

ance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

" And whereas the Vestry of the said Parish of Saint Nicholas and the Vestry of the said Parish of Saint Leonard as the contributors of an endowment of £100 per annum each for the said proposed District have, by Resolutions passed at Meetings of the said Vestries held on the 23rd day of July, 1915, authorized the Chairman of each Meeting to nominate the Archdeacon of Bristol, the Vicar of the said Parish of Saint George, and the Vicar of the said Parishes of Saint Nicholas and Saint Leonard as the Patrons of the said proposed District for the first turn of presentation and the Bishop of Bristol as the Patron of the said proposed District for the second and every succeeding turn of presentation:

" And whereas the Reverend Clifford Plumptre Wilson, being the Chairman of the above mentioned Meetings of the Vestry of the said Parish of Saint Nicholas and of the Vestry of the said Parish of Saint Leonard, has nominated to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, the Venerable Charles Henry Dickinson, Archdeacon of Bristol, the Reverend George Henry Wilmott Elwell, Vicar of the said Parish of Saint George, the Reverend Clifford Plumptre Wilson, Vicar of the said Parishes of Saint Nicholas and Saint Leonard, as the persons to whom the said Vestries desire that the first turn of presentation to the said proposed District shall be assigned, and the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Bristol, as the person to whom and to whose successors, Bishops of Bristol, the said Vestries desire that the second and every succeeding turn of presentation to the said proposed District shall be assigned:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said George, Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Saint George and of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Moorfields, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Leonard, Redfield, Bristol.'

" And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted, and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Charles Henry Dickinson, Archdeacon of Bristol, the said George Henry Wilmott Elwell,

Vicar of the said Parish of Saint George, and the said Clifford Plumptre Wilson, Vicar of the said Parishes of Saint Nicholas and Saint Leonard for the first turn of presentation and the said George, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors, Bishops of Bristol, for the second and every succeeding turn of presentation.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The District of Saint Leonard, Redfield, Bristol, comprising:—

" I. All that portion of the Parish of Saint George, in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Bristol, which is bounded upon part of the east by the New Parish of Saint Aidan, Bristol, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south-east partly by the New Parish of Saint Anne, Brislington, in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Luke, Barton Hill, in the said County of Gloucester and in the said Diocese of Bristol, upon the west by the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Matthew, Moorfields, in the said County of Gloucester and in the said Diocese of Bristol, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the remaining part of the east by an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Church Road, with Chalks Road and Blackswarth Road where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Moorfields, the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Ambrose, Whitehall, Bristol, in the said County of Gloucester and in the said Diocese of Bristol, and the said Parish of Saint George all meet, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Church Road for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Salisbury Street, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Salisbury Street for a distance of 9½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Beaufort Road, and extending thence south-eastward and in a straight line across the Avon View Cemetery for a distance of 7½ chains or thereabouts to the point on the wall forming the southern boundary of such cemetery where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint George from the said New Parish of Saint Aidan, Bristol, diverges southward from such boundary wall.

" II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Moorfields, which is bounded upon part of the south and upon the east by the above described portion of the said Parish of Saint George, upon part of the north by the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Ambrose, Whitehall, Bristol, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north, upon the west and upon the remaining part of the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Ambrose, Whitehall, Bristol, from the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Moorfields, at the junction of Church Road and Lyppiat Road, and extending
