PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 9th day of May, 1925 (C.W. 1185/25), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to sanction, *inter alia*, a new constitution for the Schoolmaster branch, Royal Navy, certain of the provisions of which as regards rank, retired pay and retiring gratuities were intended to be applicable to Officers of the Schoolmaster branch, Royal Marines:

“And whereas it is necessary that the regulations applicable to the Schoolmaster branch, Royal Marines, in these respects should be more clearly defined:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by

Your Order in Council, to sanction the regulations set forth in the annexed Schedule.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“ SCHEDULE.

“1. *Entry and Rank.*—Schoolmasters, Royal Marines, to be as a general rule appointed by direct entry. On entry to have the title of Probationary Schoolmaster, with the acting rank of Warrant Officer, for the first year of their service; at the expiration of this period, if recommended as likely to prove efficient Schoolmasters, to be confirmed in Warrant Rank, seniority to reckon as from six months from date of entry.

Headmasters, Royal Marines, to rank as Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank, Royal Marines.

Chief Schoolmasters, Royal Marines, under 8 years' seniority to rank with Lieutenants, Royal Marines, and with Captains, Royal Marines, on attaining 8 years' seniority.

These rules not to apply to Chief Schoolmasters, Royal Marines, serving on the Active List at the date of this Order.

“ 2. *Retired Pay*—

Chief Schoolmasters.—As provided by Order in Council of 12th August, 1924.

Headmasters and Schoolmasters.

(A) Officers entered in the ranks under the old system to be granted retired pay according to their ranks on the scale for Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank and Warrant

Officers respectively, except when retired below the age of 40 at their own request or for inefficiency.

(B) Officers entered in Warrant rank to be granted retired pay according to their ranks on the scale for Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank and Warrant Officers respectively, except when retired below the age of 40 at their own request or for inefficiency, or when invalided below that age and before promotion to Commissioned rank.

Officers entered in Warrant rank prior to the date of this Order, if invalided before attaining the age of 40 years and before attaining Commissioned rank, to be granted retired pay:—

(a) Of £10 for each complete year's service up to 10 years,

(b) of £120 if they have completed 10 but not 11 years' service.

(c) of £120 with an increment of £5 for each complete year's service in excess of 10.

(C) Officers entered in Warrant rank subsequent to the date of this Order to be regarded

as temporary Officers for the first five years from date of entry and not to be entitled to retired pay except as may be provided for those invalided for causes attributable to the conditions of service.

After five years from date of entry, to be eligible for retired pay as provided in section (B) of this paragraph.

" 3. Retirement with Gratuity.

(A) Officers of the Schoolmaster branch, Royal Marines, to be allowed to retire below the age of 40 years at the discretion of the Admiralty with a gratuity according to scale A in the following Table. (This provision will not however prejudice or affect the powers of the Admiralty under Order in Council of 13th May, 1901).

(B) Officers of the Schoolmaster branch, Royal Marines, who are found to be inefficient or unworthy of further employment may be retired below the age of 40 years, at the discretion of the Admiralty, with a gratuity according to scale B in the following Table:—

	A.	B.
(1) With less than 5 years' seniority in Warrant rank.	Nil.	Nil.
(2) With more than 5, but less than 10 years' seniority in Warrant rank.	A gratuity of £20 for each completed year of service on full pay.	A gratuity of £10 for each completed year of service on full pay.
(3) With more than 10, but less than 15 years' seniority in Warrant rank.	A gratuity of £30 for each completed year of service on full pay.	A gratuity of £15 for each completed year of service on full pay.
(4) With more than 15 years' seniority in Warrant rank.	A gratuity of £40 for each completed year of service on full pay.	A gratuity of £20 for each completed year of service on full pay.

N.B.—Time as Probationary Schoolmaster counts for this purpose.

" 4. Retirement.—Chief Schoolmasters, Headmasters, and Schoolmasters, Royal Marines, to be retired on attaining the age of 55 years, and to be retired at any age at the discretion of the Admiralty, if found physically unfit to serve.

"5. The rates of retired pay authorised herein to be regarded as standard rates comparable with those authorised in Schedule V, Section IX of Order in Council dated 22nd January, 1920, and to be subject to revision

at the same dates and in the same manner as retired pay authorised by that Order."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 19th day of May, 1925 (C.E. 3235/25/N.P.I. 4466/24), in the words following, viz.:—

" Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

" And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of December, 1921, to sanction the Regulations set forth in the Schedule annexed thereto respecting the retired pay of retired officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines serving in the Inspection, Experimental and Compass Departments of the Admiralty, and in certain other similar posts:

" And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable to amend the provisions of the aforesaid Order in Council with a view to effecting a periodical revision of the additional retired pay granted under the Regulations set forth therein:

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the addition of the following regulation to those set forth in the Schedule annexed to the aforesaid Order in Council of the 13th day of December, 1921, the additional Regulation to apply to all officers who finally retire at any future date.

" The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

" *Regulations respecting the retired pay of Retired Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines serving in the Inspection, Experimental, and Compass Departments and in certain similar posts.*

" 10. The increases of retired pay granted under Rules 3, 4, 6 and 7 will be subject to variation with reference to the cost of living to the same extent and at the same dates as the salaries payable in respect of the posts concerned may be varied for the same reason, except that in the case of officers in receipt of salaries which are augmented by a cost of living bonus on the Civil Service scale, the supplementary retired pay based on bonus will be payable in accordance with the rules prescribed in Treasury Minute of the 20th March, 1922, relative to the method of including the cost of living bonus in the calculation of pensions to be granted to civil servants who retire on or after the 21st February, 1922."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS His Majesty by virtue of the authority conferred on Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, and having regard to the provisions of the revised Berne Copyright Convention of 1908 was pleased to make an Order in Council dated the 24th June, 1912 (hereafter called the Principal Order), extending the protection of such Act to certain classes of works to which protection is guaranteed by the said Convention:

And whereas His Majesty has acceded to the said Convention on behalf of Palestine:

And whereas by the Copyright Act, 1911 (Extension to Palestine) Order, 1924, dated the 21st day of March, 1924, the Copyright Act, 1911, extends to Palestine:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Copyright Act, 1911, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Principal Order as amended by any subsequent Order in Council shall apply to Palestine as if it were included amongst the territories named in Article 5 (b) of the Principal Order subject to the following modifications:—

(a) In the application of the provisions of Article 3 of the Principal Order the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act and for the commencement of the Principal Order, and Palestine for the parts of His Majesty's Dominions to which the Principal Order applies.

(b) In the application to works enjoying rights under Article 3 of the Principal Order as amended by this Order of Sections 1 (2) (d) and 19 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act in Sections 19 (7) and 19 (8) wherever that expression occurs and the 21st day of March, 1924, for the passing of the Act.

(c) In the application to existing works of the provisions of Section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act wherever that expression occurs in Sub-Section 1 (a) and for the 26th July, 1910, in Sub-Section 1 (b).

2. This Order may be cited as the Berne Copyright Convention (Accession of Palestine) Order, 1925.

WHEREAS by Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, it is (amongst other things) provided that, if a majority of the whole Council of a Borough agree to petition, and the Council thereupon petition, the King for the alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the Borough it shall be lawful for His Majesty, from time to time, by Order in Council, to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough shall be divided, and that the Borough shall be divided into that number

of Wards, and that where an Order in Council has been so made the Secretary of State shall appoint a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of the Wards and apportioning the Councillors among them :

And whereas a majority of the whole Council of the City of York did on the 21st day of January, 1924, agree to petition, and the Council of the said City thereupon petitioned, His Majesty for the alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the said City :

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 25th day of July, 1924, to fix the number of Wards into which the City of York should be henceforth divided, and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be twelve :

And whereas on the 29th day of August, 1924, the Right Honourable Arthur Henderson, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint R. C. Maxwell, Esquire, O.B.E., LL.D., Barrister at Law, to be a Commissioner for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the City of York :

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 28th day of March, 1925 :—

“ **SCHEME** for determining the Boundaries of the Wards and apportioning the Councillors amongst the Wards of the City of York.

“ **Number of Wards.**

“ By Order of His Majesty in Council made in that behalf on the 25th day of July, 1924, the number of Wards of the City of York was fixed at twelve.

“ **Names of Wards.**

Clifton.	Fishergate.
Bootham.	Holgate.
Monk.	Micklegate.
Castlegate.	Scarcroft.
Heworth.	Knavesmire.
Walmgate.	Guildhall.

“ **Boundaries of Wards.**

“ *Clifton.*

“ The Clifton Ward shall include the area comprised within :—

“ A line commencing at the intersection of the York and Scarborough Railway line of the London and North Eastern Railway Company with the City Boundary thence proceeding in a South Westerly direction along the centre of the said railway line to the centre of the Scarborough Railway bridge over the River Ouse thence in a North Westerly direction along the centre of the River Ouse to the City Boundary and thereafter following the City-Boundary in a North Easterly direction to the point of commencement.

“ *Bootham.*

“ The Bootham Ward shall include the area comprised within :—

“ A line commencing at the centre of the Scarborough Railway Bridge over the River Ouse thence in a North Easterly direction following the Eastern Boundary of Clifton Ward as hereinbefore defined to the City Boundary thence in a Northerly Easterly and Southerly direction following the City-Boundary to a point in the River Foss where the Foss Islands Branch Railway intersects

the said River near the York Union Workhouse thence along the centre of the said River to a point immediately opposite the intersection of the footpath by the side of the River Foss with Huntington Road thence in a straight line to the said intersection thence in a Northerly direction along the centre of Huntington Road to the intersection of Park Grove thence in a North Westerly direction along the centre of Park Grove, Neville Terrace and Neville Street to the intersection of Haxby Road, thence in a South Westerly direction along the centre of Haxby Road and Clarence Street to the intersection of Lord Mayor's Walk thence in a South Easterly direction along the centre of Lord Mayor's Walk to a point immediately opposite the North angle of the City Wall and thence to the said North angle of the City Wall and thereafter following the outside line of the City Wall in a South Westerly direction to the centre of the North West face of Bootham Bar, thence in a North Westerly direction along the centre of Bootham to the intersection of Marygate, thence in a South Westerly direction along the centre of Marygate to Marygate Landing, thence by the shortest line to the centre of the River Ouse and thereafter along the centre of the River Ouse to the point of commencement.

“ *Monk.*

“ The Monk Ward shall include the area comprised within :—

“ A line commencing at the North angle of the City Wall in Lord Mayor's Walk thence in a North Easterly and South Easterly direction following the Eastern Boundary of Bootham Ward hereinbefore defined to the point where Huntington Road intersects the footpath by the side of the River Foss thence by the nearest line to the centre of the River Foss, thence in a Southerly direction along the centre of the River Foss to the centre of Layerthorpe Bridge thence by the shortest line to the most Easterly point of the bastion against the steps leading up to the City Wall near the said Bridge, thence following the outside line of the City Wall to Monk Bar, thence following the outside line of Monk Bar and continuing along the outside line of the City Wall to the point of commencement.

“ *Castlegate.*

“ The Castlegate Ward shall include the area comprised within :—

“ A line commencing at the centre of Layerthorpe Bridge thence proceeding in a South Easterly direction along the centre of the River Foss for a distance of two hundred and seventy yards thence across by the shortest line to the centre of Foss Islands Road, thence in a Southerly direction along the centre of Foss Islands Road to a point immediately opposite the North East angle of the Red Tower, thence by the shortest line to the North East angle of the Red Tower thence in a Southerly direction following the outside line of the Red Tower and the City Wall to Walmgate Barbican, thence in a Southerly and Westerly direction following the outside line of the said Barbican and the outside line of the City Wall to the outer angle formed by the City Wall and the Wall at the foot of the rampart near the Tower of Fishergate Postern, thence by the shortest line to the centre of Castle Mills Bridge,

thence along the centre of Castle Mills Bridge and Tower Street to the intersection of Skeldergate Bridge Approach, thence along the centre of the said approach and Skeldergate Bridge to the centre point of the said Bridge, thence in a North Westerly direction along the centre of the River Ouse to the centre of Ouse Bridge thence in a North Easterly direction along the centre of Ouse Bridge, Low Ousegate, Spurriergate, Market Street to the intersection of Feasegate and Feasegate thence in a straight line across Saint Sampson's Square to the centre of Church Street, thence along the centre of Church Street to its junction with King's Square, thence by the shortest line to the junction of King's Square with Saint Andrewgate thence along the centre of Saint Andrewgate to the intersection of Aldwark thence in a Northerly direction along the centre of Aldwark and Goodramgate to a point at the centre of the outside of Monk Bar and thence in a South Easterly direction following the Boundary of Monk Ward hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement.

"Heworth."

"The Heworth Ward shall include the area comprised within:—

"A line commencing in the River Foss where the Foss Islands Branch Railway intersects the said River near the York Union Workhouse thence in an Easterly and Southerly direction following the City Boundary to its intersection with the Derwent Valley Light Railway, thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of the said Railway to its junction with the London and North Eastern Railway Company's Foss Islands Branch Railway, thence in a Southerly direction along the centre of the last mentioned Railway to its junction with the York Corporation Railway Siding thence along the centre of the said Railway Siding to the centre of Foss Islands Road and thence in a Northerly direction following the Eastern Boundaries of the Castlegate Monk and Bootham Wards hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement.

"Walmgate."

"The Walmgate Ward shall include the area comprised within:—

"A line commencing at the intersection of the City Boundary with the Derwent Valley Light Railway thence following the City Boundary in a South Easterly and South Westerly and Southerly direction to the intersection of Heslington Road thence along the centre of Heslington Road to a point immediately opposite the North East angle of the Friends' Retreat, thence to the North East angle of the Friends' Retreat thence following the Eastern, Southern, and Western Boundaries of the said Retreat to a point due East of the South East Corner of York Cemetery, thence in a straight line across Walmgate Stray to the South East corner of York Cemetery aforesaid thence in a Northerly, Easterly, Northerly and Westerly direction following the line of the Cemetery Wall to the centre of the Southern end of Belle Vue Street, thence along the centre of Belle Vue Street to the intersection of Heslington Road, thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of Heslington Road to the intersection of Barbican Road, thence in a Northerly direction along the centre of Barbican Road to the centre

of the face of the Walmgate Barbican and thereafter in a Northerly and Easterly direction following the Eastern Boundary of Castlegate Ward and the Southern Boundary of Heworth Ward hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement.

"Fishergate."

"The Fishergate Ward shall include the area comprised within:—

"A line commencing at the centre of Skeldergate Bridge, thence in an Easterly and South Easterly direction following the Southern Boundaries of Castlegate and Walmgate Wards, hereinbefore defined, to the City Boundary, thence in a Southerly and Westerly direction following the City Boundary to the centre of the River Ouse and thereafter along the centre line of the River Ouse to the point of commencement.

"Holgate."

"The Holgate Ward shall include the area comprised within:—

"A line commencing at the intersection on the North West side of the City of the River Ouse with the City Boundary where the Boundary runs from the South West thence in a North Easterly and South Easterly direction along the centre of the River Ouse to the centre of the Scarborough Railway Bridge thence by the shortest line to the centre of the footpath leading from Scarborough Railway Bridge to Leeman Road where the footpath turns in a Southerly direction thence along the centre of the said footpath to the intersection of Leeman Road thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of Leeman Road to the intersection of Cinder Lane thence in a South Westerly direction along the centre of Cinder Lane and the footbridge over the London and North Eastern Railway Company's Railway to the South Western extremity of the said footbridge thence in a North Westerly and South Westerly direction following the boundary wall of the London and North Eastern Railway Company's Railway and premises to the point where such railway and premises abut on Holgate Road thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of Holgate Road to the centre of the bridge over Holgate Beck thence along the centre of Holgate Beck to the City Boundary, and thereafter following the City Boundary in a Northerly direction to the point of commencement.

"Micklegate."

"The Micklegate Ward shall include the area comprised within:—

"A line commencing at the centre of Scarborough Railway Bridge thence proceeding in a South Easterly direction along the centre of the River Ouse to the centre of Lendal Bridge thence in a South Westerly direction by the shortest line to the most Northerly point on the outside of the Tower of North Street Postern thence in a South Westerly and South Easterly direction following the outside line of the said Tower and the outside line of the city wall to a point opposite the intersection of Price's Lane with Nunnery Lane thence to the point of intersection aforesaid thence in an Easterly direction along the centre of Nunnery Lane to the intersection of Price Street thence in a Southerly direction along the centre of Price Street to the intersection of Nunthorpe

Road thence in a North Westerly direction along the centre of Nunthorpe Road to the intersection near the North West corner of Scarcroft School of the North Westerly footpath leading across Scarcroft to Scarcroft Road thence in a South Westerly direction along the centre of the said footpath to Scarcroft Road thence by the shortest line across Scarcroft Road and along the centre of Scarcroft Hill to the intersection of Albemarle Road thence continuing in a Northerly direction along the centre of Albemarle Road to a point in line with the North Boundary of Knavesmire thence in a Westerly, Southerly, and Westerly direction along the said boundary to a point in line therewith in the centre of the part of Tadcaster Road known as Mount Vale thence in a Southerly direction along the centre of Tadcaster Road to the City Boundary and thereafter in a Westerly, Northerly, and North Easterly direction following the City Boundary and the South Eastern Boundary of Holgate Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement.

" Scarcroft.

" The Scarcroft Ward shall include the area comprised within :—

" A line commencing at a point in the City Wall immediately opposite the intersection of Nunnery Lane with Price's Lane thence in an Easterly direction following the outside line of the City Wall to its end at Baile Hill thence by the shortest line to the centre of Skeldergate Bridge thence in a South Westerly and Southerly direction along the centre of Skeldergate Bridge Skeldergate Bridge Approach Bishopgate Street and Bishopthorpe Road to the intersection of Balmoral Terrace thence in a Westerly direction along the centre of Balmoral Terrace and Queen Victoria Street to the intersection of Albemarle Road thence in a Northerly direction along the centre of Albemarle Road to the boundary of Micklegate Ward as hereinbefore defined and thereafter in a North Easterly direction following the Eastern boundary of the said Ward to the point of commencement.

" Knavesmire.

" The Knavesmire Ward shall include the area comprised within :—

" A line commencing at a point in the centre of Tadcaster Road where it intersects the City Boundary thence in a Northerly, Easterly, South Easterly, and Northerly direction following the Eastern Boundary of Micklegate Ward and the Western, Southern, and Eastern Boundaries of Scarcroft Ward hereinbefore defined to the centre of Skeldergate Bridge thence in a Southerly direction following the Western Boundary of Fishergate Ward hereinbefore defined to the City Boundary and thereafter following the City Boundary in a Westerly, Southerly, and North Westerly direction to the point of commencement.

" Guildhall.

" The Guildhall Ward shall include the remaining portion of the City not comprised within the respective boundaries of the eleven Wards of the City hereinbefore defined.

" Description.

" The Boundaries of the Wards as above defined are delineated in the Plan which is

annexed hereto and forms part of this Scheme.

" In case of any discrepancy between the Wards as delineated on the Plan and the textual description of the Wards the textual description shall prevail.
