#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by the Aliens Order, 1920, hereinafter referred to as the principal Order, made in pursuance of the Aliens Restriction Acts, 1914 and 1919, His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to impose certain restrictions on aliens, and to make provisions in accordance with the said Acts for giving effect to the said Order:

And whereas by the Expiring Laws Continuance Acts, 1920 and 1921, the Expiring Laws Act, 1922, and the Expiring Laws Continuance Acts, 1923 and 1924, Section 1 of the Aliens Restriction (Amendment) Act, 1919, was continued until 31st December, 1925:

And whereas His Majesty has power by Order in Council to revoke alter or add to any Order in Council made under the said Acts:

And whereas the principal Order was amended by Orders in Council dated 3rd December, 1920, and 12th March, 1923:

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the principal Order, as amended, should be further amended in the manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

The principal Order shall be amended as follows:

- 1. The following subsection shall be substituted for subsection (5) of Article 1:
  - (5) Subject to the provisions of Article 1A of this Order the expression "outside the United Kingdom" in this Part of this Order means outside Great Britain, Northern Ireland, the Irish Free State, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands.
- 2. The following Article shall be inserted after Article 1:-

1A.—(1) Any condition attached or added to the grant of leave to an alien to land in the Irish Free State in pursuance of any law for the time being in force therein shall have effect in the United Kingdom as though such condition had been attached or added in pursuance of this Order and the alien shall comply with such condition accordingly.

(2) Where any condition attached or added in the Irish Free State as aforesaid limits the period during which the alien may remain in the Irish Free State such condition shall for the purposes of this Article be deemed to take effect, with the substitution of the United Kingdom for the Irish Free State, from the date when the con-

dition was so attached or added.

- (3) An alien who, having landed in the Irish. Free State without having been granted leave to land, is found in the United Kingdom at any time shall be deemed to be an alien who has landed in the United Kingdom in contravention of Article 1 of this Order.
- 3. The following words shall be substituted for the words "an alien arriving at any port other than an approved port" in subsection (3) of Article 3:—
  - "an alien seaman who having been granted temporary shore leave during his ship's stay in port is reasonably suspected of having acted or of being about to act in contravention of this Order."
- 4. The following shall be inserted after paragraph (c) (2) of subsection (5) of Article 3:—
  - "(3) Any alien seaman who having been granted temporary shore leave during his ship's stay in port is reasonably suspected of having acted or of being about to act in contravention of this Order."
- 5. The following subsection shall be added at the end of Article 5:—
  - (2) The Master of any ship arriving at any port in the United Kingdom from a port outside the United Kingdom shall furnish to such person and in such manner as may be prescribed a return giving the prescribed particulars with respect to any members of the crew who are aliens.
- 6. The words "or to any alien seaman not resident in the United Kingdom" in subsection (5) of Article 6 are hereby revoked.
- section (5) of Article 6 are hereby revoked.
  7. The words "or an alien to whose landing Part I of this Order does not apply" in subsection (1) of Article 15 are hereby revoked.

HEREAS it is, among other things, enacted by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, that the Legislature of any British Possession may by any Act or Ordinance, confirmed by His Majesty in Council, repeal wholly or in part any provisions of the said Act (other than those of the third part thereof which relate to emigrant ships) relating to ships registered in that Possession, but that any such Act or Ordinance shall not take effect until the approval of His Majesty has been proclaimed in the Possession or until such time thereafter as may be fixed by the Act or Ordinance for the purpose:

And whereas it is also enacted by the said Act that the Legislature of a British Possession may by any Act or Ordinance regulate the coasting trade of that British Possession, subject in every case to the following conditions:—

(a) The Act or Ordinance shall contain a suspending clause providing that the Act or Ordinance shall not come into operation until His Majesty's pleasure thereon has been publicly signified in the British Possession in which it has been passed.

(b) The Act or Ordinance shall treat all British ships (including the ships of any other British Possession) in exactly the same manner as ships of the British Posses-

sion in which it is made.

(c) Where by treaty made before the passing of the Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act, 1869 (that is to say, before the 13th day of May, 1869) His Majesty has agreed to grant to any ships of any foreign State any rights or privileges in respect of the coasting trade of any British Possession, those rights and privileges shall be enjoyed by those ships for so long as His Majesty has already agreed or may hereafter agree to grant the same, anything in the Act or Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding.

And whereas on the 18th day of December, 1912, a certain Bill was passed by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, entitled "An Act relating to Navigation and Shipping," and was presented to the Governor-General of the said Commonwealth for His Majesty's assent:

And whereas the said Bill was reserved by the said Governor-General for the signification

of His Majesty's pleasure thereon:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by an Order in Council, dated the 12th day of August, 1913, to confirm, approve, and declare His Majesty's assent to the said Bill:

And whereas on the 23rd day of October, 1919 a certain Bill was passed by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, to amend the said Act relating to Navigation and Shipping, entitled "An Act to amend Sections 1, 2, 6 and 7 of the Navigation Act, 1912," and was presented to the Governor-General of the said Commonwealth for His Majesty's assent:

And whereas the said Bill was reserved by the said Governor-General for the signification

of His Majesty's pleasure thereon:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by an Order in Council, dated the 25th day of November, 1919, to confirm, approve, and declare His Majesty's assent to the said Bill:

And whereas on the 3rd day of November, 1920 a certain Bill was passed by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, to amend the said Act relating to Navigation and Shipping, entitled "An Act to amend the Navigation Act, 1912-1919," and was presented to the Governor-General of the said Commonwealth for His Majesty's assent:

And whereas the said Bill was reserved by the said Governor-General for the signification

of His Majesty's pleasure thereon:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by an Order in Council, dated the 14th day of February, 1921, to confirm, approve and declare His Majesty's assent to the said Bill:

And whereas a certain Bill passed by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia to amend the said Act relating to Navigation and Shipping, entitled "A Bill for an Act to amend the Navigation Act, 1912-1920," has been presented to the Governor-General of the said Commonwealth for His Majesty's assent:

And whereas the said Bill was reserved by the said Governor-General for the signification

of His Majesty's pleasure thereon:

And whereas it is provided in the said Bill so reserved that it shall commence on a day to be fixed by Proclamation after the King's approval thereto has been proclaimed in the Commonwealth:

And whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid has been laid before His Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be confirmed, approved, and

assented to by His Majesty:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in pursuance of the said Acts, and in exercise of the powers thereby reserved to His Majesty as aforesaid, doth by the present Order, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, confirm, approve, and declare His Majesty's assent to the said Bill.

WHEREAS in consequence of the establishment of the Irish Free State certain fishery districts as then constituted under the Fisheries (Ireland) Acts became situate partly in the Irish Free State and partly in Northern Ireland:

And whereas by the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, it is provided that His Majesty may make such adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to any of His Majesty's Dominions other than the Irish Free State as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of the establishment of the Irish Free State, and any such Order in Council may contain such supplemental, consequential, and incidental provisions as may appear necessary, or proper for the purposes of the Order:

for the purposes of the Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with
the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to
order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Fisheries (Northern Ireland) Order, 1925.

- (2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 2.—(1) Where in consequence of the establishment of the Irish Free State a fishery district as then constituted became situate partly in the Irish Free State and partly in Northern Ireland, the power of the Secretary of State under the Fisheries (Ireland) Acts, 1842 to 1921, to alter fishery districts shall, in the case of such districts, include power:—
  - (a) to constitute the part thereof situate in Northern Ireland into a separate district;

- (b) to unite the parts of any two districts so situate;
- and to attach to such separate or united district a part of any other fishery district situate wholly in Northern Ireland.
- (2) Where any such separate or united district is constituted, the first members of the board of conservators other than the ex officio members shall, in any case where the Secretary of State so directs, be such persons as may be nominated for the purpose by the Secretary of State and shall hold office for such period not exceeding three years as he may, from time to time determine.
- (3) Where any such separate or united district is constituted, the power of the Secretary of State under the said Acts to alter electoral divisions of fishery districts shall include power:—
  - (a) to create new electoral divisions within such districts;
  - (b) to fix the number of representatives to be elected for each electoral division;
  - (c) to provide for the holding of an election in each new electoral division:

Provided that where part of an existing district situate wholly in Northern Ireland is attached to a separate or united district so constituted, nothing in this Order shall affect the tenure of office of any member of the board of conservators representing any electoral division in such first-mentioned district.

(4) Any such power as aforesaid may be exercised without any such application as is mentioned in section six of the Fisheries (Ireland) Act, 1850, and notwithstanding that the separate or united district constituted does not contain any lower or tidal electoral division, and without complying with the provisions of the said Acts with respect to the publication and description of the altered districts and electoral divisions:

Provided that the Secretary of State shall publish a notice of 'he exercise of his powers under this Order, specifying where the relevant maps or plans may be inspected, in such manner as he may consider best adapted for informing persons affected by such exercise.

- 3. If an agreement is made between the Secretary of State and the Government of the Irish Free State as to the apportionment of property and liabilities of boards of conservators of districts which before the establishment of the Irish Free State were situate partly within Northern Ireland and partly within the territory which became the Irish Free State, the Secretary of State may; give to any boards of conservators of districts within Northern Ireland and their officers such directions as may be necessary to give effect to the agreement, and it shall be the duty of such boards and their officers to carry out the directions so given.
- 4. It shall be lawful for boards of conservators in Northern Ireland to charge reduced licence duties for licences to fish with a rod where the applicant for the licence is the holder of such a licence granted by any board of conservators in the Irish Free State if the Secretary of State, by notice published in the Belfast Gazette, notifies that he is satisfied that corresponding advantages are given in the Irish Free State to the holders of licences to

fish with a rod granted by any board of conservators in Northern Ireland:

Provided that the holder of a licence in respect of which a reduced licence duty is charged shall not be entitled in respect of such licence to vote at any meeting held for the election of conservators.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 16th day of July, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to

say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the Act of the 3rd England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime District) of Chapeltown and partly out of the Parish of Tankersley, both in the County of York and

in the Diocese of Sheffield:
"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Chapeltown and the said Parish of Tankersley are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Chapeltown and of the said Parish of Tankersley which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District or New Parish in the manner which is

hereinafter set forth:

' And whereas there is within the limits of the said proposed separate District or New Parish a consecrated Church in use for the purposes of Divine Worship and such Church is named 'The Church of Saint Saviour,

Mortomley ':

And whereas by a certain Indenture bearing date on or about the 16th day of July, 1925, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844 and 1856 or some or one of them, between the Reverend Archibald William Douglas, Rector of the Rectory of the said Parish of Tankersley, of the first part, the Right Honourable William Charles de Meuron, Earl Fitzwilliam, the Patron of the said Rectory of Tankersley, of the second part, the

Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, the Ordinary of the said Rectory of Tankersley, of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the fourth part (which Indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice), the said Archibald William Douglas did, with the consents of the said William Charles de Meuron, Earl Fitzwilliam, as such Patron as aforesaid, and the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, as such Bishop as aforesaid, assign unto us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, first the sum of £1,666 13s. 4d. Local Loans £3 per centum Stock and secondly the sum of £1,250 £4 per centum Funding Stock (1960-1990) standing in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England in the name of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as part of the endowments of the said Rectory of Tankersley, to have and to hold for or towards the endowment of the Minister or Incumbent of the District or New Parish hereinafter recommended to be constituted, and to his successors, Ministers or Incumbents for the time being of the said District or New Parish as to the said sum of £1,666 13s. 4d. Local Loans £3 per centum Stock as from the date of the licence of the first Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed District or New Parish in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act, and as to the said sum of £1,250 £4 per centum Funding Stock (1960-1990) as from the date of the avoidance of the said Rectory of the Parish of Tankersley by the said Archibald William Douglas:

" And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £250 per annum to the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed separate District or New Parish, so soon as a Minister or Incumbent shall have been duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned, and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £250 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty,

Chapter 111:

whereas the And said £1,666 13s. 4d. Local Loans £3 per centum Stock and £1,250 £4 per centum Funding Stock (1960-1990) have been so assigned as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said Archibald William Douglas has nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Sheffield as the person to whom he desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed

this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Chapeltown and of the said Parish of Tankersley, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The New Parish of Saint Saviour, Mortomley.'

" And we further recommend and propose that the said Church of Saint Saviour, Mortomley, shall as from the day last mentioned be, and for that purpose we hereby specify the same Church as, the Parish Church of the said New Parish of Saint Saviour,

Mortomley.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of the said Diocese of Sheffield, and his successors, for ever.

And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any

other Act of Parliament.

#### "THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The New Parish of Saint Saviour,

Mortomley, comprising:—
"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District) of Chapeltown, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield, which is bounded upon the north-east by the Parish of Tankersley, upon the north-west by the Parochial Chapelry of Wortley, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the south-west partly by the said Parochial Chapelry of Wortley and partly by the New Parish of Saint Mark, Grenoside, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south by the Parish of Ecclesfield, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Ecclesfield from the said New Parish of Chapeltown at a point in the middle of the road leading from Penistone to Rotherham opposite to the middle of the foot-path leading from Bracken Hill to Housley Hall, and extending thence first northward to and then north-eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 36 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading from Burncross to Mortomley, and extending thence northward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of

10½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the footbridge which carries such footpath across Charlton Brook, and extending thence first eastward and then in various directions along the middle of Charlton Brook for a distance of  $10\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 187 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Ecclesfield published in the year 1905 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 188 upon the same maps, and extending thence first northward to the said fence and then first westward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 187 and the closes numbered 177 and 179 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 188 and the closes numbered 173, 176, 175 and 178 upon the same maps for a distance in all of 27 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 179 from the said close numbered 178 meets the southern side of the road leading from Chapeltown to Mortomley, and extending thence first northeastward to and then north-westward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Thorncliffe Lane, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Thorncliffe Lane for a distance of 15½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway running along the south-western side of the main building of the Thorncliffe Iron Works, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of such roadway for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-eastern wall of the said building, and extending thence north-eastward to and along such wall and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 21/2 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Chapeltown from the said Parish of Tankersley.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Tankersley which is bounded upon the south-east and upon the south-west by the said New Parish of Chapeltown and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of Greaves Lane at a distance of 15 yards or thereabouts north of Westwood Bridge where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Chapeltown from the said Parish of Tankersley turns southward along the middle of Greaves Lane, and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward along the middle of Greaves Lane for a distance of 20½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading to New Biggin, and extending thence first north-eastward and then southeastward and then again north-eastward along the middle of such road for a distance of 181 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading from Westwood Station, across New Biggin Plantation and Tankersley Park, to Tankersley, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to the wall forming the south-western boundary of Tankersley Park, and extending thence south-eastward along the said wall for a distance of 60 chains or thereabouts to the

south-eastern corner of Tankersley Park near the middle of the footpath leading from Tankersley Old Hall to Warren Lane, and extending thence first south-westward and then southward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Warren Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Warren Lane for a distance of 51 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Tankersley from the said New Parish of Chapeltown."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such

Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Sheffield.
