"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a

transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill, is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Thomas Olaf Willson, of The Old Mill, Kidlington, in the County of Oxford, Esquire:

"And whereas the said Thomas Olaf Willson is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Southwark for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, now Bishop of Southwark, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will render the same Benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control, and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provisions for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Thomas Olaf Willson (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Christ Church, Shooter's Hill, now vested in him the said Thomas Olaf Willson as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accord-

ance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Osbournby and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Scot Willoughby, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Osbournby and Scot Willoughby duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lincoln and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Lincoln signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Osbournby and Scot Willoughby are now full, the Reverend Alfred Bedson being the present Incumbent thereof:

"And whereas the said Alfred Bedson has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed

this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Osbournby and the said Benefice of Scot Willoughby shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'the United Benefice of Osbournby with Scot Willoughby' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Alfred Bedson if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Osbournby and Scot Willoughby shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Osbournby shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows; that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Osbournby having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Scot Willoughby having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Lincoln has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order

that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lincoln.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the new Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Catherine, Wigan, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint George, Wigan, both in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool:

" Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Catherine, Wigan, and the said New Parish of Saint George, Wigan, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint Catherine, Wigan, and of the said New Parish of Saint George, Wigan, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

" And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

" And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall

have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

" And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

" And whereas a piece of land situate within the said proposed separate District has been conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as the site for a permanent Church for such District, and there has been contributed and transferred into our name a sum of £2,000 Wigan Corporation Bonds towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church:

" And whereas the said sum of £2,000 Wigan Corporation Bonds has been contributed and transferred to us as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

" And whereas the contributors of the said sum of £2,000 Wigan Corporation Bonds towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Liverpool as the person to whom they desire the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, now Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Catherine, Wigan, and of the said New Parish of Saint George, Wigan, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Stephen, Wigan.'

" And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of the said Diocese of Liverpool, and his successors, for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The District of Saint Stephen, Wigan, comprising:—

" All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Catherine, Wigan, and of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint George, Wigan, both in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool, which, taken together, are bounded upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Wigan, upon the north, upon the north east and upon the east by the New Parish of Haigh and Aspull, upon the south east by the New Parish of Ince in Makerfield, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the south west by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Ince in Makerfield from the said New Parish of Saint Catherine, Wigan, crosses the middle of the Lancashire Union Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence north westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to a point near Round House Sidings in the middle of the bridge which carries such line of railway across the footpath leading from Wigan Road to Platt Lane, and extending thence first south westward and then westward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 22½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches Platt Lane, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Platt Lane for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of Essex Street, and extending thence north westward to and along the middle of Essex Street for a distance of 14½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Scholes upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Catherine, Wigan, from the said New Parish of Saint George, Wigan, and extending thence south westward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of the said road called Scholes) for a distance of 13 yards or thereabouts to the junction of such road with the road called Great Acre, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Great Acre for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its northern end, and extending thence south westward to and along the fence forming the northern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 22, Great Acre for a distance of 19 yards or thereabouts to its southern end, and extending thence first south westward to and then north westward along the middle of the footpath leading to Bottling Wood for a distance of 15½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading from Water Heyes to Bottling Wood, and extending thence in a straight line due west for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Douglas upon the boundary which

divides the said New Parish of Saint George, Wigan, from the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Wigan."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Liverpool.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill, and of the New Parish of Saint Stephen, Bexhill, both in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 27th day of August, 1857, and published in the London Gazette on the 8th day of the following month, part of the Parish of Bexhill, in the said County of Sussex and in the said Diocese of Chichester, was assigned as a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Mark, situate at Little Common, in the said Parish of Bexhill, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mark, Bexhill':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 7th day of August, 1900, and published in the London Gazette on the 10th day of the same month, part of the said Parish of Bexhill was assigned as a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Stephen, Bexhill, situate in the said Parish of Bexhill, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Stephen, Bexhill':

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of Saint Mark, Bexhill, and the said District Chapelry of Saint Stephen, Bexhill, have under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill, and the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Bexhill, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Winfrid Oldfield, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill, and the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Bexhill, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Bexhill.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the herein-before mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Stephen, Bexhill, in the same County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill, which is bounded upon the north and upon the east by the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Bexhill, upon part of the south by the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Bexhill, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say,

upon the remaining part of the south and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Bexhill, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill, at the junction of Collington Lane with Little Common Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Little Common Road for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence forming the western boundary of the houses and premises situate on the western side of Knebworth Road, and extending thence northward to and along the said fence for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to the point where such fence meets the southern side of Broad-oak Lane, and extending thence in a straight line due north for a distance of 7 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Broad-oak Lane upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Bexhill, from the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Bexhill."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

"Whereas the said Church of Saint John the Baptist was consecrated on the 18th day of March, 1863, and is a Chapel of Ease in the said Parish of East Ham:

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representa-

tion, bearing date the 30th day of April, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Philip, Eastbourne, situate within the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Eastbourne, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

“ Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Eastbourne, of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Michael and All Angels, Ocklynge, Eastbourne, and of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Anne, Upperton, Eastbourne, both in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parishes:

“ And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Eastbourne, of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Ocklynge, Eastbourne, and of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Upperton, Eastbourne, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Philip, Eastbourne, situate as aforesaid:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Winfrid Oldfield, Bishop of Chichester, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Upperton, Eastbourne, and with the consent of the Reverend William Champion Streatfeild, Clerk in Holy Orders, a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Chichester and the Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the Parish of Eastbourne, in the said County and Diocese, and, as such Vicar or Incumbent, the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Eastbourne, as well as of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Ocklynge, Eastbourne (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Eastbourne, of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Ocklynge, Eastbourne, and of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Upperton, Eastbourne, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed,

should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Philip, Eastbourne, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Philip, Eastbourne.’

“ We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Philip, Eastbourne, comprising:—

“ All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Eastbourne, of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Michael and All Angels, Ocklynge, Eastbourne, and of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Anne, Upperton, Eastbourne, all in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the centre of the bridge which carries the roadway connecting Bedford Well Road and Whitley Road across the Eastbourne Branch Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence first eastward and then north eastward along the middle of the said roadway and along the middle of Whitley Road (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the New Parish of All Souls, Eastbourne, in the said County and Diocese, from the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Upperton, Eastbourne) for a distance of $5\frac{1}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Souls, Eastbourne, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Eastbourne, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of $26\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the wall forming the western boundary of All Souls’ Schools, Bourne Street, meets the southern side of New Road, and extending thence first north eastward to and then first north westward and then northward along the middle of New Road for a distance in all of 8 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Belmore Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Belmore Road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Manifold Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Manifold Road for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Firle Road and Western Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Western Road for a distance of $5\frac{1}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Albion Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Albion Road for a distance of $1\frac{1}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Clarence Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Clarence Road for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Whitley Road, and extending thence northward and in a straight line for a distance of 8 yards or thereabouts to the point on the northern side

of Whitley Road at the southern end of the wall or fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises known as Numbers 40 and 42, Whitley Road, and extending thence northward along the said wall or fence for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises known as Numbers 53 and 55, Ringwood Road, and extending thence northward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the southern side of Ringwood Road, and extending thence northward and in a straight line across Ringwood Road for a distance of 14 yards or thereabouts to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises known as Numbers 56 and 58, Ringwood Road, and extending thence northward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the grounds of the Cavendish Bowling and Lawn Tennis Club, and extending thence northward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its northern end, and continuing thence northward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Woodgate Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Woodgate Road, for a distance of $5\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Southbourne Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Southbourne Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Eastbourne, in the said County and Diocese, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Eastbourne, and extending thence north westward along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of $17\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Eastbourne, from the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Ocklynge, Eastbourne, and extending thence first north westward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of $29\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of the said Eastbourne Branch Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Upperton, Eastbourne, from the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Ocklynge, Eastbourne), for a distance of 55 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the roadway connecting Bedford Well Road and Whitley Road, across such line of railway at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order

shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance or other lawful means His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the dominions of His Majesty the Sultan of Morocco and Fez:

And whereas by a Convention signed on behalf of His Majesty at Paris on the 18th day of December, 1923, provision was made for the abrogation of the capitulations in the region defined in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter described as the "Tangier Zone"), and for the establishment of an international jurisdiction to administer justice in the Tangier Zone to His Majesty's subjects and the nationals of other Powers:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 (53 & 54 Vict. c. 37) and 1913 (3 & 4 Geo. V., c. 16), or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. As from the commencement of this Order the operation of the Orders mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, and of any King's Regulations, Rules or other enactments made thereunder, shall, as regards all such matters and cases as come within the jurisdiction of the Mixed Court of Tangier established under the Convention signed at Paris on December 18th, 1923, be suspended in the Tangier Zone, except as regards any judicial matters pending in His Majesty's Consular Court at the date of the commencement of the Order; but such suspension shall not affect the past operation of those Orders or enactments, or any of them, or any right, title, obligation or liability accrued, or the validity of anything done or suffered thereunder, before the commencement of this Order, or take away or abridge any protection or benefit given or to be enjoyed in relation thereto.

2. As from the commencement of this Order, in the operation outside the Tangier Zone of the Orders in Council mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto and any King's Regulations, Rules or other enactments made thereunder—

(1) the powers and duties of His Majesty's Minister and of the Consul-General shall be transferred in and so far as concerns the French Zone of Morocco to His Majesty's Consul-General at Rabat, and in and so far as concerns the Spanish Zone of Morocco to His Majesty's Vice-Consul at Tetuan, and any act required or permitted to be done by, to or before His Majesty's Minister or the Consul-General shall be done by, to or before

His Majesty's Consul-General at Rabat, or before His Majesty's Vice-Consul at Tetuan, as the case may be, and the said Orders in Council, King's Regulations, Rules and enactments shall be read and construed as if the words "His Majesty's Consul-General at Rabat" or "His Majesty's Vice-Consul at Tetuan" were substituted for the words "His Majesty's Minister" or "the Consul-General," as the case may require;

(2) any act required or permitted to be done at the Consulate-General at Tangier shall be done at the Consulate-General at Rabat, or at the Vice-Consulate at Tetuan, as the case may be.

3. This Order may be cited as the "Morocco (Tangier Zone) Order in Council, 1924," and shall come into force on such date as the Secretary of State shall appoint by notice issued in the "London Gazette" and exhibited in the public Offices of the Consulate at Tangier.

And the Right Honourable Joseph Austen Chamberlain, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

THE COUNTY OF LONDON ELECTRIC SUPPLY COMPANY LIMITED.

To

THEIR MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTIES THE KING AND QUEEN.

May it please Your Majesties:—

We, the Chairman and Directors of the County of London Electric Supply Company, Limited, desire to express our most grateful thanks for the signal honour your Majesties have conferred upon the Company, and upon the Electricity Supply Industry in general, by graciously consenting to attend here to-day to open the Electric Power House erected by the Company at Creeksmouth, Barking.

The County of London Electric Supply Company was one of the pioneers of electric power supply in the Metropolis. It began operations on a comparatively small scale thirty-one years ago and it has grown to be one of the largest Undertakings of its kind in the Kingdom.

Under the general legislation governing electric supply, the association of such enterprises as the County of London Electric Supply Company with neighbouring Undertakings was prohibited. We are happy to record, however, that in the London Electricity (No. 1) Bill now being considered by Parliament, provision is made for the closest co-operation between the Company and the following Companies serving adjacent areas:—the City of London Electric Lighting Company, Limited, the South London Electric Supply Corporation, Limited, and the South Metropolitan Electric Light & Power Company, Limited.

This group of Companies serves a population of about 1,500,000 with an area of over two hundred and twenty square miles, comprising many important manufacturing districts, and extensive outer regions which require a cheap and abundant supply of electricity for their full industrial development.

In order that this essential service might be rendered to the Public, the erection of a Power House at Barking was decided upon by the County of London Electric Supply Company many years ago, and it is the first Super-Power House constructed for supply to London. Ultimately, this Power House will comprise three sections, each of over one quarter of a million Horse Power, totalling three quarters of a million Horse Power, constructed at a total estimated cost of between eight and nine million pounds. The portion already erected forms half of the first section, and has, together with the main transmission system, involved an expenditure of approximately £2,500,000.

In general design and in every detail of its equipment the Barking Power House represents the most advanced methods for the cheap production of electricity on a large scale. The construction of the Power House

has already afforded employment to some 10,000 skilled and unskilled workmen, and the carrying out of the Company's plans will continue to afford a large measure of relief to unemployment for some years to come.

In addition, the provision of cheap electric power from the Barking Power House will afford an invaluable stimulus to London industries and will enable manufacturers to secure increased production at a reduced cost. It is now universally recognised that cheap and abundant electric power is vital to the progress of an industrial Nation. We are witnessing the transition from the age of steam to the age of electricity. Among the numerous benefits of this fundamental change, not the least will be the improvement of conditions in factories and workshops, and the gradual elimination of the smoke nuisance.

The wider distribution of electric power over the undeveloped areas of Greater London will enable new factories to be placed in the outlying districts where the workpeople can be housed in the healthiest surroundings. By effecting this form of industrial redistribution, cheap electric power will result in relieving the inside congested areas which have grown up in the age of steam.

In these manifold directions the enterprise which your Majesties have honoured by your presence to-day will, we earnestly trust, promote the industrial and social advancement of the Metropolis, and ensure that in the provision of an essential public service London shall not lag behind other industrial centres in the Kingdom.

In conclusion, we desire to express our fervent hope that your Majesties may long be spared to reign over this realm and to enjoy the deep and abiding loyalty which is inspired and strengthened by your constant care for the welfare of your subjects.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I thank you for your loyal and dutiful address and for the cordial expression of your good wishes for the Queen and myself.

It gives me much pleasure to open this new Power House at Barking Creek, a remarkable development in the supply of electricity to London and the surrounding counties.

The electrical industry is one of our foremost National activities. It intimately concerns our every day life, affects almost every industrial undertaking and provides the means to improve the conditions of factories and workshops by better equipment and lighting.

Hardly less important is the part which electricity is destined to play in transport, in rural life and in the home. In many of the Dominions, particularly where vast water power is available, electricity has been adapted alike to industry, to agriculture and to domestic purposes. In the British Isles the source of power lies in our great coal fields: and there seems to be no insuperable obstacle to the use of electricity on an equally wide scale. It is manifest that preparations must be made for the attainment of this object: I am gratified to learn that the difficult problem of co-ordinating the numerous systems of supply within London and the

Home Counties is approaching solution, and I trust that this development will spread throughout the country.

No longer a luxury for the few electricity has become a necessity for the many: Its continued growth and wider use will diminish the cost of production and so make it more generally obtainable. I rejoice especially that by thus reducing the smoke of our large towns, by relieving congested areas and by the application of electricity in many other ways the health of the population will materially benefit.

I am gratified to learn that the construction of this Power Station has already assisted the problem of unemployment and that the contemplated work on the extensions of the system will further contribute to that end.

I declare the Electric Power Station at Barking open. I earnestly hope that to-day's inauguration may be a stimulus to an ever increasing supply of electricity throughout the land: and that this useful branch of applied science may demonstrate the skill and industry of my people, increase the trade of the country and promote the general welfare of the community.

Authorisation of Landing of Animal for Exceptional Purposes.

1. been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulation applicable to the Animal on Landing.

4. The animal on being landed shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animal shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animal shall be moved into such premises.

To extend the area of supply under the Burton-on-Trent Corporation Electric Lighting Order, 1890, by adding thereto the urban district of Swadlincote; the parishes or townships of Bretby, Cauldwell, Castle Gresley, Catton, Coton in the Elms, Drakelow, Foremark, Linton, Lullington, Newton Solney, Repton, Rosliston and Walton-upon-Trent in the rural district of Repton; and the parishes of Nether Seal, Over Seal, Woodville and Hartshorn in the rural district of Hartshorne and Seals; all in the County of Derby; and the rural district of Tutbury in the County of Stafford. To authorise the Corporation to open, break up, and interfere with all streets, roads and public places, ways, footpaths, bridges, culverts, sewers, drains and gas and water mains and pipes and telegraph and telephone and other wires within the area of supply, and to lay down, erect, maintain, renew and remove either above or under ground or otherwise electric lines, conductors, mains, pipes, tubes, wires, posts, street or distributing boxes, meters, apparatus or other works or things required for the purpose of enabling the Corporation to generate, supply, store, convey, transmit or distribute electricity within the added areas, and to confer all such other powers upon the Corporation as may be necessary for effecting the objects of the proposed undertaking.

6. To prescribe the maximum price or maximum prices that may be demanded and taken by the Corporation in respect of the supply of electrical energy within the added areas and to prescribe the minimum prices to be paid by persons supplied with electricity by the

Corporation or connected to their electricity undertaking in those areas.

7. To authorise the Corporation to fit up show rooms, offices and installations and to give demonstrations as to the use of electricity.

Parish of Swadlincote—Hearthcote Road (from the Hearthcote Pottery Premises to the commencement of West Street); West Street; High Street; Midland Road (from the Market Place to Ault's Pottery); Market Street; Woodhouse Street; Swadlincote Road; Church Street.

In the rural district of Hartshorne and Seals:—

Parish of Woodville—High Street; Church Street.

Parish of Overseal—Main Street (from the Baptist Chapel to the Shrubbery); Woodville Road (from Main Street to the county boundary).

In the rural district of Repton:—

Parish of Repton—High Street; Milton Road (from the junction of Monson Road to the premises known as Askew Hill); Monson Road.

In the rural district of Tutbury:—
