### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 20th day of May, 1925 (N. 1352/25), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we considered it desirable to reconstitute the Coastguard as a pensioner force under the designation of the Coastguard New Force as from the 1st May, 1919, with rates of pay as set forth in the accompanying Schedule I and conditions of service as set forth in the accompanying Schedule II:

"And whereas certain of the duties hitherto performed by Your Majesty's Coastguard under the Board of Admiralty have, since the first day of April, 1923, been carried out by employés of the Board of Trade and Board of Customs at all Stations other than certain Admiralty Shore Signal Stations where the duties are performed by the Admiralty on behalf of the Board of Trade:

"And whereas it is desirable to alter the designation of and to specify the conditions of service of the Force now remaining under the Admiralty for duty at Admiralty Shore Signal Stations, the officers of which will in future be officers of Your Majesty's Navy and the men of which will in future be entered in Your Majesty's Navy:

Your Majesty's Navy:

"And whereas the full pay and retiring allowances of Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines are subject to revision periodically, and we are of opinion that the pay and discharge gratuities of Officers of the Royal Naval Shore Signal Service should be subject to revision in the same manner and at the same dates:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to direct that the Force performing at Admiralty Shore Signal Stations certain of the duties hitherto carried out by the Coastguard New Force shall in future be designated The Royal Naval Shore Signal Service and that the titles of the various ranks and ratings of the Royal Naval Shore Signal Service shall be as follows, viz.:—Senior Chief Officers, Chief Officers, Petty Officers and

Signalmen.

"We beg leave further to recommend that the officers and men of the Royal Naval Shore Signal Service shall serve from time to time with the rates of pay as set forth in Schedule I

hereto and under the conditions set forth in the Coastguard Instructions, 1911, as amended to the date of this Memorial, except in so far as these conditions may be inconsistent with the provisions of Schedules II and III hereto, in which case the provisions of Schedules II and III shall prevail.

"The Lords Commissioners of Majesty's Treasury have concurred in these

proposals.

### " SCHEDULE I.

"The rates of pay and allowances of Officers and men of the Coastguard (New Force) as from the 1st May, 1919, and of the Royal Naval Shore Signal Service to be as follows, the standard rates of pay and discharge gratuities of Senior Chief Officers and Chief Officers being subject to further revision on 1st July, 1927, and triennially thereafter:

"These rates are inclusive of provision allowance, and subject to abatement, as may be determined by the Admiralty, in the event of an Officer or man being subsisted in hospital or otherwise at the public expense. In the case of men joining the Royal Naval Shore Signal Service hereafter the rates of pay will further be subject to revision in the event of the rate of provision allowance for the Active Service falling below 2s. 1d. per diem.

Per diem. " Allowance to W/T ratings ... 6d. Allowance to Station Signal-3d.

" Service in the Coastguard (New Force) to reckon for increase of pay in the equivalent rank or rating in the Shore Signal Service.

### Special Allowances.

"The following allowances to be payable:-

" Marriage Allowance.—Marriage Allowance to be payable to ratings of the Coastguard (New Force) and of the Shore Signal Service at the rates promulgated from time to time by the Admiralty in accordance with Order in Council

of the 13th August, 1920.
"Allowance for work done in connection with the Works Department.—Men of the Coastguard (New Force) and of the Shore Signal Service employed on work in connection with the Works Department to be eligible as from the 17th October, 1924, for a special rate of extra pay of 9d. per hour, in lieu of the rate of 6d. per hour sanctioned by Order in Council of the 29th June, 1900.

### " Gratuities.

"Gratuities to be payable on discharge from the Coastguard (New Force) on or after the 1st May, 1919, or from the Shore Signal Service, as follows:-

"The amount of gratuity for a Senior Chief Officer or a Chief Officer in no circumstances to exceed the amount payable for the first 15 years of service reckoning for gratuity purposes. A fraction of a month in the aggregate period of service reckoning for gratuity to be ignored.

' If discharged before completing his engagement an Officer or man to be paid the amount of gratuity earned by service at the time of discharge, unless discharged for misconduct or at his own request free or by purchase; the Admiralty to have power at their discretion to award a reduced gratuity to any officer or man who may be invalided for causes within his own control.

"In the event of an officer's or man's death while serving the amount of the gratuity earned to the date of death to be credited to his estate.

### " SCHEDULE II.

" (1) Personnel who joined the Coastguard (New Force) on or after the 1st May, 1919, to be allowed to serve until the age of 55 in the case of Chief Officers, or Divisional or Senior Chief Officers, and 50 in the case of men, in any part of the United Kingdom to which they may from time to time be appointed, provided that their services are so long required, and to be borne on the books of one of the ships belonging to His Majesty's Fleet, and so to be subject to the disciplinary laws and regulations of the Royal Navy, and to be bound to accept and observe such other regulations as are contained in the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions and any other orders which may, from time to time, be issued.

(2) Officers and men who were discharged from the Royal Naval Coast Guard Service on the 31st March, 1923, with compensation under the provisions of the Order in Council dated the 16th April, 1924, and who have been required to refund such compensation in whole or in part on being re-entered in the Royal Naval Coastguard Service, if their services are again dispensed with for reasons other than misconduct, invaliding, death, or their own request (free or by purchase), before the age of 55 in the case of Senior Chief Officers or Chief Officers, or the age of 50 in the case of Petty Officers and men, to be eligible for the usual gratuity on discharge provided for in Schedule I of this Order in respect of such part of their pensioner service as shall have been served in the Royal Naval Coastguard under 'New Force 'conditions, or in the Royal Naval Shore Signal Service, and in addition to a special gratuity calculated as follows:

" (a) If, not being pensioners on their discharge from the Royal Naval Coastguard Service on the 31st March, 1923, they received compensation under the provisions of Schedule A of the Order in Council dated the 16th April, 1924, in the form of pension for service prior to that date and a gratuity for the curtailment of their careers, they shall be eligible for a gratuity bearing the same proportion to the gratuity paid to them on their discharge from the Royal Naval Coastguard Service as the period by which their careers are finally curtailed bears to the period by which their careers would have been curtailed if they had not re-entered the Royal Naval Coastguard Service.

"(b) If, being pensioners on their discharge from the Royal Naval Coastguard Service on the 31st March, 1923, they received compensation under Schedule B of the Order in Council dated the 16th April, 1924, in the form of a gratuity for service prior to that date and a further gratuity for the curtailment of their careers they shall be eligible for a gratuity bearing the same proportion to the further gratuity then paid

to them as the period by which their careers are finally curtailed bears to the period by which their careers would have been curtailed if they had not re-entered the Royal Naval Coastguard Service.

"Officers and men thus compensated will not be entitled to any pay in lieu of notice.

### " SCHEDULE III.

"In the case of personnel joining the Royal Naval Shore Signal Service hereafter Chief Officers and Senior Chief Officers to be allowed to serve until the age of 55, provided that their services are so long required, and men to serve under Naval non-continuous service engagements for a period not exceeding five years, provided that their services are so long required, in any part of the United Kingdom to which they may from time to time be appointed, and such Officers and men to be borne on the books of one of the ships belonging to His Majesty's Fleet, and so to be subject to the disciplinary laws and regulations of the Royal Navy, as well as bound to accept and observe such other regulations as are contained in the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions and any other orders which may, from time to time, be issued."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made on the 3rd day of May, 1882, in pursuance of the provisions of Section 60 of the Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862 (25 and 26 Vic. Cap. 63) (hereinafter called "the Act of 1862"), Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the ships of Hayti, the certificates of Haitian nationality and registry, or the certificates of measurement, of which, were dated on or after the 26th day of January, 1882, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the said certificates of Haitian nationality and registry or certificates of measurement:

And whereas by Sub-Section (1) of Section 745 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 and 58 Vic. Cap. 60) (hereinafter called "the Act of 1894"), the Act of 1862 was repealed, but it was provided that any Order in Council made under the Act of 1862 should continue in force as if it had been made under the Act of 1894:

And whereas by Sub-Section (1) of Section 738 of the Act of 1894 it is provided that where His Majesty has power under that Act to make any Order in Council His Majesty may revoke any Order so made:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the tonnage regulations of the Act of 1894 are no longer in force in

Hayti:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the above recited provisions and of all other powers Him thereunto enabling, is pleased to order as follows:—

- 1. The above recited Order in Council made on the 3rd day of May, 1882, is hereby revoked.
- 2. This Order may be cited as "The Merchant Shipping (Haitian Tonnage Regulations Order) Revocation Order, 1925."

The following Address was presented to The KING on Saturday, the 23rd ultimo, on the occasion of the laying of the foundation stone of the new premises of Lloyd's, in course of erection in Leadenhall Street, London, E.C. 3.

CORPORATION OF LLOYD'S.

To the King's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty:—

In graciously consenting to lay the foundation stone of the new Lloyd's Your Majesty is giving Royal approval to an enterprise characteristically British both in origin and development. Its origin is to be found in the seventeenth century when Merchants interested in overseas commerce resorted to the Coffee House kept by Edward Lloyd first in Tower Street and then in Lombard Street. To Lloyd's Coffee House, in order to obtain and sometimes to give information, came the most famous "Clerk of the King's Ships," Samuel Pepys, and thus began that relation between the Royal Navy and Lloyd's which has subsisted to the present day.

From this modest, almost casual, beginning there has grown up, by imperceptible gradations, the Corporation of Lloyd's, at once National and International; National in its peculiarly British characteristics, International in its world-wide organisation and influence. Even throughout the vicissitudes of the Great War it continued to command the confidence

of the business communities in the allied and neutral nations.

Lloyd's did not emerge from the Coffee House stage until the last quarter of the eighteenth century, when under the guidance of Angerstein it took up its position in the old Royal Exchange, and, after the burning of that building, in the present Royal Exchange, which in 1844 was opened by Her Majesty Queen Victoria. It is from this place that Lloyd's is about to move to a site that has an interest for the Emperor of India, as well as for the King, for here stood the India House, the home of the East India Company, another characteristically British enterprise, which, setting out to exchange merchandise, founded an Empire.

Thus the business which two and a half centuries ago lived only in a coffee house, is now to find its permanent home in the greatest building erected in the City of London since the day of Wren. To that new home the Members of Lloyd's will carry with them the memories and associations which belong inseparably to those who go down to the sea in ships, or who have their business in great waters, and who by their lives and work have wrought in us the ever deepening realisation of the interdependence of all peoples. The nations of the world are knit together by strands woven from commerce of which the old East India House and Lloyd's are representative

Your Majesty's loyal subjects who form the present Corporation of Lloyd's are conscious that they are the inheritors of a great tradition and that the stone which Your Majesty lays to-day is the symbol of no mere material increase, but of that lasting foundation of honour and integrity which has been well and truly laid by generations of honourable and upright traders. It is to that tradition that we owe Your Majesty's gracious presence here to-day when we are resolving afresh to maintain and transmit it unimpaired; and for this invaluable sympathy and encouragement we desire to lay before Your Majesty our loyal and humble gratitude.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address and enthusiastic welcome.

It affords me the greatest pleasure to come here and lay the Foundation Stone of Lloyd's new building. I have been impressed, as everyone must be, by the extraordinary and romantic history of Lloyd's, outlined in your Address, and by its evolution from an ordinary seventeenth century Coffee House to the great public and international Institution, familiar to us all. Cromwell said that none rises so high as he who does not know whither he is going, and this has held good in our organisations as well as in men.

You have also referred with legitimate pride to the traditional honour and integrity upon which the greatness of Lloyd's is founded. The history of the Corporation is the embodiment of the highest qualities of British Commerce. Lloyd's policy has never been a one-sided pursuit of gain, but a combination of keenness and efficiency in business with a real and deep public spirit.

It is not a mere coincidence that we owe the institution of our Lifeboat Service to Lloyd's, or that our National Gallery began with the pictures collected by a famous Chairman of

your Body.

There is one branch of your work which calls for special reference, and all the more so because you have modestly foreborne to make the least allusion to it yourselves, the inestimable services which Lloyd's has rendered to the country in war time. Throughout the long wars of the Revolutionary period, Lloyd's was constantly able to supply the Admiralty with valuable information as to the safety of commerce, the presence of hostile cruisers in the Channel, or the loss of merchant vessels through enemy action, and took a most active interest in the adoption and better organisation of the convoy system. In similar circumstances in our own day, the Lloyd's of 1914 rose again to the situation and displayed the same loyalty and public spirit as in 1793. The State largely depended on the machinery of Lloyd's for reports, received through its agents and other channels, which contributed to the safety of British shipping and British cargoes of indispensable value to the welfare of the country.

It would, however, give an imperfect view of the scope and effect of your work were no mention made of its international character: your world wide organisations and influence have always been at the disposal of all maritime peoples who are in peace and amity with the British Empire.

Remembering the history of your Corporation and its record of services to Great Britain and the whole world, we confidently hope for still greater things from that expansion and development—the outcome of to-day's inauguration. Even without the assurance in your Address, your fellow countrymen proudly recognise that you are conscious of your great inheritance and traditions and determined to hand on these to future generations.

I pray that the Blessing of God may rest upon the Corporation of Lloyd's. May your new home witness a continual growth in your work, prosperity and well-earned honour.

### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANTS IN THE NAUTICAL ALMANAC OFFICE UNDER THE ADMIRALTY.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to. alteration from time to time. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises on the occurrence of

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 22 and must not have attained the age of  $\overline{40}$ on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part.\*

2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and born of a father also a naturalborn British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as to the father in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

<sup>\*</sup> For competitions subsequent to the competition now announced the upper age limit will be reduced to 30.

3. Until further order, special consideration will be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces during the War.

No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

4. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for

appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force, will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at this interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they The decision of will frame their decisions. the Selection Board will be final.
- 9. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through

Members of Parliament or other influential persons, will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the university, in the Forces, or otherwise.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Application of Part 1 of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920.

1. (1) Part 1. (Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920 is

hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Area."

2. This Article shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of July, and shall cease to operate on the tenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

Restrictions on Exposure of Sheep at Markets, &c. within the Area during the Period from 24th July to 9th September.

2.—(1) Sheep on any premises in the Area shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be permitted to enter, or be exposed for sale or exhibition in any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in that Area during the period from 24th July to 9th September, in the current year, unless they have during the

period from 15th July to 9th September in the current year been dipped twice on separate dates with an interval of not less than ten and not more than fourteen days between the two dates, and are accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, stating that the sheep have been so dipped, and the dates of dipping, and that since the second dipping the sheep have been kept separate as far as practicable while in the Area

from other sheep not so dipped.

(2) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under the direction of the Local Authority, may grant an exemption, subject to such conditions (if any) as may be specified therein, exempting sheep in the Area from one or both of the dippings in any particular case in which the Inspector is satisfied that it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip the sheep. In any such case the reasons for granting the exemption shall be stated therein, and the Local Authority shall forthwith cause a copy of the exemption to be forwarded to the Ministry. If the Minister considers that the exemption is for any reason undesirable, and directs the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate, but not so as to affect the previous operation of the exemption.

### Special Provision as to Fat Sheep for Immediate Slaughter.

3. Where an Inspector of a Local Authority is satisfied that any sheep in his District in the Area are intended for immediate slaughter, and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should in accordance with this Order be dipped before exposure for sale or exhibition, he may, subject to any directions by the Local Authority, by licence authorise the movement of the sheep to any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in the Area, subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence, and thereupon the sheep may, in accordance with such licence and conditions be exposed for sale in the market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition free from any restrictions imposed by any Order of the Minister relating to Sheep Scab or Sheep Dipping; provided that an Inspector of a Local Authority shall not issue any such licence for movement to premises in the District of another Local Authority unless the consent of such Local Authority either generally or in the particular instance, has been previously obtained.

### Offences.

4. If a sheep is permitted to enter or is exposed for sale in any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition, in contravention of this Order, the occupier of the premises, and the owner and person in charge of the sheep, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

### Power to make Regulations.

- 1.—(1) The Local Authorities of the Districts specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep) for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.
- (2) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the Districts, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

### Confirmation of Regulations.

- 2.—(1) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

### Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by Section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police); Section forty-four (powers of inspectors); and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.
