The following Address was presented to The KING on the 13th instant on the occasion of the inauguration by His Majesty of the New Reservoir constructed by the Metropolitan Water Board at Littleton, Middlesex.

METROPOLITAN WATER BOARD.

The Loyal and Dutiful Address of the Metropolitan Water Board, presented the 13th day of June, 1925.

The Metropolitan Water Board respectfully beg to express their gratitude for the gracious condescension of Your Majesty and Her Majesty The Queen in visiting the new Reservoir of the Board, constructed in the Valley of

the Ash, a tributary of the River Thames, in the picturesque parish of Littleton, in the County of Middlesex.

Your Majesties honoured the Board with a similar visit on the 15th day of March, 1913, when the reservoir in the parish of Chingford in the Lee Valley was inaugurated on the occasion of the Tercentenary of the New River, when the last and largest of the Board's reservoirs, constructed in the valley of the Lee, was put into service for augmenting the water supply to Your Majesties' Metropolis. The King George Reservoir and appurtenant works cost a sum amounting to £407,360 sterling; the present reservoir, with buildings, machinery, conduits, etc., will involve a capital outlay of a sum approaching £2,145,364. Authorised by the Metropolitan Water Board (New Works) Act, 1911, a tender for its construction was accepted in 1912. Owing to the Great War, the work had to be suspended from February, 1916 to July, 1919. Certain physical difficulties in the site being met with, additional lands and powers were acquired by the Metropolitan Water Board (Various Powers) Act, 1921. The new reservoir will have a capacity of 6,750 million gallons, or more than twice that of the King George Reservoir. Some idea of its magnitude may be gathered from the fact that its banks have a circuit of four miles, embracing 800 acres, and when filled could provide anchorage for a fleet of battleships. It is larger than all the other Thames Valley reservoirs put together and will hold enough water to supply the Capital's seven million inhabitants for a month, thus removing all anxiety on account of drought. The statutory duty placed upon the Board for supplying the Metropolis with water, by the Metropolis Water Act passed in the second year of the reign of Your Majesty's Royal Father, "To manage the supply of water within London and certain adjoining districts" has involved very large expenditure of public money and is always accompanied with great responsibilities and anxiety. The Board are encouraged in their labours by the knowledge that their administration and works are regarded by Your Majesty with sympathetic interest and support. The Board most humbly pray that your Majesties may long be spared to continue their beneficent interest in the many enterprises of the municipal authorities of the Kingdom for the comfort and welfare of Your Majesties' loyal subjects.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

It gives the Queen and myself great pleasure to inaugurate this vast new Reservoir which has been constructed in the peaceful village of Littleton.

Since the Metropolitan Water Board came into existence in 1903, there has been a steady growth in the works under your control. It is a remarkable indication of the increasing need for a copious supply of pure water to the Metropolis and adjacent parts that a new Reservoir, double the size of that at Chingford for which I performed a similar opening ceremony in 1913, should now be necessary.

The health and comfort of more than seven millions of my people depend very largely on the water supplies which you administer: and

it is most reassuring that no longer any anxiety exists lest their supplies be cut off by drought.

I fully realise the heavy responsibilities entailed in carrying out your statutory duties. The inhabitants of the area served by the Metropolitan Water Board do not require proof of the faithfulness shown in the discharge of these responsibilities, but an occasion like the present is a fitting reminder of the magnitude of your task.

You and all who, by labour of brain or of hand, have co-operated in the construction of this Reservoir, indeed deserve well of your fellow-citizens, and we congratulate you very heartily on this latest monument to your zeal in the service of the community.

The Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that with a view to altering the description of the button-making trade specified in the Appendix to his Special Order dated August 6th, 1924, he intends pursuant to the powers conferred upon him by Section I and Section II of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order altering the description of the button-making trade contained in the Appendix to his Special Order dated August 6th, 1924, in the manner shown in the Draft Special Order contained in the Appendix hereto.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

DRAFT SPECIAL ORDER MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTIONS 1 AND 2 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, ALTERING THE DESCRIPTION OF THE BUTTON MAKING TRADE CONTAINED IN THE APPENDIX TO THE MINISTER'S SPECIAL ORDER DATED AUGUST 6TH, 1924.

Whereas it is provided by Sub-section 4 of Section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that, if the Minister of Labour is of the opinion that it is desirable to alter or amend the description of any of the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, he may make a Special Order altering or amending the said Schedule accordingly;

And whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is desirable to alter the description of the trade specified in the Appendix to his Special Order dated August 6th, 1924;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour in pursuance of the powers in him vested as before cited does hereby make a Special Order that from and after the day of the following provisions shall have effect, that is to say:—

Article I.—The description of the trade specified in the said Appendix to the said Special Order dated August 6th, 1924, shall be altered by the substitution therefor of the description set out in the Appendix to this Order.

Article II.—This Order may be cited as the TRADE BOARDS (BUTTON MANUFACTURING) ORDER, 1925.

APPENDIX.

TRADE.

1. Subject to the provisions of this Appendix the following operations and processes shall constitute the Button Manufacturing Trade:—

- (a) All processes and operations in the making from any material other than precious metals and precious stones of

buttons, button-moulds, metal fancy buttons, button-headed studs, upholsterers' buttons or upholsterers' button-headed nails (excluding in all cases, except as hereinafter provided, the making of the shanks), or in the covering of button-moulds.

(b) All processes and operations in the making of the following articles when done in association with or in conjunction with the work specified in sub-paragraph (a) above:—

- (i) shanks;
- (ii) studs, links or parts thereof from any material other than metal;
- (iii) clasps, slides, ornaments and similar articles used on wearing apparel when such articles are made:—

(1) wholly or mainly from any material other than metal, and

(2) in a branch or department in which articles mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) are made or carded.

(c)—(i) the carding wherever carried on of any of the articles specified in sub-paragraph (a) above;

(ii) the carding of any of the articles specified in sub-paragraph (b) above except when done apart from any of the making which is included in the trade herein specified and from the carding of articles specified in sub-paragraph (a).

(d) The manufacture of metal small-wares as specified in paragraphs (1) to (6) of the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares) Order, 1924, when carried on in an establishment mainly engaged in any of the processes or operations mentioned above.

(e) All processes and operations in the (i) assembling or (ii) finishing of articles specified above when done in association with or in conjunction with any of the above-mentioned processes or operations.

(f) All processes and operations in the warehousing, packing, or despatching of any of the articles specified above when done in association with or in conjunction with any of the above-mentioned processes or operations.

2. Notwithstanding anything in this Appendix the following processes or operations shall not be processes or operations of the Button Manufacturing Trade:—

(a) The manufacture of wooden button-moulds where not carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making;

(b) The making of buttons or the covering of button-moulds in an establishment in which (i) such work is performed in association with or in conjunction with the making of wearing apparel and (ii) the majority of the buttons made or of the button-moulds covered are for use on such wearing apparel.

(c) The making of buttons or the covering of button-moulds when done in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of embroidery and trimmings, unless such making of buttons or covering of button-moulds is done (i) by machine process and (ii) in a separate department by workers exclusively engaged thereon.

(d) The processes or operations specified in paragraph 1 above when performed in an

establishment mainly engaged in the manufacture of articles of real or imitation jewellery except when performed by a worker who during the whole time that he works in any week in such establishment is wholly or mainly employed on such processes or operations.

(e) Any work which by paragraph 7 of the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares) Order, 1924, is included in the Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares trade.

DRAFT INSTRUCTIONAL CIRCULAR.

TRADE BOARDS (BUTTON MANUFACTURING) ORDER, 1925.

1. It has been represented to the Minister of Labour that it might prove of assistance to employers and workers and others concerned in the application of the Trade Boards Acts, 1909-1918, if, in suitable cases, when he makes an Order applying the Acts to a trade for the first time or when he makes an Order varying the existing description of a trade contained in an Order made under the said Acts, some information was given by a departmental Instructional Circular as to his understanding of the scope of the Order.

2. An authoritative interpretation of the Trade Boards Acts and/or of Orders made thereunder can only be given by the Courts of Law and on the understanding that any views which he may express provisionally as to the inclusion within, or exclusion from the scope of the Acts and/or Orders made thereunder of any trade, process, operation, articles or of any class of worker are given on the information at the time in his possession and are subject to revision in the light of further information, the Minister makes the observations which follow in paragraph 3 *et seq.* below for the guidance of all concerned in the application of the Trade Boards (Button Manufacturing) Order, dated 1925.

3. The Button Making trade was first defined for the purposes of the Trade Boards Acts in the Appendix to the Minister's Special Order dated 20th October, 1919.

Following upon the revision of the Definition of the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares trade, it was found necessary to make a slight consequential amendment in the Definition of the Button Making trade, the object of this amendment and of the revised Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares definition being to avoid the original position whereby certain establishments manufacturing both buttons and other stamped or pressed articles might be affected by the Orders of both Boards. This amendment was effected by the Minister's Special Order dated 6th August, 1924, and the position now is that the Board under which such establishments fall is henceforward determined according as they are mainly engaged in one or the other trade.

4. By the Minister's third Order dated 1925, the Definition contained in the previous Order is varied by the substitution thereof of the description set out in the Appendix. Generally, the effect of the new definition is to remove doubts which have arisen in the past with respect to the position

under the Trade Boards Acts of workers engaged in the manufacture of articles or employed on processes or operations which were not expressly enumerated in the old Orders, and to draw a clearer line of demarcation between the scope of the Button Manufacturing and of overlapping trades. It does not bring within the scope of the Acts any considerable body of workers which was clearly not previously covered by the Order.

5. The general plan of the Order is as follows. The paragraph 1 (a) brings under the scope of the Board the processes of operations which are normally regarded as constituting button-making. Paragraph 1 (b) brings within the Board's scope the making of shanks for buttons and of studs, links or parts thereof from any material other than metal when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of buttons, and also the making of non-metal clasps, slides, etc., for use on wearing apparel when made in a branch or department making or carding the buttons and other articles specified in paragraph 1 (a). By the paragraphs 1 (c), 1 (e) and 1 (f) are included processes or operations subsequent to the actual forming of the button, such as, assembling, finishing, carding, warehousing, packing, etc. Paragraph 1 (d) determines the position when buttons and other stamped or pressed articles ("metal small-wares") not otherwise under the Button Manufacturing Board are made in the same establishment. The paragraph 2 relates to operations and processes which, for the purposes of the present Order, are not regarded as forming a part of the Button Manufacturing trade. It will be seen that in the circumstances described in sub-paragraphs (a) to (c), the manufacture of wooden button-moulds and the manufacture of buttons, and the covering of moulds when carried on in association with or in conjunction with other trades are excluded from the scope of the Board, as is also, under sub-paragraphs (d) and (e), the manufacture of buttons, etc., when carried on in an establishment mainly engaged in the manufacture of articles known in the trade as real or imitation jewellery (unless in this case the work is done by a worker mainly so employed in any week), or in an establishment mainly engaged in the manufacture of the metal small-wares which are within the scope of the Stamped or Pressed Metal-Wares Order, 1924.

6. The following illustrations, which must not be taken as exhaustive, are given of the terms employed in the Minister's Order:—

(a) *In paragraph 1 (a) of the Definition*, which enumerates the normal products of the trade, no specification is given of either materials or processes, as it is felt that a detailed enumeration is undesirable in a trade which is liable to frequent innovations in regard to materials and processes. Similarly, in the sub-paragraphs of the Definition relating to assembling or finishing (para. 1 (e)) and warehousing, packing, etc. (para. 1 (f)), no detailed enumeration is attempted. The Minister understands, however, that the following are the principal operations (in alphabetical order) incidental to the button manufacturing trade:—

Annealing, backing, barrelling, beading, blanking, bleaching, boring, bottoming,

boxing, brazing, bronzing, buffing, burnishing, carding, carrying, clipping, closing, colouring, counter-sinking, counting, covering moulds, crocheting, cutting, dipping, despatching, drilling, dyeing, enamelling, fancying, filling moulds, grinding, hardening, inlaying, inspecting, japanning, labelling, lacquering, lining, nickelling, packing, packing, painting, piercing, plaiting or tying, planishing, plating, polishing, portering (indoor), pressing, rivetting, sawing, scouring, sewing, shanking, shearing, soldering, sorting, spinning, staining, stamping, sticking, storekeeping, stringing, testing, turning, trimming, undercutting, varnishing, viewing, warehousing, weighing.

All of these processes, whether carried on by hand or by machinery, are intended to be comprised in the definition but any other operations would also be covered, provided that they could be considered to be operations in the manufacture of the buttons and other articles enumerated in paragraph 1.

(b) *Paragraph 1 (b) of the Definition.*—Shanks, studs, links or parts thereof, clasps, slides, ornaments, etc. The object of this paragraph is to facilitate the administration of the Order by including within the scope of the button manufacturing trade certain processes and operations which have been found in practice to be commonly carried on in association with the main operations of that trade. It is now provided that where the processes and operations in question are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of buttons, the provisions of the present Order shall apply to such work. In the case of non-metal clasps etc., for use on wearing apparel, having regard to the circumstances of their manufacture, it is provided that such work would only be within the scope of the Order where carried on in a branch or department making or carding the buttons and other articles mentioned in paragraph 1 (a). The term "wearing apparel" means in this connection all articles of clothing, including headgear and footwear.

(c) *Paragraph 1 (e) of the Definition.*—(Assembling or finishing processes or operations).

(See note under (a).)

(d) *Paragraph 1 (c) of the Definition.*—Carding operations. This paragraph refers to two types of carding: First, the carding of the normal products of button manufacturing establishments; and second, the carding of other articles made in such establishments. The Order includes within its scope—

(1) the carding, *wherever carried on*, of the normal products of the trade, that is, the buttons and other articles enumerated in para. 1 (a) of the definition. The carding in Great Britain of buttons imported from abroad would thus be included;

(2) the carding of shanks, studs, links or parts thereof, clasps, slides, etc., that is the carding of the articles enumerated in para. 1 (b) of the definition, *when they have been manufactured in association with or in conjunction with buttons or*

*other articles forming the normal product of the trade.**

Thus the carding of studs, clasps, etc., when done by outworkers engaged in carding these articles as well as buttons is brought within the scope of the Order.

By way of exception to this general rule, it is further provided that, although the studs, clasps, etc., may have been made in button manufacturing establishments, the carding of these articles is not to be regarded as work within scope if carried on apart from such manufacture and apart from the carding of the normal products of the trade.

If, therefore, an establishment were engaged in carding studs which had been imported from abroad and studs which had been made in button manufacturing establishments, none of the carding operations would be within the scope of the Order. If, however, the studs were carded with buttons, wherever the latter had been made, all the carding would be within scope.

(e) Paragraph 1 (f). Warehousing, packing and despatching.

(See note under (a).)

(f) Paragraphs 1 (d) and 2 (e). The aim of these two paragraphs is to avoid the inconvenience which might be caused by the operation of both the Button Making Trade Board and the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade Board in the same establishment. The work of any such establishment is now placed either under the Button Making Board or the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Board according to which type of work constitutes the main business of the firm.

(g) Paragraph 2 (a) of the Definition.—The object of this paragraph is to exclude the manufacture of wooden button moulds, e.g., by wood turning firms who manufacture no buttons. It will be noted that the manufacture of other button moulds is included within the scope of the Board under paragraph 1 (a).

(h) Paragraph 2 (b) of the Definition.—Agreement has been reached between the Button Making Trade Board and the various clothing Trade Boards that the most satisfactory way of dealing with workers employed in clothing firms on the making of buttons or covering of button moulds is to place such workers under either the Button Making Trade Board or the Clothing Trade Board concerned, according as the majority of the buttons they make are for sale as buttons or are for use on the clothing manufactured by the firm in question. This agreement has been carried out in the Definition.

(i) Paragraph 2 (c) of the Definition.—It has been ascertained that a very small amount of button making, *principally by hand processes*, may be done by workers who are mainly employed in the making of embroidery or trimmings. This work is

excluded from the scope of the Order. On the other hand, if any workers in a firm making embroidery or trimmings are exclusively employed in a separate department on making buttons *by machine processes*, they are within the scope of the Button Making Board.

(j) Paragraph 2 (d) of the Definition.—object of this paragraph is to exclude the manufacture of buttons in jewellery establishments, unless they are made by a worker who is wholly or mainly engaged on the making of buttons throughout a working week. In that event, the work done by the worker for each such week is within the scope of the Order.

PROVISIONAL RULES AND ORDERS.**LONDON TRAFFIC.****RESTRICTED STREETS.**

The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Amendment Regulations, 1925, dated the seventeenth day of June, 1925, made by the Minister of Transport under the London Traffic Act, 1924 (14 and 15 Geo. 5, c. 34).

Whereas by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1925 (S.R. & O. 1925, No. 322) the Minister of Transport made Regulations restricting the plying for hire by omnibuses in certain streets declared to be

restricted streets by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1925 (S.R. & O. 1925, No. 179).

And whereas by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Provisional Regulations, 1925, dated the 3rd June, 1925, the Minister of Transport made Regulations restricting the plying for hire by omnibuses in certain other streets declared to be restricted streets by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Order, 1925 (S.R. & O. 1925, No. 549).

Now therefore the Minister of Transport hereby certifies under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893 (56 & 57 Vic., c. 66) that on account of urgency these Regulations should come into immediate operation and under and in pursuance of the powers given to him under Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and without any prejudice to any further exercise of the said powers hereby makes the following regulations to come into operation forthwith as Provisional Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Amendment Regulations, 1925."

2. The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1925, shall have effect as if—

(a) In Regulations 2 and 3 (c) the words "first day of January" wherever they occur were omitted and the words "seventeenth day of February" were inserted in substitution therefor;

(b) In Regulation 3, paragraph (d) were omitted and the following paragraph were inserted in substitution therefor;

(d) On week-days, from Mondays to Fridays inclusive, any person maintaining a regular service in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, upon a route shown in the first column of the Third Schedule of these Regulations may if such excess is due solely to the use of omnibuses by him for the purpose of maintaining such regular service on such route use in any of the restricted streets or parts thereof shown opposite to such route in the second column of the said Schedule a number of omnibuses exceeding the number of omnibuses which he may use in that street or part thereof under Regulation 2 hereof, by not more than 100 per cent. of the number of omnibuses which might, under and in accordance with the said Section 6 and the Schedule or Schedules deposited by him and in force on the seventeenth day of February, 1925, have been used by him for the purpose of maintaining along that restricted street or part thereof the regular service or services which were shown in such Schedule or Schedules.

(c) There were added to the said Regulations the following Schedule:—

THIRD SCHEDULE.

3. The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Provisional Regulations, 1925, dated the 3rd day of June, 1925, shall have effect as if there were added to Regulation 3 at the end thereof, the following paragraph:—

(c) Where under and in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, any person deposited a schedule or schedules, which remained in force on the 17th day of February, 1925, and, solely in consequence of the Regulations made under Section 7 of the said Act by the Minister of Transport with regard to the streets declared to be restricted streets by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1925, (S. R. & O. No. 179), such person amended or withdrew such schedules or schedules (hereinafter called "his schedules of the 17th February"), he may on or before the thirtieth day of June, 1925, give notice in writing to the Minister of Transport of his desire that the use by him of omnibuses in restricted streets shall be limited by reference to his schedule or schedules of the 17th February, and not by reference to the schedule or schedules deposited by him and in force on the 3rd day of June, 1925 (hereinafter called "his schedules of 3rd June"), and thereupon these Regulations shall in their application to him have effect as though the references therein to his schedules of the 3rd June were references to his schedules of the 17th February.

4. Nothing in these Regulations shall—

(a) affect the operation prior to the date of these Regulations of the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1925, and the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Provisional Regulations dated the 3rd June, 1925, or anything done or suffered under those Regulations, or

(b) affect any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred under those Regulations, or

(c) affect any fine or punishment incurred in respect of a breach of those Regulations, or

(d) affect any legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, fine or punishment.

and any such legal proceeding or remedy may be instituted, continued or enforced, and any such fine or punishment may be imposed as if these Regulations had not been made.

2. Where a whole time worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are less than 54, the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been 54. This clause shall not apply where the worker has agreed with the employer to take time off without pay.

3. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

ORDER MADE BY THE STAFFORDSHIRE AGRICULTURAL WAGES COMMITTEE VARYING THEIR ORDER OF THE 23RD JANUARY, 1925, DEFINING THE BENEFITS OR ADVANTAGES WHICH ARE TO BE RECKONED AS PAYMENT OF WAGES IN LIEU OF PAYMENT IN CASH.

The Staffordshire Agricultural Wages Committee in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Agricultural Wages Committees Regulations, 1924, do by this Order vary their Order of the 23rd January, 1925, defining the benefits or advantages (not being benefits or advantages prohibited by law) which may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash for the purpose of the application of any minimum rate of wages fixed by the said Committee in the area comprising the administrative county of Stafford which for the purposes of the said Act shall be deemed to include the county boroughs of Burton-upon-Trent, Dudley, Smethwick, Stoke-on-Trent, Walsall, West Bromwich and Wolverhampton, and hereby order that such benefits or advantages and the values at which they are to be so reckoned shall be as follows:—

1. *Benefits or Advantages.*

(a) *Lodging*, except in any case in which the Wages Committee shall have determined that the lodging accommodation provided is so defective as to be injurious to health.

(b) *Board*, including any meals but not including intoxicating drink.

(c) *Cottage*, including any garden provided with the cottage, except where the cottage is one in regard to which the Medical Officer of Health has reported that it is in a state so dangerous or injurious to health as to be unfit for human habitation.

ROTHERHAM CORPORATION ACT, 1921.

PROPOSED EXTENSION OF MOTOR OMNIBUS ROUTES.

No. 6.—Frederick street, Rotherham to the Borough Boundary at Thorpe Hesley.

Byelaws and Regulations above referred to:—

COUNTY BOROUGH OF GRIMSBY.

Byelaws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Grimsby, acting by the Council under the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Grimsby Corporation Act, 1921.

1. Throughout these Byelaws and Regulations the following words shall have the meaning respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

"Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County

Borough of Grimsby, and shall include any Lessees or other person or Company for the time being working or running over the Tramway or working the Trolley Vehicles hereinafter referred to.

"Tramways" means the Tramway System now or at any time hereafter owned or leased by the Corporation within the Borough.

"Trolley Vehicles" means Trolley Vehicles propelled by mechanical power which may at any time hereafter be owned or worked by the Corporation within the Borough.

"Car" means any carriage or car run by the Corporation upon the Tramways or any Trolley Vehicle for the conveyance of passengers.

"Conductor" means any servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car.

The expression "interior of a car" shall not include the upper deck of covered cars.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a car by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise. When a car stops, no person shall board the car until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

3. No person shall enter, or mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any car in motion.

4. No passenger shall smoke in the interior of any car, and no person shall spit in, on, from, or against any car.

5. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any car, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

6. A person in a state of intoxication shall not enter or mount upon any car, and if found in or upon any car shall leave the car immediately on being requested to do so by the conductor.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any car, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

8. No person shall commit any nuisance in, on, or against any car, tramway or trolley vehicle station, waiting room, or premises used in connection with the Corporation's tramways or trolley vehicles.

9. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the car, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Byelaws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

10. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not mount, enter, or remain on or in any car, and may be prevented from so doing, and, if found on or in any car, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the same upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned: Provided that on cars specially run for artisans,

mechanics and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a car under the provisions of this Byelaw, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

11. Each passenger shall, on demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

12. Each passenger shall show his Ticket (if any), when required so to do, to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his Ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

13. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Corporation, shall not use or attempt to use any Ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

14. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not elsewhere.

15. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation shall travel on the steps or platforms of any car, or stand on the upper deck, or sit or stand on the railings, guards or buffers of any car, and any person so travelling, standing or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

16. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any car.

17. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any car, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of the car with the consent of the conductor.

18. On occasions when six or more persons, being intended passengers, are waiting at any stopping place or terminus to enter a car, they shall form up in line or queue, and enter the car in the order in which they stand, and no person shall take or endeavour to take a place in such line or queue when formed, out of proper order, or shall enter or endeavour to enter a car out of the order in which he stood in such line or queue.

19. When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such car when warned by the conductor not to do so.

20. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the con-

veyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

21. No person shall travel in or on any car of the Corporation with loaded fire-arms.

22. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway of the Corporation, and no person other than the conductor or driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord or any other part of a car or its equipment.

23. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car, the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged car.

24. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any car, any breach of these Byelaws and Regulations, shall, if the offence is continued, be liable in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

25. The conductor shall enforce these Byelaws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof to the best of his ability.

26. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Byelaws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings.

27. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside each car in use a printed copy of these Byelaws and Regulations.

28. These Byelaws and Regulations shall come into force on the First Day of August, 1925.
