THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

THE LONDON TRAFFIC (RESTRICTED STREETS) (No. 2) PROVISIONAL REGULATIONS, 1925.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport by virtue and in exercise of the powers given to him by Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Provisional Regulations, 1925, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee, has relaxed the restrictions and limitations imposed by Regulation 2 of the said Regulations upon the occasion of the Metropolitan Police Sports to be held at Mill Hill, on Thursday, the 30th day of July, 1925, so that nothing in the said Regulations shall prevent any person maintaining at the date of this notice a regular service in accordance with

Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, upon approved routes numbered 104 and 104A from using on that day in the restricted streets or parts thereof described in the Schedule hereto such number of omnibuses in excess of the number which he may use in those streets or parts thereof under the said Regulation 2 as may be necessary to maintain after twelve o'clock noon, an augmented service at intervals of not less than 5 minutes; between Golders Green and Mill Hill Station, London and North Eastern Railway; provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.
