

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“ The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Wingate Grange, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, being :

“ All that portion of the Parish of Castle Eden, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the south and upon the west by the said New Parish of Wingate Grange and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of the road leading from Durham to Hartlepool and opposite to the fence on the western side of North Road where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Wingate Grange, the New Parish of Wheatley Hill, in the said County and Diocese, and the said Parish of Castle Eden all meet, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the first mentioned road for a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 267 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Castle Eden published in the year 1920 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this Scheme or Representation from the close numbered 269 upon the same maps, and extending thence first southward to the said fence and then first southward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 267 and the closes numbered 244 and 242 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 269 and the closes numbered 273, 275, 277 and 280 upon the same maps for a distance in all of $52\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 242 from the said close numbered 280 meets the northern side of Moor Lane, and extending thence first southward to and then westward along the middle of Moor Lane for a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 282 upon the said maps from the close numbered 285 upon the same maps, and extending thence first southward to the last mentioned fence and then southward along the fences which divide the said close numbered 282 and the closes numbered 283, 284, 289 and 287 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 285 and the closes numbered 291, 292 and 295 upon the same maps for a distance in all of 28 chains or thereabouts to the south eastern corner of the said close numbered 295, and extending thence in a straight line due south (thereby crossing the Wingate Colliery Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway) for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Castle Eden from the said New Parish of Wingate Grange.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto :

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 18th day of June, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say :—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Luke, Newtown (Southampton), and of the new parish of Saint Barnabas, Southampton, both in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester :

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 8th day of August, 1853, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, four separate Districts for spiritual purposes were constituted out of the Parishes of Saint Mary, Southampton, and South Stoneham and the District Chapelries (now New Parishes) of Portswood and Saint James, West End, all in the said County of Southampton and in the said Diocese of Winchester, and one of such Districts was named ‘ The District of Saint Luke, Newtown ’ :

“ And whereas the said District of Saint Luke, Newtown (Southampton), has become a New Parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94 :
