PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of May, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Bishopstone and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Stratford Tony, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Bishopstone and Stratford Tony duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Salisbury and therein

recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Salisbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Bishopstone is now full, the Reverend Francis Raikes being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Stratford Tony is at present vacant:

“ And whereas the said Francis Raikes has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Bishopstone and the said Benefice of Stratford Tony shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Bishopstone with Stratford Tony ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme

shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said Francis Raikes if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bishopstone shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bishopstone shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stratford Tony and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated as follows, that is to say, (a) we shall first appropriate out of such net proceeds a sum not exceeding £25 towards the cost of repairs to the roof of the Parish Church of Stratford Tony and (b) the balance of such net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in each series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Bishopstone shall have the first and third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Stratford Tony shall have the second turn.

" 5. That upon the union taking effect all the Tithe Rent Charges, Glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the United Benefice or which may hereafter belong thereto shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the Benefices of Marlborough, Saint Peter and Saint Paul with Saint Mary the Virgin and Edington both in the said Diocese of Salisbury with the two annual sums or yearly rent charges hereinafter mentioned that is to say (a) in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Marlborough Saint Peter and Saint Paul with Saint Mary the Virgin a clear annual sum or yearly rent charge equivalent in amount to the gross yearly value of a sum of £68 13s. 8d. Tithe Rent Charge as determined in accordance with the Statutory provisions for the time being and from time to time in force for ascertaining the sum payable in respect of Tithe Rent Charge and (b) in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Edington a clear annual sum or yearly rent charge equivalent in amount to the gross yearly value of a sum of £22 17s. 11d. Tithe Rent Charge similarly determined such annual sums or yearly rent charges to be paid half yearly as hereinafter provided and so that the amount of the said half yearly instalment of each of the said yearly rent charges to be paid on each half yearly day hereunder shall be the same or the like amount as would in accordance with the aforesaid Statutory provision have become payable in respect of such corresponding sum

of Tithe Rent Charge on the last preceding half yearly day for payment of Tithe Rent Charge. The said yearly rent charge in each case to be as from the date of the union taking effect due and payable to the Incumbent of the Benefice in whose favour it is charged and to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of such Benefice or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the said Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by half yearly instalments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year. And for the recovery of each of the said yearly rent charges the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Marlborough Saint Peter and Saint Paul with Saint Mary the Virgin and Edington and their respective successors shall have and be entitled to all such or the like powers and remedies as are expressed to be conferred by Section 44 of the Conveyancing and Law of Property Act, 1881, in relation to rent charges within the purview of that Section. Provided always that if at any time by reason of any redemption of Tithe Rent Charge belonging to the said United Benefice or any sale of or other transfer of the right to receive any such Tithe Rent Charge the endowments chargeable with the said yearly rent charges shall no longer include any sum whatsoever of Tithe Rent Charge then and in such case as from the date on which such redemption sale or transfer shall take effect the amounts of the said yearly rent charges shall cease to be regulated by the value of Tithe Rent Charge and shall thereafter be fixed annual sums equivalent in each case to the amount payable in respect of the corresponding yearly rent charge for the year ending on the half yearly day for the payment thereof which last preceded the aforesaid date. Provided also that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any Deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him grant convey and annex or if by any other Instrument in accordance with statutory authority there shall at any time be annexed to either of the said Benefices of Marlborough Saint Peter and Saint Paul with Saint Mary the Virgin and Edington in lieu of or in substitution for the yearly rent charge hereby created in favour of one or both of such Benefices any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Salisbury for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the yearly rent charge or yearly rent charges hereby created as aforesaid in favour of either or both of such Benefices then the said yearly rent charge or yearly rent charges as the case may be shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable. And provided also that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now or hereafter payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said United Benefice shall continue to be payable by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in

accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, or the said Measures, or of any other Act of Parliament or Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Salisbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

JUTE TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS AS FROM 8TH OCTOBER, 1925.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918 and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established in Great Britain, under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for the Jute Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that, seeing that the specified period of operation of the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Trade Board's Notice J. (39), dated 6th June, 1925, will expire on 7th October, 1925, THEY AGAIN PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time Rates, General Minimum Piece Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time Rates, Guaranteed Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers set out in their Notices J. (35) and J. (37), dated respectively 26th September, 1924 and 12th February, 1925, by providing that the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Notice J. (39), dated 6th June, 1925, shall be continued in operation after the 7th October, 1925.

This Notice is issued with the consent of the Minister of Labour.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above PROPOSAL TO VARY which may be lodged with them within two months from 30th June, 1925. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Jute Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

THE LONDON TRAFFIC (RESTRICTED STREETS)  
(No. 2) PROVISIONAL REGULATIONS, 1925.

Whereas by notice dated the 17th day of June, 1925, published in the London Gazette dated the 19th day of June, the Minister of Transport by virtue and in exercise of the powers given to him by Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Provisional Regulations, 1925, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee relaxed the restrictions and limitations imposed by Regulation 2 of the said Regulations upon the occasion of the All England Lawn Tennis Championships to be held at Wimbledon Park on each weekday, from Monday, the 22nd day of June to Saturday, the 4th day of July, 1925, both days inclusive.

And whereas the Minister proposes further to relax the said restrictions and limitations in respect of Saturday, the 27th day of June, 1925.

**FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (AMEND-  
MENT) ORDER OF 1925.**

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Provisions as to Regulations and Notices of  
Local Authority.*

1.—(1) Article 30 (provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority) of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Order of 1895, hereinafter referred to as the principal Order, is hereby revoked.

(2) Regulations made after the commencement of this Order under Articles 12, 13, or 17 of the principal Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to the Minister for confirmation and been confirmed by him.

(3) Drafts of the proposed Regulations should be submitted before the Regulations are made by the Local Authority.

(4) For the purposes of confirmation the Regulations as made by the Local Authority, or two certified copies thereof, should be sent to the Minister.

(5) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under the principal Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

(6) If the Minister, with respect to any Notice served or Regulation made by a Local Authority under the principal Order, is satisfied after consultation with the Local Authority that the revocation thereof is necessary or expedient the Minister may by notice to the

Local Authority direct the revocation thereof and the same shall thereupon cease to operate as directed in the Notice.

*Confirmation required for existing Regulations.*

2. Any Regulations made in pursuance of Articles 12, 13 or 17, of the principal Order before the commencement of this Order shall cease to operate as from the thirty-first day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, unless they have after the commencement of this Order been submitted to the Minister for confirmation and been confirmed by him.

*Commencement.*

3. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

*Short Title and Construction.*

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1925, and shall be read as one with the principal Order.

(The supply of Electricity by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Wrexham in part of the Rural District of Wrexham in the County of Denbigh and other Matters).

NOTICE is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Wrexham (hereinafter called "the Corporation") whose address is the Guildhall, Wrexham, intend to apply to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the area of supply under the Wrexham Corporation Electric Lighting Order 1897, by adding thereto:—

The parishes or townships of Abenbury Fawr, Acton, Erthig, Gresford and March-wiel, so much of the parish or township of Bersham as lies to the east of an imaginary line drawn from the boundary of the said parish at the Ford near Esless Mills along the centre of the road running in a northerly direction from the said Ford to Ruthin Road thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Ruthin Road to the junction of the road leading to Croesnewydd Bridge, and thence in a northerly direction along the centre of the last mentioned road to the

boundary of the said parish; so much of the parish or township of Broughton as lies to the east of an imaginary line drawn along the centre of the road running from the boundary of the parish at Croesnewydd Bridge in a northerly and north-easterly direction to the boundary of the Parish at Plas Côch; so much of the parish or township of Stansty as lies to the east of an imaginary line drawn along the centre of the road running from the boundary of the Parish at Plas Côch in a northerly and north-easterly direction to the London and North Eastern Railway at or near the Railway Inn thence across the said Railway and along the Great Western Railway in a northerly direction to the point where the boundary of the said parish crosses the last mentioned Railway; and so much of the parish of Gwersyllt as lies to the east of the Shrewsbury and Chester Line of the Great Western Railway, all in the rural district of Wrexham in the County of Denbigh.

The areas so proposed to be added to the said area of supply are hereinafter referred to as "the added area."

2. To authorise the Corporation to generate, supply, distribute and sell electrical energy for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1922, within the added area.

3. To extend and make applicable to the added area all or some of the provisions contained in the Wrexham Corporation Electric Lighting Order 1897, and to apply such provisions to the undertaking to be authorised by



the Order subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein and to repeal or amend so far as may be deemed expedient any Orders made by the Board of Trade or the Electricity Commissioners under the provisions of Section 6 of the Electric Lighting Act, 1909, in relation to the supply of electricity by the Corporation to any premises within the added area.

4. To incorporate in the Order such of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899, as are applicable, and to apply such provisions to the undertaking authorised by the said Order of 1897, or to be authorised by the Order, subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

5. To authorise the Corporation to open, break up and interfere with all streets, roads, and public places, ways, footpaths, bridges, culverts, sewers, drains, and gas and water mains and pipes, and telegraph and telephone and other wires within the area of supply, and to lay down, erect, maintain, renew and remove, either above or under ground or otherwise, electric lines, conductors, mains, pipes, tubes, wires, posts, street or distributing boxes, meters, apparatus, or other works or things required for the purpose of enabling the Corporation to generate, supply, store, convey, transmit or distribute electricity within the added area and to confer all such other powers upon the Corporation as may be necessary for effecting the objects of the proposed undertaking.

6. To prescribe the maximum and minimum prices that may be demanded and taken by the Corporation in respect of the supply of electrical energy within the added area.

7. To authorise the Corporation to fit up show rooms offices and installations and to give demonstrations as to the use of electricity.

8. To authorise the Corporation in cases where they supply electricity for the purposes of haulage or traction on railways or tramways situate partly within or partly without the area of supply or for lighting vehicles used thereon to supply electricity for other purposes incidental to the working thereof.

9. The names of the streets and parts of streets in the added area in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a period to be specified by the Order are as follows:—

In the Parish or Township of Acton:—

Box Lane from Chester Road to Acton Park Lodge; Rhosnesney from Acton Park Lodge in a south-easterly direction to the Mission Church and thence in a westerly direction to B.M. 270.4;

In the Parish or Township of Gresford:—

Chester Road from B.M. 247.3 to corner of Vicarage Lane; Vicarage Lane from Chester Road to entrance to Trewythen.

In the Parish or Township of Stansty:—

Rhosddu Road from the boundary of the Borough of Wrexham to Price's Lane; Price's Lane.

10. To authorise the Corporation to open and break up in the added area the following streets and parts of streets which are not repairable by the local authority and tramways (namely):—

(A) Streets:—

In the Parish or Township of Abenbury Fawr:—

The roadway under the bridge carrying the Great Western (Wrexham and Ellesmere) Railway over King's Mills Road.

In the Parish or Township of Acton:—  
Chester Road; Holt Road.

In the Parish or Township of Bersham:—

Ruthin Road; Ruabon Road; the roadways on the bridges carrying Ruthin Road and Bersham Road over the Shewsbury and Chester Line of the Great Western Railway and Ruthin Road over a branch of the Wrexham and Minera Line of the Great Western Railway.

In the Parish or Township of Broughton:—

Mold Road; the roadway on the bridges carrying Mold Road over the London and North Eastern Railway and the roadway on the bridge carrying the road near Croesnewydd over the Great Western (Wrexham and Minera) Railway.
