

URBAN DISTRICT OF WILLESDEN.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

BY an Order dated the 23rd day of June, 1925, the Minister of Health has declared that, on and after that date the following provisions of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the Urban District of Willesden, namely:—

Part VI (which relates to recreation grounds).

The Order also directs that Sections 63 to 67 of the Willesden Urban District Council Act, 1903, shall, to the extent therein specified, be no longer in force.

ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACTS,
1882 TO 1922.AYLESBURY ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION) SPECIAL
ORDER, 1925.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Electricity Commissioners have submitted to the Minister of Transport for confirmation under the above mentioned Acts a Special Order made by them for the supply by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Aylesbury of electricity within the Rural Districts of Aylesbury and Long Crendon and part of the Rural District of Wycombe, in the County of Buckingham, the Urban District of Thames and part of the Rural District of Thame, in the County of Oxford, and the Urban District of Tring and part of the Rural District of Berkhamsted, in the County of Hertford.

The Minister of Transport proposes to confirm the Order, and gives notice that any person affected who may be desirous of objecting to the confirmation of the same must, in accordance with the Electricity (Confirmation of Special Orders) Rules, 1921, do so by memorial, addressed to the Minister of Transport, written on one side only of foolscap paper, and sent by registered post, addressed to The Secretary, Ministry of Transport, 6, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1, and posted not later than the 4th day of August, 1925. A copy of any such memorial must also be sent in like manner to H. Crookes, Esqre., Town Clerk, Aylesbury, or to Messrs. Sharpe, Pritchard and Company, Palace Chambers, Bridge Street, Westminster, London, S.W. 1, Parliamentary Agents for the Order. Such memorial must be sealed or signed by the person objecting, or by some responsible and duly authorised person on his behalf, and must state the specific grounds of objection to the Order and the modifications desired.

Copies of the Order as submitted for confirmation may be obtained at a price not exceeding two shillings each at the offices of the Clerks to the Urban District Councils at the Council Offices at Tring and Thame respectively, and at the offices of the before-mentioned Town Clerk and Parliamentary Agents.

BINGLEY URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL
ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION).

(The Supply of electricity by the Urban District Council of Bingley within part of the township of East and West Morton in the rural district of Keighley in the West Riding of the County of York.)

NOTICE is hereby given that the Bingley Urban District Council (who are hereinafter referred to as "the Council") and whose address is the Town Hall, Bingley, intend to apply to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1922, for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the area of supply under the Bingley Urban District Council Electric Lighting Order 1912 (hereinafter called "the Order of 1912") so as to include therein the part of the township of East and West Morton in the rural district of Keighley, in the West Riding of the County of York, known as the Morton Ward of the said Township (the said area of supply so extended being hereinafter referred to as "the extended area of supply") and to authorise the Council to supply, distribute, and sell electrical energy for public and private purposes as defined by the said Acts within the extended area of supply.

2. To extend and make applicable to the extended area of supply all or some of the provisions contained in the Order of 1912, and to apply such provisions to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order, subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

3. To exclude from incorporation some or all of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, or to incorporate the same with such modifications and exceptions as may be indicated in the Order.

4. To confer upon the Council all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, and enactments incorporated therewith, and to alter, vary or extinguish all
