CARDIFF CORPORATION ACT, 1920.

WHEREAS by Sub-section (1) (e) of Section (65) of the Cardiff Corporation Act, 1920, it is provided that the Corporation of Cardiff (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") may, with the sanction of the Minister of Transport and the consent of the local authority of the district and the road authority run omnibuses along any route outside the City in malescale. outside the City in prolongation of any route operated within the City.

Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of the said Sub-section the Corporation have made application to the Minister of Transport for his sanction to the running by them of omnibuses on the following route in the Rural District of St. Mellons that is to say:

Along the main Cardiff-Newport Road from the City boundary to and along the road to the Village of Rumney thence over the Great Western Railway main line bridge, passing New House Farm and entering the Parish of Peterstone-Wentloog thence along Broad Street Common to Peterstone Village, passing over the junction of the road to Marshfield and entering the Parish of St. (161)

Brides-Wentloog near Orchard Farm thence through the Village of St. Brides-Wentloog passing alongside the Sealand Reen, thence turning North and entering the Parish of Duffryn via the Bridge over the Great Western Railway main line and thence by the road on the Eastern side of Tredegar Park to the said main Cardiff-Newport Road at a point known as Ebbw Bridge

in prolongation of the following route operated within the City that is to say :-

St. Mary Street, Duke Street, Queen Street and Newport Road to the City boundary.

And notice is hereby further given that objection to the giving of such sanction may be sent in writing to the Assistant Secretary, Roads Department, Ministry of Transport, 7, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1, on or

before the 14th day of August, 1925.

A copy of any objection should at the same time be sent by the objector to the Town Clerk, City Hall, Cardiff.
