governments of the Empire, and with the generous aid of the guarantors who renewed the credits they had provided for the 1924 season, it was decided to continue that work in 1925.

The Exhibition which you see set out before you to-day, Sir, has integrally the same purpose as in 1924: to show how great are the

resources available within the Empire. But whilst the Exhibition thus maintains the same character, it will present its lessons of Empire in a new manner. Careful thought and untiring energy have been devoted to the problem of fashioning our display so that it will impress not only the fresh observer but those who were familiar with the Exhibition of 1924 as being full of novel interest. The aim has been to provide not only a complete University of Empire but a great pleasure and recreation ground.

As in 1924, the Fellowship of the British Empire Exhibition and the Women's Section will co-operate with the main organisation of the Exhibition so that the best use may be made of the lessons that it offers.

I hope, Sir, that this 1925 season of the Exhibition will complete the work so well begun in 1924, and that when we close our gates in November it will be with the confidence that Your peoples have benefitted greatly not only in regard to trade and production but also by the growth of an instructed pride in the Empire's achievements in the past and its aims for the future.

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*To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—*

It gives me great pleasure to come here with the Queen to-day to re-open the British Empire Exhibition for the season of 1925.

The task undertaken by the Exhibition was too important to leave uncompleted. When at the close of the 1924 season it became

apparent that much useful work yet remained to be done, the Council of the Exhibition took a wise and patriotic step in deciding to keep in being for another year what you have rightly described as a University of Empire.

The British Empire depends for its security and prosperity on goodwill between its constituent peoples: and the one sure foundation for that goodwill is a full knowledge of our mutual aspirations, capacities and needs. To seek knowledge, more knowledge and again more knowledge of the great heritage which has been entrusted to us is the soundest Imperial policy. I recognise the British Empire Exhibition as a successful instrument of that policy, and I trust that its achievements in 1925 will equal, if they do not surpass, those of 1924.

I am happy to welcome the representatives, official and unofficial, of my territories beyond the seas, and to express my pleasure that they are taking part in to-day's ceremony.

Heartiest congratulations are due to the Board of Management, to the Executive Council and to all who have co-operated with them in the splendid work of which we now have evidence. To present the Empire in a new aspect, to give as complete and vivid a picture as before, and yet a fresh picture, was a task calling for infinite resource and energy.

I am glad to learn from your Address that the results of the Exhibition in 1924 were so favourable; and that in 1925 this great project is to continue its beneficent work of bringing together to their common advantage the peoples of many lands. To them this Exhibition will demonstrate how many of their wants can be supplied from some part of our Commonwealth of Nations, while we at home will see the numerous opportunities offered by great countries overseas to those who wish for a wider horizon and new fields of endeavour.

This year the Exhibition has wisely decided to present its lessons in a lighter and brighter form. All who come here must receive some prompting to serious thought on their duties and responsibilities: those who come to be entertained will remain to be educated and will return to be further educated. I note with special pleasure that one of the great Halls has been devoted to exhibits illustrating those problems of housing and transport which call so urgently for solution. It was a happy inspiration to make housing and housebuilding a central feature of the Exhibition. For the foundation of the Empire is in the home: it is there that its future citizens should receive the most vital part of their training: and the provision of houses in which a healthy home life is possible is a matter not only of domestic but of Imperial importance.

I trust that when in November this Exhibition closes, it will have completed the work so well begun in 1924, and will have shown to our peoples and to the world at large a picture of the British Empire, intent on aims of peaceful reconstruction and of careful development of its resources, earnestly seeking peace both at home and abroad.

I declare this British Empire Exhibition open: and I pray that by the Blessing of God it may serve to draw closer the bonds which unite all parts of the Empire: to further the growth of commerce both within and without the Empire: and to promote the general prosperity and happiness of the world.

## ROYAL COURTS OF JUSTICE.

## TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON MINT.

## VERDICT.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's silver coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, both days inclusive. We found that there were no gold coins in the said Pyx, and we ascertain that the number of coins of silver, in each packet produced to us, corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took Two coins from each of such packets of silver coins, making altogether Ninety-four half-crowns, Forty-four florins, Ninety-six shillings, One hundred and six sixpences, One fourpence, One threepence, One twopence, and One penny, and weighed each of the said silver coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the

said First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as so amended was plus twenty-eight thousandths of an ounce (·028 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said silver coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Trial Plate made of pure silver (as prescribed by the Coinage Act, 1920) produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Acts, 1891 and 1920, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as so amended was plus ninety-seven hundred-thousandths (or ·00097), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said silver coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue Two half-crowns, Two florins, Two shillings and Two sixpences, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such half-crowns weighed respectively—the first 219·070 grains, the second 217·984 grains: that such florins weighed respectively—the first 173·721 grains, the second 175·024 grains: that such shillings weighed respectively—the first 86·755 grains, the second 87·789 grains: that such sixpences weighed respectively—the first 43·608 grains, the second 43·519 grains. We then assayed the said Two half-crowns, the said Two florins, the said Two shillings and the said Two sixpences separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such half-crowns to be the first 497·95, the second 501·72: of such florins to be the first 498·95, the second 502·05: of such shillings to be the first 501·75, the second 499·25: of such sixpences to be the first 504·00, the second 501·87.

## TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE SYDNEY BRANCH MINT.

## VERDICT.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, before the King's Remembrancer, at Gold-

smiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Sydney, in the State of New South Wales, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took twenty coins from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to eighty sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act 1891 except in the case of one coin which weighed 123.489 grains and therefore exceeded the said remedy by fifteen thousandths of a grain. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus four thousandths of an ounce (+.004 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus four hundred thousandths (or +.00004), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue two sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 123.292 grains, the second 123.347 grains.

We then assayed the said two sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916.64, the second 916.69 respectively.

## TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE PRETORIA BRANCH MINT.

### VERDICT.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Pretoria, in the Union of South Africa, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the Branch Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in the only packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took all the coins from such packet of gold coins, amounting altogether to two sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard weight specified in the First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was minus eleven hundred thousandths of an ounce (−.00011 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We found that such sovereigns weighed respectively, the first 123.248 grains, the second 123.251 grains.

We then assayed the said two sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916.94, the second 916.95 respectively.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five,

before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmith's Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Perth in the State of Western Australia, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took three coins from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to seventy-eight sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus two thousandths of an ounce (·002 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus seven hundred thousandths (or ·00007), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue three sovereigns, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively—the first 123·323 grains, the second 123·261 grains, the third 123·261 grains. We then assayed the said three sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916·90, the second 916·83, the third 916·77 respectively.

We ascertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took twenty coins from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to eighty sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was Nil of an ounce on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said gold coin so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus twenty hundred thousandths (or +·00020), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue two sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively—the first 123·330 grains, the second 123·265 grains. We then assayed the said two sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916·83, the second 916·83 respectively.

#### FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1925 (No. 26).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

##### *Contraction of certain Infected Area.*

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1925 (No. 24) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order

##### *Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twentieth day of May, 1925.
