Railways which may be broken up by the Undertakers in pursuance of the Special Powers granted by this Order.

Railway Bridge at Sturminster Newton Station over Southern Railway.

Railway Bridge near Sturminster Newton Station over Southern Railway, on road from Police Station to Union Workhouse.

Streets and parts of streets throughout which the Undertakers are to lay down suitable and sufficient distributing mains for the purpose of General Supply within a period of two years after the commencement of this Order.
