## RURAL DISTRICT OF UPTON-UPON-SEVERN.

Public Health Acts Amendment Act. 1907.

PY an Order dated the 16th day of May, 1925, the Minister of Health has declared that, on and after the 8th day of June, 1925, the following provisions of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in some or all the contributory places within the Rural District of Upton-upon-Severn as follows:—

(a) In all the contributory places:—Section 23 (subject however to the provisions of Section 33) comprised in Part II (streets and buildings); and

Part III (sanitary provisions), other than Sections 39 to 42 (inclusive), 47 and 51;

(b) In the contributory places of Guarlford, Kempsey, Madresfield, Powick, and Upton-upon-Severn:—Sections 39 to 42 (inclusive) comprised in Part III;

(c) In the contributory place of Uptonupon-Severn: -- Section 47, comprised in

Part III.

The above provisions are declared to be in force subject, as regards Sections 23, 35, and 38, to the conditions specified in the Order.

(c) For liberty to the Company to raise redeemable Preference Stock or Shares or re-

deemable Debenture Stock.

(f) That a Director of the Company shall not be disqualified from holding office as such by reason of his holding any office or place of trust or profit under the Company, or by reason of his being interested in any Contract with the Company.

(g) For liberty to the Company to grant such gratuities, pensions, or allowances to employees of the Company, and to subscribe and make donations for certain charitable purposes as the Directors of the Company shall

think fit.

(h) For liberty to the Company to pay interim dividends.
