PORTMADOC ELECTRICITY.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Urban District Council of Portmadoc (hereinafter called "the Council") and whose address is the Town Hall, Portmadoc, Carnarvonshire, have applied to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1922 for all or some of the following amongst other objects and purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the Council to take, transform, supply, sell and distribute electrical energy for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1922 within the Urban District of Portmadoc in the County of Carnarvon (hereinafter referred to as "the area of supply").

2. To authorise the Council to exercise within the area of supply all the powers usually conferred on distributors of electricity.

3. To authorise the Council to break up in the area of supply the following Streets and Roads not repairable by a local authority viz.:—

(1) Road from South end of Cornhill along the Slate Wharves Road to Trwyn-Caeiogo,
