PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS day the Honourable Sir Ronald Charles Lindsay, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., was, by His Majesty's command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his place at the Board accordingly.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 30th day of June, 1925 (N.P. (2) 1788/25), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas by Order in Council dated 13th October, 1920, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to sanction the payment of Training Allowances to Petty Officers and Leading Seamen of the Royal Navy and Non-Commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines employed in Boys and Youths Training Establishments, in Seagoing Training Ships, and in the Boy Artificer Training Establishments:

“And whereas we are of opinion that the scale of allowances requires modification in certain particulars:

“We beg leave humbly to submit that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment, at our discretion, of the Training Allowances shown in the accompanying Schedule, subject to the conditions laid down in the Order in Council of 13th October, 1920.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

“SCHEDULE.

Per diem.

“To Chief and other Petty Officers and to Non-Commissioned Officers of the Royal Marines of the rank of Sergeant or above, who have definite responsibility and charge of Boys out of Instructional hours ...	6d.
“To Leading Seamen and to Corporals R.M. employed in the same capacity as above ...	3d.”
