

or Auditors may require) shall be paid out of the revenues of the College.

5. The Warden and Fellows shall in every year cause to be prepared and delivered to the Registrar of the University for publication such information relating to the accounts of the College as may be prescribed from time to time by any Statute of the University made or to be made under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923. The date on or before which such information shall be delivered to the Registrar, the forms of the statements in which it shall be shown, and the certificate accompanying such forms shall be as prescribed from time to time in any Statute of the University made or to be made under the like authority and the certificate shall be signed by the Auditor or Auditors aforesaid.

6. The Warden and Fellows shall, on or before a date prescribed as aforesaid, furnish to the Curators of the University Chest such information as may be required for determining the amount to be paid by the College to the Curators as a contribution for University purposes under any Statute of the University made or to be made under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923.

7. The Warden and Fellows shall keep kitchen accounts and other statistics relating to the catering arrangements of the College, submit them to Accountants and communicate the report of the said Accountants. The forms in which such accounts and statistics shall be kept, the periods at which they shall be submitted to the said Accountants, the manner in which the said Accountants shall be nominated and the cost of their inspection met, and the authorities to which the report of the said Accountants shall be communicated, shall be as prescribed from time to time in any Statutes of the University made or to be made under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923.

8. In Statute I (Constitution of the College), of the Statutes made by the College and approved on the twelfth day of December, 1924, by the University of Oxford Commissioners acting in pursuance of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, there shall be added immediately after the word "provided" the words following, that is to say "No woman shall become a member of the College."

This Statute is a Statute wholly for the College of All Souls within the meaning of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, Section 30, as set forth in the Schedule to the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923.

WE, the University of Oxford Commissioners, under and by virtue of all and every the powers in this behalf enabling us contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do by this present Instrument under our Seal make the Statute hereunto annexed for the College of All Souls, in the University of Oxford.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 3rd July, 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £40,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £4,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 6th July, 1925, to Saturday, the 11th July, 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates:
