The following Addresses were presented to The KING on Saturday, the 30th ultimo, on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of the New Great West Road.

## MIDDLESEX COUNTY COUNCIL.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

The Loyal and Dutiful Address of the Council of the Administrative County of Middlesex.

May it Please Your Majesty:—

We, The Chairman, Aldermen and Councillors of The County Council of Middlesex, desire respectfully to express our keen sense of the honour conferred by your Majesty upon the Council and their County in graciously consenting to preside at the Opening of the new Great West Road.

Your Majesty's presence is the more appreciated in that it affords us a welcome opportunity of expressing our thankfulness at the restoration of your Majesty's health as the result of your recent voyage.

Of the numerous arterial road schemes promoted by the Highway Authorities of the country in conjunction with the Ministry of Transport, the road now to be opened is one of the earliest in its origin, the Act for its construction having been passed in 1914 to alleviate the inconvenience caused by the narrow western exits from London. Progress was delayed by the Great War, and the magnitude of the scheme has since been increased by an extension to the Staines Road, and by an

addition to the width of the highway. Much work has thus been found for the unemployed, and it is hoped that the road in its present form will add to the dignity as well as the convenience of the Metropolis, besides promoting the orderly development of the County of Middlesex.

We venture to regard your Majesty's visit as a recognition of the high value attaching to this great scheme of public improvement, and as an encouragement to those engaged in providing traffic facilities for the present generation and their descendants.

We humbly desire to tender to Her Majesty The Queen our warmest thanks for Her gracious presence here to-day, and for the evidence thus afforded of Her Majesty's sympathetic interest in all questions affecting the public welfare.

We pray that your Majesty may long be spared to reign over the Realm, and to enjoy the continued devotion, loyalty and goodwill of its people.

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*To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—*

On behalf of the Queen and myself I tender you our most cordial thanks for your loyal and dutiful Address. The heartiness of your welcome adds to our pleasure in taking part in this afternoon's ceremony, which marks the conclusion of a notable enterprise reflecting great credit upon the foresight of all concerned.

Although much of what was rural in your County has been absorbed by urban districts,

there still remain large tracts of undeveloped land, and these will in course of time doubtless change their aspect. Industrial colonies will grow up beside the railways and waterways, while elsewhere residential districts will provide scope for the spread of London's population. The choice of Wembley as the site of the British Empire Exhibition is significant of the metropolitan character of Middlesex.

The unavoidable transformation of the country surrounding London needs to be carefully guided and controlled. Haphazard growth has inflicted irreparable damage on many parts where, instead of preceding it, roads and communications have lagged far behind industrial development. Your Council, I am glad to say, have boldly grappled with this problem, and thus spared their successors the costly and wasteful experience of making new roads through congested areas.

The undertaking known as the New Great West Road forms only one item in a comprehensive programme of arterial roads upon which, with assistance from the Road Fund, you have embarked. Your programme includes similar schemes:—the North Circular Road already plays a valuable part as a means of access to the British Empire Exhibition: the Western Avenue will discharge London traffic at a point west of Uxbridge: and the New Chertsey Road will provide additional bridges over the Thames at points where traffic facilities are now becoming inadequate.

I look forward with keen pleasure to the completion of these far-reaching proposals—feeling sure that such measures alone can provide for the future needs of the Imperial Capital.

I believe and trust that the prosperity and growth of the County of Middlesex will be fostered by the enlightened policy pursued by your Council, to whose continued labours I wish every success.

Upon the important task which you have just accomplished, I heartily congratulate your Council and its staff, the Ministry of Transport and all those who, from its earliest inception, have co-operated in the work.

In declaring the New Great West Road open, I pray that the Blessing of God may rest upon all who take part in the public life of your County and whose efforts are directed to the welfare of their fellow citizens.

May it Please Your Majesty:—

We, the Chairmen and Members of the Urban District Councils of Brentford, Chiswick, and Heston and Isleworth, and the Rural District Council of Staines, beg to tender our loyal greeting to your Majesty upon the occasion of the opening of the new Great West

In thanking you for the loyal and dutiful Address which you have presented, I desire to express the pleasure which it affords the Queen and myself to meet representatives of the Local Authorities on this memorable occasion.

The spread of London will confer greater and greater importance upon the already populous districts over which you preside, and I am glad to see that while so great a part still remains undeveloped, timely steps are being taken to provide the improved means of access which the general increase of building and of traffic in your own districts will demand.

Through your districts pass the great highways leading to the West country—the Bath and Basingstoke Roads; and the obstruction caused by the narrowness of the Brentford High Street has been a source of complaint since the distant days when coaches afforded the principal means of travel. Owing to the advent of motor traffic, this inconvenience has, during the present century, become acute, and all those whose business or pleasure lies on the road will welcome the opening of this new highway, which will enable west-bound traffic to avoid congested areas, and enjoy an open course through pleasant surroundings.

You will doubtless take care that everything possible is done to safe-guard your respective local amenities, remembering that those who enter the Metropolis form their first impressions of London from the design and appearance of the outskirts and suburbs. In your hands lies the moulding of the future. To you is committed the all-important task of determining the lines upon which development shall proceed, and I am well aware that you will not look in vain for assistance to the Middlesex County Council, whose enlightened policy in regard to the acquisition of open spaces is well known.

The influence of Local Authorities upon the health and happiness of the population is an ever-growing one, and the demands made upon the time of members and officials increase correspondingly. The work calls for gifts of a high order, and I am proud to meet those who devote themselves so unsparingly to the public cause.

I feel confident that this great highway will serve as an inspiration to you and your successors, and that the growth of your districts will continue to be wisely controlled with the same far-sighted spirit that has brought into being the New Great West Road.

##### UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE.

##### INSURANCE YEAR REGULATIONS, 1925.

The Unemployment Insurance (Insurance Year) Regulations, 1925, dated May 8, 1925, made by the Minister of Labour under the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. 5, c. 30).

The Minister of Labour, by virtue of the powers conferred on him by Sections 35 and 47 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations :—

1. The period commencing on the 6th day of July, 1925, (being the day next after the last day of the preceding Insurance Year) and ending on the 4th day of July, 1926, shall be an Insurance Year.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Insurance Year) Regulations, 1925, and shall come into force on the date hereof.

## TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

FLAX AND HEMP TRADE BOARD  
(GREAT BRITAIN).

The Flax and Hemp Trade Board (Great Britain) issued on 3rd June, 1925, a Notice F.H. (23) setting out General Minimum Piece Rates (as varied) and Overtime Rates (as varied) for Male Weavers employed on weaving canvas, which are effective under an Order of the Minister of Labour as from 8th June, 1925. Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 14th June, 1925.

**PROVISIONAL RULES AND ORDERS.  
LONDON TRAFFIC.**

**RESTRICTED STREETS.**

London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Provisional Regulations, 1925, dated the third day of June, 1925, made by the Minister of Transport under the London Traffic Act, 1924. (14 & 15 Geo. 5. c. 34).

Whereas by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Order, 1925, (S.R. & O. 1925 No. ) the Minister of Transport declared certain streets within the London Traffic Area to be and the same are hereinafter referred to as "restricted streets."

Now therefore the Minister of Transport hereby certifies under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, (56 and 57 Vic. c. 66), that on account of urgency these Regulations should come into immediate operation and under and in pursuance of the powers given to him under Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and without any prejudice to any further exercise of the said powers hereby makes the following regulations to come into operation forthwith as Provisional Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Provisional Regulations, 1925."

2. Subject as in these Regulations provided, it shall not be lawful for any person to use or allow to be used at any time upon a week-day in any restricted street or part thereof for the purpose of plying for hire along that street or part thereof any greater number of omnibuses than might, under and in accordance with section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and

the Schedule or Schedules deposited by him under that Section with the licencing authority and in force on the third day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, have been used by him at that time on that week-day in that street or part thereof for the purpose of maintaining along that street or part thereof the regular service or services which were shown in such Schedule or Schedules.

3. The restrictions and limitations imposed by the foregoing Regulation shall be subject to the following modifications and exceptions:—

(a) The provisions of Regulation 2 hereof shall not apply on Good Friday, the day following Good Friday, Bank Holidays and days appointed by Proclamation to be Bank Holidays;

(b) On Saturdays, from and after 12 o'clock noon, the number of omnibuses which it shall be lawful under Regulation 2 hereof for any person to use for the purpose of plying for hire along any restricted street or part of a restricted street shall be increased by 10 per cent.

4. The Minister of Transport may, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee, by notice published in the London Gazette, dispense with or relax on any occasion the restrictions imposed by these Regulations, either generally or in the case of particular streets or parts thereof.

**LONDON TRAFFIC.**

**RESTRICTED STREETS.**

The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Order, 1925, dated June 3rd, 1925, made by the Minister of Transport under the London Traffic Act, 1924, (14 & 15 Geo. 5. c. 34).

The Minister of Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Order, 1925."

2. The streets specified in the Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be restricted streets within the meaning of subsection (1) of Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, that is to say, streets in which the plying for hire by omnibuses ought to be prohibited or restricted either generally or during particular hours.

3. Subject to any variations or amendments which may be made by any further Order this Order shall remain in force until revoked by the Minister of Transport.

### ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 9TH JUNE, 1925.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

#### *Application of Part I of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920.*

1.—(1) Part I. (*Restriction of Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "The Principal Order," is hereby applied to the area described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall be a Movement Area for the purposes of that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, and shall cease to operate on the thirtieth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

*Application of Part II of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, subject to certain Modifications.*

2. Part II. (*Double Dipping of Sheep in a Double Dipping Area*) of the Principal Order is hereby applied, subject to the modification hereinafter appearing, to the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto, which shall comprise a Double Dipping Area for the purposes of that Order.

*Period Prescribed as Double Dipping Period.*

3.—(1) The dates between which all sheep on lands in the Double Dipping Area described in the Second Schedule hereto are to be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II of the Principal Order are hereby fixed to be the twenty-eighth day of July, and the thirtieth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

(2) Each dipping shall be carried out on such date, at such dipping place, and in such manner as shall be required by a notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District wherein the sheep are, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the notice.

(3) Each dipping shall, where practicable, take place on lands to which this Article applies, but where the dipping on such lands is not practicable, the notice may require the dipping to be carried out on other premises specified in the notice, and may impose any conditions as to movement, detention, isolation and dipping of the sheep which the Inspector may consider desirable and specify in the notice.

*Movement of Sheep out of Scheduled Areas for purposes of Double Dipping.*

4.—(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in the provisions of Parts I and II of the Principal Order, sheep situate within that part of the county of Hereford which is comprised within the Movement or Double Dipping Areas described in the First and Second Schedules hereto, may be moved to premises outside those Areas for the express purpose of complying with the requirements of Articles 2 and 3 of this Order as to double dipping.

(2) Any sheep so moved shall be accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are when the licence is granted, but a licence shall not be granted unless and until the Inspector has satisfied himself that reasonable facilities for double dipping the sheep do not exist within the Dipping Area. Such licence shall be marked by the Inspector granting the same "For Dipping Purposes."

(3) The sheep referred to in the licence may, after the first dipping, be moved back to the place from which the sheep were originally moved, and for the purposes of the second dipping may be again moved out of the Movement Area or Double Dipping Area after the expiration of not less than seven clear days from the first dipping, under the authority of

the same licence. After the completion of the second dipping the sheep shall be moved back to the place from which the sheep were originally moved. It shall be a condition of the licence that the sheep shall on each occasion after arriving at the specified destination at which they are to be dipped be kept separate from all other sheep.

(4) Sheep while being moved under the authority of a licence granted under this Article shall so far as is practicable be kept separate from all other sheep, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere.

*Application of Provisions of Articles 2 and 3 to certain premises.*

5.—(1) The provisions of Articles 2 and 3 of this Order, requiring the double dipping of all sheep in the Double Dipping Area, shall apply to any farm or holding to which sheep are moved with a licence under the preceding Article and also to any lands in the neighbourhood of the Double Dipping Area to which they may be applied by a notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority and served upon the occupier of the lands described in such notice, and shall cease to apply to any such lands upon service on the occupier thereof of a notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Ministry.

(2) A copy of every notice served under this Article by an Inspector of the Local Authority shall forthwith be sent to the Ministry by the Inspector signing the same.

*Offences.*

6. If any sheep be moved, or anything is done or omitted to be done, in contravention of this Order or any Notice served or the conditions of any licence granted thereunder, or with intent to evade or defeat the operation of this Order or any Notice served or the conditions of any licence granted thereunder, the owner and the person for the time being in charge of the sheep and the occupier of the premises in respect of which the same is done or omitted to be done shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
