WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 11th day of June, 1925 (N.P. (1) 1725/25), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is

enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, or to the Widow or relative of a deceased Officer, Seaman or Marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Section 2 of the Officers of Royal Naval Reserve Act, 1863, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty may enrol Officers of the Reserves to the Royal Navy under, and subject to, such Rules, Orders and Regulations as the Admiralty may, with the consent of Your Majesty in Council, from time to time establish:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 8th day of December, 1924, to sanction certain Regulations regarding the increase of pensions to certain pensioners therein specified under conditions corresponding generally to those laid down in the Pensions (Increase) Acts, 1920 and 1924:

"And whereas we have been advised that the Regulation laid down in Clause 2 (b) of the Schedule to Your Majesty's Order aforesaid respecting Naval Pensioners in receipt of more than one pension is more stringent than are the corresponding provisions of the Pensions (Increase) Acts, 1920 and 1924:

"And whereas we are of opinion that Naval pensioners in receipt of more than one pension should not be at a disadvantage as compared with the Civil Pensioners in receipt of more than one pension:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to cancel Clause 2 (b) of the Regulations appearing in Your Order aforesaid and to direct that those Regulations shall be read as though that Clause had never appeared therein.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of *June*, 1925 (C.W./G.H. 25187/25), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty may (subject to the ap-

proval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of Officers appointed for the service of Greenwich Hospital:

"And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is further enacted that the provisions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind:

"And whereas Mr. William Harold Dimsdale, Commissioned Gunner on the Retired List of Your Majesty's Fleet, has performed the duties of Chief Officer of the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, for over eight years, and has resigned his appointment owing to impaired health, his resignation having effect from the 1st day of *June*, 1925:

"And whereas this Officer is ineligible by service under the regulations for advancement on the Retired List on vacating the above-mentioned appointment, and the appointment does not confer any claim to pension or gratuity:

"And whereas we are of opinion that his meritorious service under the Department of Greenwich Hospital is deserving of special recognition:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the advancement of the said Mr. William Harold Dimsdale to the rank of Lieutenant on the Retired List of Your Majesty's Fleet, as from the 1st day of *June*, 1925, and the payment to him of a gratuity of £75 from the funds of Greenwich Hospital.

"Provided that such advancement on the Retired List shall be regarded as entirely of an honorary nature and shall not confer any title to increased benefits from Naval Funds either on him or his dependants."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Military Manœuvres Acts, 1897 and 1911, it is enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, authorize the execution of military manœuvres within specified limits during a specified period not exceeding three months:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by virtue of the power for this purpose given to His Majesty by the said Act, and of every other power hereunto enabling, His Majesty doth hereby authorize the execution of military manœuvres within the limits specified in the Schedule to this Order during the period of three calendar months, commencing from the 15th day of *July*, 1925.

And the Right Honourable the Principal Secretary of State for the War Department is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SCHEDULE.

All that area of land comprising portions of the counties of Wilts, Berks, Surrey, Sussex, Southampton and Dorset lying within a line drawn as follows, including, where any road is named as a boundary, the said road:—

On the North, from the point at Semington in the County of Wilts where the road from Melksham to Westbury crosses the main road from Trowbridge to Devizes, eastwards along the last named road to Devizes; and thence north eastwards along the road from Devizes to Avebury to the point at Beckhampton where that road crosses the main road from Calne to Marlborough; thence eastwards along the last named road through Marlborough and Hungerford to Reading:

On the East, from the point at Reading where the main road from Reading to Wokingham branches off from the main road to London, along the former road to Wokingham, and thence along the main road to Farnham, through Sandhurst and Frimley; thence along the main road from Farnham to Chichester:

On the South, from Chichester along the main road to Fareham, and thence along the main road through Wickham and Botley to Romsey; thence southwards along the main road towards Ringwood to the point near Ower where that road is joined by the main road from Salisbury; thence along the main road towards Salisbury to Landford; thence along a portion of the northern boundary of the New Forest (but not including any portion of the area of the said Forest) to the point about one and three quarter miles east of Fordingbridge where the said boundary crosses the main road from Southampton to Fordingbridge; thence along the said main road through Fordingbridge and Cranborne to Wimborne Minster; thence along the main road north of the River Stour to Blandford Forum:

On the West, from Blandford Forum along the main road to Trowbridge through Shaftesbury, Warminster and Westbury to the point south of Trowbridge where the said road meets the main road from Melksham; thence along the last named road to Semington:

Which area, surrounded on all sides by a red line is delineated on a map, signed by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, copies of which are deposited in the War Office and the Privy Council Office.

WHEREAS by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, Commissioners are constituted styled the University of Cambridge Commissioners.

And whereas it is further enacted in the Act aforesaid that "the powers of the Commis-

sioners shall continue in force until the end of the year nineteen hundred and twenty-five and no longer: Provided that His Majesty in Council may, on the application of the Commissioners, continue their powers for such further period as His Majesty may think fit, but not beyond the end of the year nineteen hundred and twenty-seven":

And whereas the University of Cambridge Commissioners have made application to His Majesty in Council for the continuation of their powers under the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered that the powers of the University of Cambridge Commissioners shall continue until the end of the year nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

WHEREAS by Section 80 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, power is given to His Majesty by Order in Council to make Regulations with respect to the manner in which Government ships may be registered as British ships for the purpose of the Merchant Shipping Acts:

And whereas by the said Section it is provided that those Acts shall, subject to any exceptions and modifications which may be made by Order in Council, either generally or as respects any special class of Government ships, apply to Government ships registered in accordance with such Regulations as if they were registered in manner provided by those Acts:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act, or otherwise in Him vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following Regulations shall have effect as regards any Government ships in the service of the Government of the Colony of the Falkland Islands (hereinafter referred to as the Colonial Government):—

1. An application for registry of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government shall be made in writing under the hand of the Colonial Secretary of the Falkland Islands or other officer of the Colonial Government nominated by the Governor, or by one of the Crown Agents for the Colonies. Such application shall contain the following particulars:—

(i) A statement of the name and description of the ship.

(ii) A statement of the time when and place where the ship was built, or, if the ship was foreign built and the time and place of building are unknown, a statement to that effect and of her foreign name.

(iii) A statement of the nature of the title to the said ship, whether by original construction by or for the Colonial Government, or by purchase, capture, condemnation, or otherwise, and a list of the documents of title, if any, in case she was not originally constructed by or for the Colonial Government.

(iv) A statement of the name of the Master.

2. The Registrar, on receiving such application in respect of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government, shall—

(i) enter the ship in the Register Book as belonging to "His Majesty, represented by the Government of the Colony of the Falkland Islands" and shall also enter therein:

(ii) the name of the port to which she belongs:

(iii) the particulars stated in the application for registration:

(iv) the details comprised in the Surveyor's Certificate.

3. On the registry of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government the Registrar shall retain in his possession the Surveyor's Certificate and the application for registry and any documents of title mentioned in such application.

4. Upon the transfer of a registered Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government by Bill of Sale, the Colonial Government shall be the transferors, and the Bill of Sale shall be in Form A in the proper form prescribed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, hereinafter called the principal Act, omitting the covenant therein contained. Any such Bill of Sale shall be signed by the Colonial Secretary or other officer or Crown Agent as aforesaid on behalf of the Colonial Government.

5. The application for a Certificate of Sale referred to in Sections 39 to 42 and Sections 44 to 46 of the principal Act, may be made in respect of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government by the Colonial Secretary or other officer or Crown Agent as aforesaid on behalf of the Colonial Government.

6. The person to whom the management of any Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government is entrusted by the Colonial Government shall be registered as provided by Section 59 (2) of the principal Act.

7. Where any provision of the Merchant Shipping Acts which by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order in Council is applicable to Government ships in the service of the Colonial Government imposes any duty or liability or confers any right or power upon or contemplates any act being performed by the owner of a ship such duty, liability, right, or power shall, subject always to the other provisions of this Order in Council be carried out, borne, or exercised by the Colonial Government on behalf of His Majesty.

8. In this Order in Council the term Merchant Shipping Acts shall mean and include any of the Merchant Shipping Acts, any provision of which is by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order applicable to Government ships.

9. The following sections and provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts shall not apply

to Government ships in the service of the Colonial Government registered in pursuance of this Order, namely:—

(i) *The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894.*—Sections 1, 8 to 12, 427 to 431.

The provisions of Part II of the Act relating to the requirement of officers to hold certificates of competency and the production of those certificates.

(ii) *The Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898.*—Sections 3 and 5.

(iii) *The Merchant Shipping Act, 1906.*—Sections 25 and 27.

Provided always that no provision of the Merchant Shipping Acts which, according to a reasonable construction, would not apply in the case of Government ships in the service of the Colonial Government, shall be deemed to apply to such ships by reason only that its application is not hereby expressly excluded.

10. Anything required or authorised by this Order in Council to be done by the Colonial Government may be done by the Colonial Secretary or other officer or Crown Agent as aforesaid.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 30th day of April, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Wood Dalling, in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Wood Dalling is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in in the Master or Keeper and Fellows and Scholars of the College or Hall of the Holy Trinity commonly called Trinity Hall in the

University of Cambridge (hereinafter called 'the said Master, Fellows and Scholars'):

"And whereas the said Master, Fellows and Scholars are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Wood Dalling, now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Norwich for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Bertram, now Bishop of Norwich, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Wood Dalling which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will render the same Benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control, and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Wood Dalling:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Master, Fellows and Scholars (in testimony whereof they have affixed their Common or Corporate Seal to this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Wood Dalling, now vested in them the said Master, Fellows and Scholars as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of May, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometimes Particular District) of Saint Lawrence, Barton, and partly out of the Parish of Garstang, both in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Lawrence, Barton, and the said Parish of Garstang, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint Lawrence, Barton, and of the said Parish of Garstang, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas Sarah Jane Salisbury, late of Myerscough Hall, Preston, in the said County of Lancaster, Spinster, who died on the 20th day of September, 1922, by her Will dated the 5th day of February, 1919, bequeathed to her Trustees the residue of her estate upon trust to hold such residue and the income thereof and to apply the same during the period of 10 years from the date of her death (1) in or towards the provision of a Church in connection with the Established Church of England on a convenient site in the Townships of Myerscough or Bilborrow, and (2) in or towards the erection of a suitable Residence for the Minister of such Church or in or towards the endowment of the said Church in such shares and manner as her Trustees should think proper, and the said Sarah Jane Salisbury by her said Will directed her Trustees to take all necessary steps for vesting the Patronage of or right of presentation to the said proposed Church in the Vicar

for the time being of the Parish of Saint Michael's-on-Wyre, in the said County, and Diocese:

"And whereas Alan Chambre Dickson and Edmund Dickson, both of Number 17, Winckley Street, Preston, in the said County of Lancaster, Solicitors, and the Reverend Hugh Leycester Hornby, Vicar or Incumbent of the said Parish of Saint Michael's-on-Wyre, being the Trustees of the said Will, have appropriated a sum of not less than £10,000 towards the cost of providing a permanent Church in the Township of Bilsborrow and have also provided for the site thereof and have contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of £6,000 to be held in trust by us towards the endowment of the District hereinafter recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish under the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said New Parish and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being:

"And whereas we have in respect of the said sum of £6,000 agreed and undertaken to provide and pay by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in each and every year to the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed separate District or New Parish, so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, the sum of £270 per annum so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands:

"And whereas the said Alan Chambre Dickson, Edmund Dickson and Hugh Leycester Hornby (the Trustees of the said Will) as contributors of the said capital sum of £6,000 towards the endowment of the said proposed separate District have nominated to us the said Hugh Leycester Hornby, Vicar or Incumbent of the said Parish of Saint Michael's-on-Wyre, as the person to whom and to whose successors, Vicars or Incumbents of the said Parish of Saint Michael's-on-Wyre, they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed separate District shall be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Lawrence, Barton, and of the said Parish of Garstang, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Bilsborrow.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any

duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Hugh Leycester Hornby, as the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Parish of Saint Michael's-on-Wyre, and by his successors, Vicars or Incumbents of the said Parish of Saint Michael's-on-Wyre, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Bilsborrow comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish. The following Statute made by the University of Oxford Commissioners, on the 11th day of June, 1925, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923":—

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

In *Statt. Tit. II. Sect. II (Statuta, ed. 1924, p. 15)*, after clause 2 the following new clauses shall be inserted:—

"3. Except as hereinafter provided, no person shall be admitted to matriculation unless either (1) he has satisfied the Masters of the Schools in Responsions, or (2) he is statutorily qualified for exemption therefrom.

4. A Student of Music certified as such by the Professor of Music may be admitted to matriculation if he has passed the Preliminary Examination for Students of Music or is statutorily qualified for exemption therefrom.

5. Any person may be admitted to matriculation who has been accepted for admission as a Service Student, or an Indian Forest Service Student, or a Special Student, or an Affiliated, Colonial, Indian, or Foreign Senior or Junior Student, or who has been accepted for admission as a candidate for the Degree of B.C.L. under *Statt. Tit. VI. Sect. vi. § 1. cl. 2*, or as an Advanced Student, or as a candidate for the Degree of B.Litt. or of B.Sc., or who holds a Degree at another University, such Degree and such University having been approved by the Hebdomadal Council.

6. Any person may be admitted to matriculation who has been admitted to a Degree by Decree of Convocation, or who has obtained the permission of the Hebdomadal Council to supplicate for a Degree by Incorporation.

7. Any person may be admitted to matriculation to whom the Hebdomadal Council has granted exemption from Responsions as a Student of mature years recommended to it by the Delegates for Extra-mural Studies under the provisions of *Statt. Tit. VIII. Sect. III. § 1. cl. 15*.

8. For the purpose of dealing with exceptional cases there shall be a Committee which shall have the power in such cases to give dispensation from the requirements of clause 3 or clause 4.

Provided that no person who is required to pass or obtain statutable exemption from Responsions, or part thereof, as one of the conditions for any Degree shall be deemed to be

excused from this requirement in consequence of his having received a dispensation under this clause.

9. All applications for dispensations under clause 8 must be sent in to the Registrar of the University, for the Committee, through the Society to which the applicant belongs or intends to belong. The decision of the Committee in regard to any such application shall be final. All dispensations granted by the Committee shall be published in the usual manner.

10. Any person who has been given dispensation from the requirements of cl. 3 or cl. 4 only after he has come into residence shall be permitted to reckon as part of his statutory residence any period, not exceeding one Term, during which he has resided before his Matriculation within two and a half miles of Carfax under conditions approved by his Society.

11. The Committee shall consist of the Vice-Chancellor and Proctors, together with six members of Congregation, each of whom shall hold office for three years and be re-eligible. Of these six, three shall be appointed by Congregation, and three (of whom two at least shall be members of the Hebdomadal Council) by the Hebdomadal Council. One of the members to be appointed by Congregation, and one of the members to be appointed by the Hebdomadal Council, shall be appointed in Trinity Term of each year, and shall come into office on the first day of the succeeding Michaelmas Term.

12. The Committee shall make Regulations governing its action, subject to the approval of the Hebdomadal Council and of Convocation.

If any such Regulation is not approved by the Hebdomadal Council, and if after consultation between the Committee and the Council agreement is not reached, the Committee shall have power nevertheless to require the Council to submit the said Regulation to Convocation, provided that at least six members of the Committee concur in such requisition; and the Regulation, if approved by Convocation, shall thereupon take effect as though it had been approved by the Hebdomadal Council also."

A STATUTE for All Souls College, concerning the form of Accounts of the College and the Audit and Publication thereof: and concerning other matters.

1. The Warden and Fellows shall cause proper books of account to be kept, in which shall be entered:—

i. All receipts and payments on account of or authorised by the College, whether from and to persons being members of the College or from and to any other person whomsoever;

ii. All debts and liabilities contracted by or to the College or by or to any person on account or by authority of the College;

iii. A statement in detail of all property of every kind or description held by or in trust for the College.

2. The books shall include:—

(a) A register of all the property of the College, showing the description, situation, amount, rental or other annual value, of every property; the fixed charges on it (if any); and in the case of stocks or other securities the names in which and the accounts to which the same are standing;

(b) A roll of rents, rentcharges, dividends, and other annual income, showing the amounts receivable and those actually received during the year, and the arrears (if any) at the beginning and at the close of the account;

(c) A cash book or cash books containing a record of all cash transactions;

(d) A ledger or ledgers.

And also such other books as may be necessary or convenient for regularly recording all such receipts and payments and other matters and things as aforesaid, and for enabling the several accounts to be duly checked and balanced, and the correctness of the abstracts, for the publication of which provision is hereinafter made, to be ascertained and verified.

3. Separate accounts shall be kept of all property held in trust for any purpose other than the general purposes of the College, and of receipts and payments in respect of such property.

4. The College accounts shall be audited once at least in every year. The Warden and Fellows shall appoint for that purpose an Auditor or Auditors. One person so appointed shall be a professional Accountant carrying on business in London or Westminster. The Auditor or Auditors shall report in writing to the Warden and Fellows whether the accounts of the College are duly kept in proper books of account in conformity with the provisions of this Statute, and whether the Abstracts and Balance Sheets prepared pursuant to the provisions of this Statute contain a full and true account of the financial condition of the College. It shall be lawful for the Auditor or any Auditor to report specially as to any payment which they or he may judge to have been made without sufficient authority. The expense of the audit (including payment to any clerk or clerks whose assistance the Auditor

or Auditors may require) shall be paid out of the revenues of the College.

5. The Warden and Fellows shall in every year cause to be prepared and delivered to the Registrar of the University for publication such information relating to the accounts of the College as may be prescribed from time to time by any Statute of the University made or to be made under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923. The date on or before which such information shall be delivered to the Registrar, the forms of the statements in which it shall be shown, and the certificate accompanying such forms shall be as prescribed from time to time in any Statute of the University made or to be made under the like authority and the certificate shall be signed by the Auditor or Auditors aforesaid.

6. The Warden and Fellows shall, on or before a date prescribed as aforesaid, furnish to the Curators of the University Chest such information as may be required for determining the amount to be paid by the College to the Curators as a contribution for University purposes under any Statute of the University made or to be made under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923.

7. The Warden and Fellows shall keep kitchen accounts and other statistics relating to the catering arrangements of the College, submit them to Accountants and communicate the report of the said Accountants. The forms in which such accounts and statistics shall be kept, the periods at which they shall be submitted to the said Accountants, the manner in which the said Accountants shall be nominated and the cost of their inspection met, and the authorities to which the report of the said Accountants shall be communicated, shall be as prescribed from time to time in any Statutes of the University made or to be made under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923.

8. In Statute I (Constitution of the College) of the Statutes made by the College and approved on the twelfth day of December, 1924, by the University of Oxford Commissioners acting in pursuance of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, there shall be added immediately after the word "provided" the words following, that is to say "No woman shall become a member of the College."

This Statute is a Statute wholly for the College of All Souls within the meaning of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, Section 30, as set forth in the Schedule to the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923.

WE, the University of Oxford Commissioners, under and by virtue of all and every the powers in this behalf enabling us contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do by this present Instrument under our Seal make the Statute hereunto annexed for the College of All Souls, in the University of Oxford.
