certified that by reason of inadequate accommodation, want of repair or sanitation or lack of water supply, the value of such cottage is less than 2s., the value shall be such sum less than 2s. as the Committee shall determine on a consideration of the defects.

- (ii) In the case of a cottage with regard to which the Committee on an application by or on behalf of an employer have certified that by reason of the accommodation and condition of the cottage the value of such cottage is higher than 2s. the value shall be such sum greater than 2s. as the Committee shall determine on a consideration of the accommodation.
- 3. In pursuance of their said powers the said Committee hereby order that except as in this Order provided no benefit or advantage shall be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu
- 4. This Order shall come into operation on the 13th July, 1925.

ORDER MADE BY THE CAMBRIDGE-SHIRE AND ISLE OF ELY AGRI-CULTURAL WAGES COMMITTEE VARYING THEIR ORDER OF THE 28rd FEBRUARY, 1925, DEFINING EMPLOYMENT WHICH IS TO BE TREATED AS OVERTIME EMPLOY-MENT.

The Cambridgeshire and Isle of Ely Agricultural Wages Committee in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Agri-Wages Committees Regulations, 1924, do by this Order vary their Order of the 28th February, 1925, defining the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment for the purpose of the application of any differential rate of wages for overtime fixed by the said Committee in the area comprising the administrative Counties of Cambridge and the Isle of Ely and hereby Order that such employment shall be as follows:

- 1. In the case of Male Workers (other than those workers employed wholly or mainly as Horsemen, Cowmen and Shepherds, but including workers employed solely as Stockmen or Yardmen):-
 - (a) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(b) All employment on a Sunday.

- (c) All employment in excess of 51 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are employment) treated as overtime Summer.
- (d) All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in Winter.
- 2. In the case of Female Workers:
- (a) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

- (b) All employment on a Sunday.(c) All employment in excess of 8 hours on any other day.
- 3. For the purpose of this Order employment in Summer shall be deemed to be all employment during the period commencing on the first day of March and terminating on the last day of October following and employment in Winter shall be deemed to be all employment during the period commencing on the first day of November and terminating on the last day of February following.
- 4. This Order shall come into operation on 6th July, 1925.
