UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONVOCATION ON TUESDAY, May 12, 1925.

(1) Whereas it is expedient to provide that the Proctors should be members of the Visitatorial Board:

Now the University, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and of any other power enabling it, hereby enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:—

In Statt. Tit. XXI. Sect. II. cl. 1 (Statuta, ed. 1924, p. 406), after the words "The Vice-Chancellor" shall be inserted the words "and Proctors".
