WHEREAS there was this day read at the
Board a Memorial from the Right
Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the
Admiralty, dated the 30th day of June, 1925
(N.P. (2) 1788/25), in the words following,
viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas by Order in Council dated 13th October, 1920, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to sanction the payment of Training Allowances to Petty Officers and Leading Seamen of the Royal Navy and Non-Commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines employed in Boys and Youths Training Establishments, in Seagoing Training Ships, and in the Boy Artificer Training Establishments:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the scale of allowances requires modification in certain particulars:

"We beg leave humbly to submit that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment, at our discretion, of the Training Allowances shown in the accompanying Schedule, subject to the conditions laid down in the Order in Council of 13th October, 1920.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

" SCHEDULE.

Per diem.

"To Chief and other Petty Officers and to Non-Commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines of the rank of Sergeant or above, who have definite responsibility and charge of Boys out of Instructional hours

6d.

"To Leading Seamen and to Corporals R.M. employed in the same capacity as above ...

3d."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 14th day of May, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say :-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Frinstead and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Wormshill, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Frinstead and Wormshill duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of Canterbury and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Archbishop of Canterbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended

in the said Report:
"And whereas the said Benefice of Frinstead is now full, the Reverend George James Browne being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Wormshill is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said George James Browne has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

' Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:-

"1. That the said Benefice of Frinstead and the said Benefice of Wormshill shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style

of 'the United Benefice of Frinstead with Wormshill,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said George James Browne if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Frinstead shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Frinstead shall become and be the house of residence for the In-

cumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Wormshill having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Frinstead having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England,

or of any Act of Parliament.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Archbishop of Canterbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 18th day of June, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say :-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Crayford and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Erith, both in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester:

Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Crayford and the said New Parish of Christ Church, Erith, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Crayford and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Erith, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District or New Parish in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

" And whereas there is within the limits of the said proposed separate District or New Parish a consecrated Church in use for the purposes of Divine Worship and such Church is named 'The Church of Saint Augustine,

Slade Green ':

" And whereas by a certain Indenture bearing date on or about the 28th day of May, 1925, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844 and 1856' or some or one of them, between the Reverend Canon Gustavus John Jones, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Crayford of the first part, the Right Reverend John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester, as the Patron in right of his See and also as the Ordinary of the said Rectory of the Parish of Crayford, of the second part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the third part (which Indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice), the said Gustavus John Jones did, with the consent of the said John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester, as such Bishop and also as such Patron as aforesaid, grant and confirm unto the Minister or Incumbent of the District or New Parish hereinafter recommended to be constituted and to his successors certain Tithe Rent Charges commuted at £100 19s. 6d. arising from lands and hereditaments situate in the said Parish of Crayford and belonging to the said Rectory of Crayford, free from and clear of all charges for First Fruits and Tenths, such grant of the said Tithe Commutation Rent Charges to take effect as from the date of the avoidance of the said Rectory of Crayford by the said Gustavus John Jones:

" And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £150 per annum to the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed separate District or New Parish so soon as a Minister or Incumbent shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

" And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £150 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

" And whereas the said Tithe Commutation Rent Charges have been so granted and confirmed by the said Gustavus John Jones as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said Gustavus John Jones has nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Rochester, as the person to whom he desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Crayford and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Erith, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The New Parish of Saint Augustine, Slade Green.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the said Church of Saint Augustine, Slade Green, shall as from the day last mentioned be and for that purpose we hereby specify the same Church as the Parish Church of the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Slade Green.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said John Reginald, Bishop of the said Diocese of Rochester, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The New Parish of Saint Augustine, Slade Green, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Crayford, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, which is bounded upon the east partly by the Parish of Dartford and partly by the New Parish of Saint Alban, Dartford, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the north by the middle of the River Thames, upon the north-west by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Erith, upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Paul, Northumberland Heath, Erith, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Northumberland Heath, Erith, from the said Parish of Crayford at the centre of the second bridge east of Barnehurst Station on the Bexleyheath Line of the Southern Railway where the said boundary diverges westward along the middle of such railway, and extending thence first eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of one mile or thereabouts to its junction with the North Kent Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last mentioned line of railway for a distance of 26½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway across the River Cray, and extend-

ing thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of the River Cray for a distance of 16½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Crayford from the said Parish of Dartford.

II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Erith, which is bounded upon the north-east, upon the south, and upon the south-west by the abovedescribed portion of the said Parish of Crayford, upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Northumberland Heath, Erith, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Northumberland Heath, Erith, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Erith, at the point on the northern side of Colyer's Lane where such boundary is crossed by the boundary which divides the Civil parish of Erith from the Civil Parish of Crayford, and extending thence north-eastward along the said Civil Parish boundary for a distance of 45 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of the said North Kent Line of the Southern Railway upon the boundary which divides the said New parish of Christ Church, Erith, from the said Parish of Crayford."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District or New Parish recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such

Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Hornchurch is a Parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Hornchurch which is hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use

for the purposes of Divine Worship:

" And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late

Majesty, Chapter 111:

And whereas the Warden and Fellows of Saint Mary College of Winchester in Oxford commonly called New College in Oxford, (hereinafter called 'the said Warden and Fellows') have contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 to be held by us as and for a permanent endowment for the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed separate District, and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish:

"And whereas the said Warden and Fellows, as the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the endowment of the said proposed separate District or New Parish have nominated to us, as the persons to whom they desire that the right of Patronage of the said proposed separate District or New Parish should be assigned, the Right Reverend Guy,

Bishop of the said Diocese of Chelmsford, and his successors, Bishops of the same Diocese for ever, for the first and each and every alternate turn of appointment and themselves, the said Warden and Fellows, and their successors for the second and each and every other

alternate turn of appointment:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners. humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Hornchurch which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of the Holy Cross, Hornchurch

"And we further recommend and propose that the Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and the right of nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the first and thereafter every alternate turn of presentation or nomination shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Guy, Bishop of the said Diocese of Chelmsford, and his successors, Bishops of the same Diocese, for ever, and that such Patronage and right of nomination aforesaid shall for the second and every subsequent alternate turn of presentation or nomination be in like manner assigned to and be absolutely vested in and be from time to time exercised by the said Warden and Fellows and their successors for the time being:

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any

other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of the Holy Cross, Hornchurch, being:-

" All that part of the Parish of Hornchurch, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon the west partly by the Parish of Dagenham and partly by the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Romford, both in the said County and Diocese, upon part of the north by the last named New Parish, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north, upon the east and upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Romford, from the said Parish of Hornchurch at the centre of the bridge which carries Brentwood Road across the Romford Branch Line of the London, Midland and

Scottish Railway, and extending thence southeastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 44 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the culvert which carries such line of railway across the stream which passes through the grounds attached to the house known as Grey Towers and under Hornchurch Road at Ravens Bridge and flows into the River Rom, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the middle of the above described stream for a distance of 1 mile and 68 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern bank of the River Rom upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hornchurch from the said Parish of Dagenham.'

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Hornchurch out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such

Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our the Right Reverend Herbert request by Hensley, Bishop of Durham, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Monkhesleden (Saint Mary) and Monkhesleden, Saint

- to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

 '5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Monkhesleden, Saint John, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.
- "6. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternatively, the Patron of the said Benefice of Monkhesleden, Saint John, having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Monkhesleden (Saint Mary), having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.
- "7. That upon the said union taking effect a portion amounting to £200 per annum of the yearly sum or stipend at present payable by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Monkhesleden, Saint John, shall

be severed or diverted from such Benefice and shall thereupon and thenceforth become payable by us for and towards the stipend of the Curate serving the Conventional District of Hutton Henry (comprising a locality wholly or partly situate within the limits of the Parish of Monkhesleden (Saint Mary)) until such Conventional District shall have been constituted a separate ecclesiastical District or New Parish and thereafter for and towards the stipend of the Incumbent of such ecclesiastical District or New Parish.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

That the said Benefice of Crewkerne and the said Sinecure Rectory of Easthams shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Crewkerne,' and that the Parish or reputed Parish of Easthams shall also be united to the Parish of the said Benefice of Crewkerne for Ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Crewkerne shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Crewkerne shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Norman Robert Ottiwell Gifford Bennet if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Crewkerne and of the said Sinecure Rectory of Easthams shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Crewkerne shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the right of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Crewkerne.

Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measure:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or the Ecclesiastical transmitted said to Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bath and Wells has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by his Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the union therein recommended shall be effective to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

GOVERNING BODY OF SHREWSBURY School having, on the 10th day of July, 1925, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, made Statutes in the terms appended hereto amending and consolidating the existing Statutes of the said School, the said Statutes are hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And Notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Statutes.

SHREWSBURY SCHOOL

STATUTES.

Whereas the School known as Shrewsbury School, otherwise called Shrewsbury Free Grammar School, is a School to which the Public Schools Act, 1868, and the Acts amending the same apply:

And whereas the Special Commissioners sppointed for the purposes of the Public Schools Act, 1868, commonly and hereinafter called the Public Schools Commissioners, did by a Statute made by them on the 22nd day of April, 1871, and approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the 28th day of July, 1871, determine and establish the constitution of the Governing Body of the said School:

And whereas the Governing Body did by a Statute made by them on the 4th day of February, 1874, and approved by the Public Schools Commissioners on the 9th day of February, 1874, and by Her late Majesty in Council on the 12th day of May, 1874, consolidate and amend the then existing Statutes of the said School, and repeal all such parts of the said Statutes as were not intended to be retained in force:

And whereas it is expedient to amend in divers particulars the said Statutes of the 28th day of July, 1871, and the 12th day of May, 1874, and to repeal certain parts of the said Statutes and consolidate the same with the amendments thereof in one body of Statutes: Now we, the Governing Body of Shrewsbury School, otherwise called Shrewsbury Free Grammar School, do hereby in exercise of the powers of the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of the Acts amending the same and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf enact as follows:-

STATUTE I.

TITLE OF THE SCHOOL.

The said School shall hereafter be called and known for all purposes as Shrewsbury School, and the Governing Body thereof shall be called the Governing Body of Shrewsbury School.

STATUTE II.

CONSTITUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY.

1. The Governing Body of Shrewsbury School, hereinafter referred to for brevity as the Governing Body, shall consist of:-

Members.

The Master of St. John's College, Cambridge, for the time being as an ex-officio member, and of the following elected members:-

One member to be elected by the Hebdomadal Council of the University of . Oxford:

One member to be elected by the Council of the Senate of the University of Cambridge:

One member to be elected by the President and Council of the Royal Society:

One member to be elected by the Lord Chief Justice of England for the time being:

One member to be elected by the Lord Lieutenant of the County of Salop for the time being:

Two members to be elected by the Corpora-

tion of Shrewsbury:
One member to be elected by the Head Master, and Assistant Masters, of the School for the time being:

Three members to be elected by the Governing Body for the time being.

Qualification of Members.

2. Any person, not being the Head Master or one of the Assistant Masters of Shrewsbury School (hereinafter referred to for brevity as the School), may be elected a member of the Governing Body, who is duly qualified in the judgment of the person or persons by whom he is elected to take part in the Government of the School as a place of liberal education.

Mode of filling up vacancies.

3. Vacancies occurring in the offices of the elected members of the Governing Body shall be filled up in manner following, that is to say:

Every such vacancy shall be filled up within three calendar months after the date of its occurrence by the election of a member of the Governing Body by the person or body of persons who had the power of electing the member in respect of whom the vacancy occurs. If any such vacancy as aforesaid be not filled up within three calendar months after the date of its occurrence, His Majesty The King may by Order in Council make such appointment, or fill up such vacancy, by the nomination of any qualified person who He may think fit, subject to the following proviso, namely, that the making of such appointment or filling up of such vacancy shall not confer upon His Majesty any power of filling up any subsequent vacancy, unless the person or body of persons empowered by these Statutes to fill up such vacancy have failed to do so within three calendar months after the vacancy has occurred.

Meetings.

- 4. (i) Ordinary Meetings of the Governing Body, of which there shall be two at least in every year, shall be summoned at such times and places as the Governing Body may determine.
- (ii) At the first Meeting of the Governing Body in each year the members of the Governing Body present at such meeting shall choose one of their body to act as Chairman of the Governing Body for the year then current, and shall also, if they think fit, choose another member to act as Deputy Chairman for the same period.

 (iii) If the Chairman or Deputy Chairman
- (iii) If the Chairman or Deputy Chairman shall cease to be a Member of the Governing Body during his period of office, the members present at the next meeting held after the occurrence of such vacancy shall choose some other member to fill the vacancy, and the member chosen shall hold office as long as the person in whose place he is chosen would have held the same.
- (iv) If at any meeting neither the Chairman nor the Deputy Chairman of the Governing Body be present, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be Chairman at such Meeting.

(v) In case of an equality of votes at any meeting the Chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.

(vi) Special Meetings of the Governing Body may be summoned by the Chairman or any three members of the Governing Body whenever an occasion may arise which shall appear to him or them to require such a meeting to be convened. If the Head Master shall at any time be of opinion that a Special Meeting of the Governing Body should be held for any urgent question of discipline or for any business materially affecting the welfare of the School, he shall notify such opinion in writing to the Chairman for the time being or to any three members of the Governing Body, where-

upon the Chairman or any such three members shall summon a Special Meeting of the Governing Body to be held not earlier than seven days and not later than fourteen days from the receipt of the notification.

(vii) If any elected member be absent from every meeting of the Governing Body during the space of two years, he shall ipso facto cease to be a member, and the office of any such member if absent as aforesaid shall be deemed to have been vacated on the expiration of two years from the date of the last meeting attended by him, or of his appointment if he has never attended a meeting, but he shall not be ineligible for re-election.

(viii) No business shall be transacted at any meeting of the Governing Body unless five member at least be present, but if not less than five are present at a meeting, the validity of any business transacted thereat shall not be affected by any want of service of the notice thereof or summons thereto on any member or by any irregularity in such notice or summons or in the conduct of the business of the meeting.

The Common Seal.

- 5. (i) The Governing Body shall from time to time make rules for the safe custody of the Common Seal.
- (ii) The Common Seal shall not be affixed to any writing or document except by Order of the Governing Body and in the presence of at least two of the members of the Governing Body.
- (iii) No document or writing shall be sealed with the Common Seal until a true certified copy of the same has been entered in a Register to be kept for that purpose.

STATUTE III.

THE HEADMASTER.

1. The Headmaster shall be appointed by, and hold his office at the pleasure of, the Governing Body.

2. He shall be a Master of Arts or of some equal or superior degree in the University of Oxford or of Cambridge.

3. He shall be resident during the whole of each School-term, unless for some grave cause to be signified by him in writing to the Governing Body.

4. He shall be charged with the general discipline and management of the School, and shall superintend the instruction of all Boys admitted to the School.

5. He shall have authority to punish any Boy in the School who shall misconduct himself either there or elsewhere by dismissal from the School or otherwise, provided that in case of dismissal an appeal shall be allowed from the sentence of the Headmaster to the Governing Body, whose decision shall be final.

6. He shall not hold any Ecclesiastical or other office to which any emolument is attached without the consent of the Governing Body, nor shall he without the like consent undertake any other duties than those of the Headmaster.

7. He shall not resign his office without giving to the Governing Body at least three months' notice of his intended resignation, and such resignation shall take effect only at the end of a School-term, except with the express consent of the Governing Body.

STATUTE IV. Assistant Masters.

1. The number position and rank in the School of the Assistant Masters shall be subject to such directions as may be given by the

Governing Body from time to time.

2. All the Assistant Masters shall be appointed by and hold their offices at the pleasure of the Headmaster; provided that in case he dismiss a Master he shall forthwith notify the fact and the reason for it to the Governing Body; provided also that in case of dismissal for misconduct an Appeal shall be allowed to the Governing Body, whose decision shall be final.

STATUTE V.

LICENCES TO TAKE IN BOYS.

No person other than a Master of the School approved by the Governing Body as a House-Master shall be entitled to take Boys to board and lodge in his house in order that they may attend the School without having previously obtained the express sanction of the Governing Body.

STATUTE VI.

YEARLY EXAMINATIONS.

There shall in every year be a competitive examination, conducted by such person or persons, other than Masters of the School, as the Governing Body may appoint, of the boys in the School who may be candidates for any such Scholarships and Exhibitions, tenable after quitting the School, as shall be under the control or subject to the directions of the Governing Body or of the Headmaster and may be then vacant or about to become vacant; and the result of this examination shall be reported to the Governing Body.

STATUTE VII.

THE FOUNDATION.

Subject to the rights reserved by section 14 of the Public Schools Act 1868 to persons being Burgesses of Shrewsbury at the time of the passing of that Act to send their children to the School, the Governing Body shall make such arrangements as, having regard to the income of the School, they shall from time to time determine for providing Scholarships Exhibitions or other Emoluments tenable in the School, or instruction in the School free of charge.

STATUTE VIII.

Special Scholarships and Exhibitions Tenable in the School.

Scholarships and Exhibitions tenable in the School which are provided out of the income of Funds held upon specific trusts shall be awarded and held in accordance with the conditions laid down in the trusts affecting the same respectively, whether declared by deed or by resolution of the Governing Body.

STATUTE IX.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND EXHIBITIONS TENABLE AFTER QUITTING THE SCHOOL.

i. The Scholarships or Exhibitions founded by Dr. John Millington, the Scholarship or Exhibition founded by Mr. James Millington, and the two Scholarships or Exhibitions founded by Deed dated the 27th of September, 1656, in respect of which the yearly sum of

£70 was formerly paid from the funds of the School to the Master, Fellows and Scholars of St. John's College in the University of Cambridge, shall be tenable by boys from Shrewsbury School proceeding to any College or Hall in the University of Oxford or Cambridge or otherwise becoming members of either of these Universities. The Governing Body may, if they think fit, consolidate the two Scholarships or Exhibitions founded by Deed dated the 27th of September, 1656, as above mentioned, and make them into one Exhibition of the yearly value of £70 tenable for four years.

- ii. The two Exhibitions founded by the Reverend Oswald Smyth, and the Exhibition founded by the Reverend John Taylor, D.D., and regulated by his will, shall be open to the competition of all boys who have been or shall have been at the School for two years, and shall be tenable for four years.
- Scholarships, Exhibitions Emoluments tenable after quitting the School by boys educated thereat shall, so far as they are under the control or subject to the directions of the Governing Body or the Headmaster, be conferred according to the result of the Examination for Scholarships and Exhibitions to be held in accordance with Statute VI, but if it appears to the Governing Body unfitting that any successful Candidate should receive the aid of an endowment (either on the ground that his own or his parents' income render him independent or for any other reason), it shall be lawful for them to withhold or cause to be withheld the emoluments of the Scholarship or Exhibition to which such Candidate shall have become In such a case and in case of the entitled. resignation of the Emoluments of any Scholarship or Exhibition by the successful Candidate, he shall be elected an Honorary Scholar or Exhibitioner, as the case may be, and the moneys thereby set free may be applied in providing another Scholarship or Exhibition to which one of the other Candidates may be elected, or in any other manner which may be authorised by the trusts of the Scholarship or Exhibition Fund in question.
- iv. In all future elections to Scholarships or Exhibitions tenable by boys proceeding from Shrewsbury School to any University no regard shall be paid to the place of birth or to the parentage or lineage of any Candidate, but every such Scholarship or Exhibition shall be tenable by any boy proceeding to the University of Oxford or of Cambridge, or to any other University at which his Scholarship or Exhibition may be tenable, provided that he has been at the School for two years immediately preceding the end of the School-term in which the election takes place, and provided that he shall have obtained from the Headmaster a certificate of good morals and behaviour.
- v. The Governing Body may from time to time vary the length of time during which any Scholarship or Exhibition may be tenable, and the time at which the election to any Scholarship or Exhibition shall take place.
- vi. The Governing Body shall from time to time require every Scholar or Exhibitioner whose stipend is payable out of moneys under

their control to produce satisfactory certificates by his Tutor or other person in authority over him of the necessary residence by him at the University and of his good conduct and application to his studies.

vii. The foregoing Rules shall apply, as well to the Exhibitions or Scholarships mentioned above, as also to the recently founded Davies Scholarship, and to all Scholarships or Exhibitions which may hereafter be established by means of any accumulations of money arising from any fund or benefaction in which the School is interested, except in so far as the said Rules may be inconsistent with any conditions which may be laid down in the trusts affecting any Scholarships or Exhibitions which may hereafter be established.

viii. The foregoing Rules shall not apply to the Exhibitions and Prize on the Foundation of Mr. Edward Careswell or any accumulations thereon, nor to the Scholarship or Exhibition founded under the will of the Reverend Henry Usher Matthews, nor to the Exhibition founded by the Reverend R. B. Podmore, nor to the Exhibition founded by Mrs. Noneley, nor to the Exhibition of £17 10s. 0d. a year tenable at St. John's College in the University of Cambridge and representing a charge paid by the Corporation of Shrewsbury to the said College.

- ix. The Exhibitions and the Prize on the Foundation of Mr. Edward Careswell shall remain and be administered as by the several Instruments creating or regulating the Trusts thereof respectively provided, and shall not be affected in any way by these Statutes.
- x. The Scholarship or Exhibition founded under the will of the Reverend Henry Usher Matthews, for a boy proceeding from Shrewsbury School to the University, shall no longer be limited to a boy who may be admitted and continue a member of Lincoln College in the University of Oxford, but shall be tenable by a boy from Shrewsbury School proceeding to any College or Hall in the University of Oxford or of Cambridge or otherwise becoming a member of either of those Universities.
- xi. The Exhibition founded by the Reverend R. B. Podmore shall remain under the limitations prescribed by the Founder, and shall not be affected in any way by these Statutes.

 xii. The Exhibition founded by Mrs. Noneley
- xii. The Exhibition founded by Mrs. Noneley shall remain under the limitations prescribed by her, and shall not be affected in any way by these Statutes.
- xiii. The Exhibition tenable at St. John's College Cambridge shall remain under the limitations prescribed by the trusts thereof, and shall not be affected in any way by these Statutes.
- xiv. No boy shall be elected to more than one Scholarship or Exhibition from the School, except in any case in which the express sanction of the Governing Body shall have been previously obtained to any exception to this rule.

STATUTE X.

OFFICERS.

The Governing Body may appoint (1) an Officer to be known as the Bailiff and Bursar who shall have the care of the property and expenditure of the School, (2) an Auditor or

firm of Auditors who shall audit the School Accounts and make a report in reference thereto at least once a year, and (3) such other Officers as they may deem it advisable to appoint; and shall have power from time to time to regulate as they think fit the duties and reasonable emoluments of the Officers of the School and the mode of their appointment.

STATUTE XI.

- 1. A Minute Book and proper books of Account shall be provided by the Governing Body and kept in some convenient and secure place appointed by the Governing Body for that purpose.
- 2. Minutes of all proceedings of the Governing Body, and also the names of the Members present, shall be entered in the Minute Book and signed by the Chairman at the next Meeting. In the same Book there shall be recorded the entry into Office of every new Member of the Governing Body.

STATUTE XII.

ACCOUNTS.

- 1. The Governing Body shall cause full accounts to be kept by the Bailiff and Bursar, in such manner as they shall from time to time direct, of all receipts and expenditure for or on account of the School.
- 2. The Governing Body shall cause a sufficient Abstract of Accounts to be drawn up each year, such Abstract to include:
 - (1) A Summary of all receipts and expenditure for the year last past, and
 - (2) A Statement of the property belonging to or held in trust for the School, and of the Mortgages and other charges if any thereon, and of all dealings therewith or acquisitions thereto during the year.
- 3. The Auditor shall annually examine and verify the Accounts kept by the Bailiff and Bursar and the vouchers thereof, and ascertain the balances which may be due. He shall sign such Accounts and the Abstract if found correct, and shall report on any matter which may require amendment or observation.
- 4. After the Accounts have been audited and signed by the Auditor, the said Abstract shall be submitted to the Governing Body, and passed if found correct, and a copy of the Abstract shall be supplied to each Member of the Governing Body.

STATUTE XIII.

APPLICATION OF THE INCOME OF THE SCHOOL.

- 1. The Governing Body shall, out of the income of the property of the School and the income derived from receipts for the Tuition of Boys in the School or from other sources,
 - i. Provide for such Tuition, and for the Examinations specified in Statute VI, and for payment of all expenses incidental to the liberal education given in Public Schools:
 - ii. Provide for payment of all expenditure incurred by them in relation to the property and endowments of the School, and to any improvements thereof or additions thereto, and for the gradual repayment with interest of any Mortgages or charges thereon:

- iii. Provide for payment of all such salaries, wages, and pensions whether by way of insurance annuity or otherwise, as the Governing Body may assign to or for any Masters Officers and Servants of the School, and for all other payments which in their opinion ought to be made on behalf of the School:
- iv. Provide for such Scholarships exhibitions or other Emoluments tenable by boys in the School, or for such instruction in the School free of charge as the Governing Body shall determine in pursuance of Statute VII.
- 2. Any Income which may not in any year be required for any of the purposes mentioned above may be applied by the Governing Body for such other purposes in connection with the School as they shall from time to time determine, or may be retained by them to form a Reserve Fund to be applied as the Governing Body may think fit for the benefit of the School.

STATUTE XIV.

APPOINTMENT TO ECCLESIASTICAL BENEFICES.

The claim or right of preference of the several persons or classes of persons set forth in the 28th Section of the Act of Parliament passed in the 38th year of His Majesty King George the Third Chapter 68, to be presented or nominated to the Vicarage of Chirbury, and to the respective Curacies of St. Mary's, Clive, and Astley has been and is hereby abolished, and it shall be competent to any person or persons who may be legally entitled to exercise the right of presenting or nominating to the said Vicarage and Curacies to present or nominate any Clerk in Holy Orders of the Church of England duly qualified to hold possess and enjoy any of the said Benefices, freed and discharged from all preferential claims whatsoever.

STATUTE XV.

REPEAL OF EXISTING STATUTES.

The foregoing Statutes shall take the place of the Statutes which were approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the 28th day of July, 1871, and the 12th day of May, 1874, which except in so far as they are incorporated in these Statutes are hereby repealed, but without prejudice to anything previously done or suffered under the same, and the repeal thereof shall not operate to revive any of the Statutes Rules and Orders relating to Shrewsbury School which were in force at the time of the passing of the Public Schools Act, 1868, and were repealed by the Statutes approved by Her late Majesty in Council on the 12th day of May, 1874.

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1) The Local Authorities of the Districts specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the

prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep) for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the Districts, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under

prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk to that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by Section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police), Section forty-four (powers of inspectors), and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

6. This Order may be cited as the Mid-LOTHIAN (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1925.
