PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, it is (amongst other things) provided that, if a majority of the whole Council of a Borough agree to petition, and the Council thereupon petition, the King for the alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the Borough it shall be lawful for His Majesty, from time to time, by Order in Council, to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough shall be divided, and that the Borough shall be divided into that number of Wards, and that where an Order in Council has been so made the Secretary of State shall appoint a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of the Wards and apportioning the Councillors among them:

And whereas a majority of the whole Council of the Borough of Hartlepool agreed to petition, and the said Council thereupon, on the 30th day of January, 1925, petitioned His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, for an alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the said Borough:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 17th day of March,

1925, to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough of Hartlepool should be henceforth divided, and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be six:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir William Joynson-Hicks, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did by warrant, given under his hand and seal at Whitehall on the 27th day of March, 1925, appoint Oscar Follett Dowson, Esquire, O.B.E., Barrister-at-Law, a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for carrying into effect the prayer of the said Petition:

And whereas the said Commissioner has, in pursuance of the powers given him by virtue of the said appointment, prepared the following Scheme, dated the 22nd day of June, 1925, accordingly:

- "Scheme for the purpose of determining the Boundaries of, and for Apportioning the Councillors among, the Six Wards of the Borough of Hartlepool.
 - "I. NAMES OF WARDS.
 - 1. South Ward.
 - 2. St. Hilda Ward.
 - 3. Station Ward.
 - 4. Throston Ward.
 - 5. Hart Ward.
 - Middleton Ward.

" II. Boundaries of Wards.

" South Ward.

"The South Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is contained within a line

commencing at the junction of Church Walk with Manners Street thence along the centre of that street to its junction with Victoria Place thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Victoria Place and Moor Terrace and to the north of Heugh Lighthouse to the Low Water Mark of Ordinary Tides thence in a generally south-westerly direction along the Low Water Mark of Ordinary Tides to the point where the Low Water Mark turns northwards thence in a north-westerly direction to and along the centre of the Harbour Channel to the centre of the New Ferry thence in a north-easterly direction to the point (marked A on the plan annexed hereto) where the line intersects with a continuation of a line drawn along the centre of High Street thence in a south-easterly direction to and along the centre of High Street thence along the centre of Church Walk to the point of commencement.

" St Hilda Ward.

"The St. Hilda Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is contained within a line commencing at the junction of Well Street with Brougham Street thence along the centre of that street to its junction with Moor Street thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of that street and across Headland Promenade to the Low Water Mark of Ordinary Tides thence in a generally south-easterly direction along the Low Water Mark to the point where it intersects with the boundary of the South Ward thence along the northern boundary of that Ward to its western extremity (at the point marked A on the plan annexed thereto) thence along a straight line drawn in a north-easterly direction across Victoria Dock to the centre of Brig Open thence along the centre of Brig Open and Well Street to the point of commencement.

" Station Ward.

"The Station Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is contained within a line commencing at the point on the railway where the boundary of the Parish of Hartlepool meets the boundary of the Parish of Middleton thence in a north-easterly direction to and along the centre of Corporation Road and across Headland Promenade to the Low Water Mark of Ordinary Tides thence along the Low Water Mark in a generally south-easterly direction to the point where it intersects the boundary of St. Hilda Ward thence in a south-westerly direction along that boundary to its western extremity (at the point marked A on the plan annexed hereto) thence across Victoria Dock along the boundary of the Parish of Middleton in a northeasterly and north-westerly direction and across the railway to the point of commencement.

" Throston Ward.

"The Throston Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is contained within a line commencing at the junction of Milbank Crescent with Corporation Road thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of Milbank Crescent to Throston Bridge carrying the London and North Eastern Railway thence along the north side of the railway to the Borough Boundary thence along that Boundary in a north-easterly direction to the Low Water Mark of Ordinary Tides thence in a south-easterly direction along the Low Water

Mark to the point where it intersects with the Station Ward Boundary thence in a south-westerly direction along that Boundary to the point of commencement.

" Hart Ward.

"The Hart Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is contained within a line commencing at the point where the Borough Boundary intersects the London and North Eastern Railway from Sunderland to the Hartlepools thence in a westerly and southerly direction along the Borough Boundary to the new Cemetery thence along that Boundary to the point in the Central Marine Engine Works where that Boundary turns southwards thence in a generally north-easterly direction along the Boundary of the Parish of Middleton through the Central Marine Engine Works and across Central Road to and along the north-west side of the Old Harbour and through Victoria Dock to the point where the said Parish boundary meets the centre of Milbank Crescent thence in a north-westerly direction along the Boundary of Throston Ward to the point of commencement.

" Middleton Ward.

"The Middleton Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is contained within a line commencing at the point in the Central Marine Engine Works where the Borough Boundary turns southwards thence along that Boundary in a southerly and then easterly direction to the point where it meets the Low Water Mark of Ordinary Tides thence along the Low Water Mark in a north-easterly direction to the Boundary of South Ward thence in a generally north-westerly direction along that Boundary to the point marked A on the plan annexed hereto thence in a northerly, north-westerly and south-westerly direction along the boundary of Station Ward, Throston Ward and Hart Ward (being co-terminous with the boundary of the Parish of Middleton) to the point of commencement.

"The Boundaries as above described are more particularly delineated on the Plan which is annexed hereto and forms part of the Scheme.

WHEREAS, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 18th day of June, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Ashby with Fenby and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Brigsley, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Lincoln, and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Ashby with Fenby and Brigsley duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lincoln and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Lincoln signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

'And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said

" And whereas both of the said Benefices of Ashby with Fenby and Brigsley are now full, the Reverend Harry Smedley Vlako Turner

being the present Incumbent thereof:
"And whereas the said Harry Smedley Vlako Turner has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of

Ashby with Fenby:
"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majorian and Propose to Your Majori pose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to

"1. That the said Benefice of Ashby with Fenby and the said Benefice of Brigsley shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ashby with Fenby and Brigsley' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said -Harry Smedley Vlako Turner if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Ashby with Fenby and Brigsley shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ashby with Fenby shall become and be the house of residence for the

Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in each series of four successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Ashby with Fenby shall have the first the second and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice

of Brigsley shall have the fourth turn.
"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any

Act of Parliament.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Lincoln has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:
Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme, and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Lincoln.

vent the driving on the highways or portions. of highways specified in the Schedules. hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said roads") of:—

(i) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said roads or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;

(ii) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the

said roads; or

(iii) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads or the laying, alteration or repairin or near to the said roads of any seweror of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity.

Amendment of Article 3 of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Order of 1895.

- 1. Article 3 of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Order of 1895 (hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Order") as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Amendment) Order of 1922 is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—
 - "Local Authority to consult Veterinary Inspector as to existence of Foot-and-Mouth Disease.
 - 3.—(1) A Local Authority, in making an inquiry, under Sub-section (5) of Section 8 of the Act of 1894 into the correctness of an Inspector's declaration respecting the existence of foot-and-mouth disease in any place, shall obtain the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector or of a person qualified according to the Act of 1894 to be such.
 - (2) Every such Veterinary Inspector or person shall, before entering any premises in which foot-and-mouth disease exists, or is suspected to exist, put on suitable overall clothing and boots which are disinfectable, and shall on leaving such premises thoroughly disinfect his hands, overall clothing and boots.
 - (3) The Local Authority shall supply to every such person the overall clothing and boots required to be used under the foregoing provision."

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the Foot-And-Mouth Disease (Amendment) Order of 1925 (No. 2).

Further Amendment of Part II (Cleansing and Disinfection) of Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912.

1. Article 21 of Part II (Cleansing and Disinfection) of the Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912, as substituted by the Animals (Transit and General) Amendment Order of 1924, shall be read and have effect as if the following paragraph were added thereto, namely:—

A railway truck or other railway vehicle (not being a horse-box or guard's van) which has been used for the conveyance of any animal product on a railway shall not subsequently be used for carrying animals or animal feeding stuffs or any litter or other thing intended to be used for or about animals unless and until it has been disinfected, cleansed and again disinfected in the manner described in paragraph 1 (1) of this Article.

Interpretation.

2. In this Order the expression "animal product" means the meat, bones, hide, skin, hoofs, horns, offal, or other part of an animal, separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof, and the expression "animal feeding stuffs" means any corn, fodder or other feeding stuff commonly used for food for animals, and includes hay, milling offals, meals, cakes, etc.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

Short Title, etc.

4. This Order may be cited as the Animals (Transit and General) Amendment Order of 1925 (No. 2), and shall be read with the Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912.

3. To authorise the Company and any local authority company or person to enter into contracts agreements and arrangements for and with respect to the purchase or sale of gas in bulk to or by the Company by or to such local authority company or person and to confer all necessary powers on the parties to any such contracts agreements and arrangements.

4. To authorise the Company for the purpose of supplying gas within the limits of supply and other purposes of the Order, to break up, alter, divert, stop up, remove and interfere with (temporarily or permanently) streets, roads, highways, footpaths (public or private), sewers, railways, tramways and other works and con-

veniences within the limits of supply.

- 5. To authorise the Company to construct, lay down, repair, take up, alter, relay or renew within the limits of supply, mains, pipes, culverts and other works for the purpose of procuring, conducting and disposing of oil and other materials.
- 6. To make provision as to the declaration by the Company from time to time of the calorific value or values of the gas to be supplied by them and the alteration of such calorific value or values, and to make provision as to the pressure and quality of the gas to be supplied by the Company.
- 7. To prescribe prices or a standard price and rates or standard rates of dividend with a sliding scale or scales of dividend dependent upon the price charged for gas.
- 8. To authorise the Company to charge for gas supplied within such parts of the limits of supply as the Order may define such differential prices as the Order may prescribe and to provide that such prices shall not be taken into account in determining the dividend payable by the Company.
- 9. To empower the Company to vary the price of gas in different circumstances, and to make special charges in the case of stand-by supplies.
- 10. To make provision with reference to the construction, placing, specification and inspection of pipes and fittings, the cutting off of supplies, expenses of reconnecting supplies, entry on premises to which a supply of gas is laid on, removal of fittings, fittings let on hire, the period of error in defective meters, charges for special readings of meters, mains of insufficient capacity, the terms and conditions on which gas shall be supplied in certain cases, and the notices to be given to or by the Company or their consumers.
- 11. To make special provision and to impose special obligations on consumers with respect to the construction, providing, repair, inspection, and use of anti-fluctuators in connection with the working of engines and of valves and other appliances in cases when air is used at high-pressure in connection with the consumption of gas and to impose penalties on consumers and other persons failing to comply with any such provisions.
