Cardigan commencing by a junction with the Vale of Rheidol (Light) Railway of the Company at its termination and terminating at a point in the road abutting on the western side of the Aberystwyth Station of the Company's' Cambrian Railways 6 chains or thereabouts south east of the junction of that road with Alexandra Road.

To acquire by compulsion or agreement and to hold lands (in which term wherever used in this Notice, houses, buildings, easements, and other hereditaments are included) in the said Parish for the purposes of the said intended railway.

To apply to the purposes of the intended Order such portion of their corporate funds as they shall think expedient.

The Order will vary or extinguish any existing rights or privileges which would interfere with its objects, and it will incorporate certain of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts (subject to such modifications of those Acts as may be specified in the Order being modifications made or authorised by the Development and Road Improvement Funds Act, 1909, or any other enactment).

And it will or may so far as may be deemed expedient repeal, alter or enlarge some of the powers and provisions of the following Acts (that is to say) the Act 5 & 6 Will. IV. cap. 107, the Vale of Rheidol (Light) Railway Act, 1897, and any Act or Acts relating to the Company or their undertaking.
