tural Wages Board dated 13th January, 1925, when such duties (except on a Sunday) are performed within the hours of employ-

ment specified in Clause 1 above.

- (2) In the case of a worker employed wholly or mainly as a horseman, stockman or shepherd who in addition to working the full harvest hours specified above performs the above mentioned duties in connection with stock outside those harvest hours such worker shall be entitled to the sum of 6s. in repect of such employment as provided by Clause 3 of the Agricultural Wages Board Order dated 18th January, 1925.
- 4. Where a worker is paid wages in accordance with the terms of a Permit of Exemption the rate of wages for his work on the corn harvest on the premises on which the worker is amployed shall be such proportion of the rate of wages as specified in Clause 1 of this Order as corresponds with the proportion of the wages payable to an ordinary worker which is payable to that worker in accordance with the terms of his Permit,
- 5. All employment on harvest work on a Sunday shall be paid for in the case of any worker at the rates applicable to such worker for Sunday work under the Orders of the Board for the time being in force.
- 6. Any existing rate or Order in so far as the same is inconsistent with this Order is hereby superseded in respect of any premises for the harvest period on those premises.
- 7. This Order shall apply to the corn harvest in 1925 only.
