Where such rateable value exceeds eighty pounds the rate of nine pounds per centum per annum upon such value;

The minimum charge in any one year shall be thirteen shillings per annum.

For every water closet beyond the first a sum not exceeding seven shillings and sixpence per annum.

For every fixed bath capable of containing not more than fifty gallons a sum not exceeding eleven shillings and threepence per annum.

A sum not exceeding one shilling and sixpence per one thousand gallons.
