TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 19th June, 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £40,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £4,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

The Jute Trade Board (Great Britain) issued on 6th June, 1925, a Notice J. Under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon the Clearing Office and the Administrator by Article 1 (xiv) of the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1920-23, I hereby prescribe the 23rd day of June, 1925, as the final date by which:—

(b) Claims by British nationals against the Austrian Government with the payment of which the property rights and interests within His Majesty's Dominions or Protectorates belonging to nationals of the former Austrian Empire at the date when the said Treaty came into force (not being property rights or interests acquired under any general licence issued by or on behalf of His Majesty) and the net proceeds of their sale, liquidation or other dealings therewith are charged by Article 1 (ix) of the above mentioned Orders in Council

must be made upon the prescribed Forms and lodged with this Department, in order to rank for payment of the fifth dividend to be declared by me out of the funds in my hands arising from the liquidation of the above mentioned property rights and interests belonging to

nationals of the former Austrian Empire, or received by me from the Austrian Clearing Office, under paragraph 11 of the Annex to Article 248 of the above mentioned Treaty, in pursuance of the Note of His Majesty's Government to the Austrian Government of the 27th August, 1920, published in the London Gazette of the 15th October, 1920 (No. 32,086), or arising out of any other available property.

ORDER DEFINING THE EMPLOYMENT
TO BE TREATED AS OVERTIME
EMPLOYMENT.

The Sussex Agricultural Wages Committee in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Agricultural Wages Committees Regulations, 1924, do by this Order define the undermentioned employment as the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment for the purpose of the application of any differential rate of wages for overtime fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of East Sussex and West Sussex which for the pur-

poses of the said Act shall be deemed to include the county boroughs of Brighton, Eastbourne and Hastings:—

1. (a) In the case of all workers, all employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday, or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed upon between the employer and the worker.

(b) In the case of male workers of 21 years of age and over employed wholly or mainly as horsemen, cowmen, stockmen or shepherds, all employment in excess of 58 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment).

(c) In the case of all male workers (other than those specified in 1 (b) above) and of all female workers:—

(i) All employment on a Sunday.

(ii) All employment in excess of 52 hours in any week (excluding hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in Summer.

(iii) All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in Winter.

2. For the purpose of this Order employment in Summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and ending on the last Sunday in October, and employment in Winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 15th June, 1925.

The Devonshire Agricultural Wages Committee in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Agricultural Wages Committees Regulations, 1924, do by this Order vary their Order of the 25th March, 1925, defining the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment for the purpose of the application of any differential rate of wages for overtime fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Devon which for the purposes of the said Act shall be deemed to include the city and county borough of Exeter, and the county borough of

Plymouth, and hereby order that such employment shall be as follows:—

(a) All employment in excess of 6 hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and worker.

(b) All employment on a Sunday.

(c) All employment in excess of 52 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) during the period from 16th June, 1925, to 30th September, 1925.

(d) All employment in excess of 50 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) during the period from 1st October, 1925, to 25th March, 1926.

This Order shall come into operation on the 16th June, 1925, and continue in force until 25th March, 1926.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 9TH JUNE, 1925.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Authorisation of Landing of Sheep for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of sheep described in the First Schedule hereto which are intended for exhibition is hereby allowed subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of the sheep under this Order.

Regulations Applicable to Animals on Landing.

3.—(1) The sheep, before being landed, shall be examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and if found by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease, shall forthwith be landed and moved under the supervision of the Inspector, from the place of landing to the Foreign Animals

Quarantine Station described in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) The animals shall be detained in the said Quarantine Station until the expiration of a period of twenty-eight days after their arrival therein.

(3) Whilst detained in the said Quarantine Station the animals shall be under the control of a Veterinary Inspector appointed by the Ministry.

(4) During such period of detention no other animals shall be moved into the said Quarantine Station, and the animals landed under this Order shall be kept separate from all other animals.

(5) During such period of detention the animals and the Foreign Animals Quarantine Station hereby defined shall be subject to such rules as may be prescribed by the Ministry for the purpose of preventing the spread of disease.

(6) In the event of foot-and-mouth disease, sheep-pox, or cattle plague being found to exist during the prescribed period of detention in any animal referred to in this Order, the Ministry shall cause to be slaughtered all the animals in the consignment, and in the event of any such disease being suspected to exist in any such animal, the Ministry may cause the slaughter of such of the animals as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of diagnosis. No compensation shall be payable by the Ministry in respect of any animal slaughtered under this Order.

Disinfection of Vessel, etc.

4. The vessel from which the animals are landed, and the fittings, dung, fodder, litter, and other things used for or about the animals, shall be disinfected or disposed of in accordance with such rules as may be prescribed by the Ministry.
