AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative County of Hertford have, in pursuance of the above Act, duly fixed overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time-work during the hay harvest in 1925, in that area, and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board, in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective from the 8th day of June, 1925.

SCHEDULE.

1. The differential rates of wages payable to male and female workers for overtime employment on harvest work in the hay harvest as defined by the Committee in their Order defining such employment shall be not less than the following minimum rates:—

(a) Male Workers.	Rates per hour.
21 years of age and over ...	10d.
20 and under 21 years ...	9d.
19 " " 20 " ...	8d.
18 " " 19 " ...	7d.
17 " " 18 " ...	6d.
16 " " 17 " ...	5½d.
15 " " 16 " ...	4½d.
14 " " 15 " ...	4d.

(b) Female Workers.	Rates per hour.
19 years of age and over ...	7½d.
18 and under 19 years ...	7d.
17 " " 18 " ...	6d.
16 " " 17 " ...	5½d.
15 " " 16 " ...	4½d.
14 " " 15 " ...	4d.

2. Any existing rate or order so far as the same is inconsistent with this Order is hereby superseded.

ORDER DEFINING THE EMPLOYMENT TO BE TREATED AS OVERTIME EMPLOYMENT DURING THE PERIOD OF THE HAY HARVEST OF 1925 MADE BY THE HERTFORDSHIRE AGRICUL- TURAL WAGES COMMITTEE.

The Hertfordshire Agricultural Wages Committee, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Agricultural Wages Committees Regulations, 1924, do by this Order define for the purpose of the application of any differential rate of wages fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative County of Hertford for workers employed on the Hay Harvest for overtime employment during the said Harvest of 1925, the undermentioned employment as the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment:—

1. All employment on the Hay Harvest after the hour of 5.30 p.m. (legal Summer Time) on each day of the week.

2. Any existing Order so far as the same is inconsistent with this Order is hereby superseded.

This Order shall come into operation on 8th June, 1925.
