LONDON TRAFFIC.

RESTRICTED STREETS.

The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Regulations, 1925, dated the thirty-first day of July, 1925, made by the Minister of Transport, under the London Traffic Act, 1924 (14 & 15 Geo. 5, c. 34).

Whereas by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Order, 1925 (S.R. & O. 1925, No. 549), the Minister of Transport declared certain streets within the London Traffic Area to be and the same are hereinafter referred to as "restricted streets."

Now therefore the Minister of Transport, under and in pursuance of the powers given to him under Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and without prejudice to any further exercise of the said powers hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Regulations, 1925."

2. Subject as in these Regulations provided, it shall not be lawful for any person to use or allow to be used at any time upon a week-day in any restricted street or part thereof for the purpose of plying for hire along that street or part thereof any greater number of omnibuses than might, under and in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and the Schedule or Schedules deposited by him under that Section with the licensing authority and in force on the third day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five, have been used by him at that time on that week-day in that street or part thereof for the purpose of maintaining along that street or part thereof the regular service or services which were shown in such Schedule or Schedules.

3. The restrictions and limitations imposed by the foregoing Regulation shall be subject to the following modifications and exceptions:—

(a) The provisions of Regulation 2 hereof shall not apply on Good Friday, the day following Good Friday, Bank Holidays and days appointed by Proclamation to be Bank Holidays;

(b) On Saturdays, from and after 12 o'clock noon, the number of omnibuses which it shall be lawful under Regulation 2 hereof for any person to use for the purpose of plying for hire along any restricted street or part of a restricted street shall be increased by 10 per cent.

(c) Where under and in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, any person deposited a schedule or schedules, which remained in force on the 17th day of February, 1925, and, solely in consequence of the Regulations made under Section 7 of the said Act by the Minister of Transport with regard to the streets declared to be restricted streets by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1925 (S.R. & O. 1925, No. 179) such person amended or withdrew such schedule or schedules (hereinafter called "his schedules of the 17th February") and on or before the thirtieth day of June, 1925, gave notice in writing

to the Minister of Transport of his desire that the use by him of omnibuses in restricted streets should be limited by reference to his schedule or schedules of the 17th February, and not by reference to the schedule or schedules deposited by him and in force on the 3rd day of June, 1925 (hereinafter called "his schedules of 3rd June") then these Regulations shall in their application to him have effect as though the references therein to his schedules of the 3rd June were references to his schedules of the 17th February.

(d) Any person maintaining on the 30th day of July, 1925, upon the old approved route as originally defined and numbered 525 by the Licensing Authority a regular service under and in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and a schedule deposited by him under that Section and in force upon that date who in accordance with that Section substitutes for that Schedule (hereinafter called "his Schedule of the 30th July") a Schedule showing his intention of maintaining a regular service upon the new approved route numbered 525 as re-defined by the Licensing Authority may provide that:—

(i) such excess as is hereinafter referred to is due solely to the use of omnibuses by him for the purpose of maintaining a regular service on the said new route numbered 525, and

(ii) he does not at any time on any day use for maintaining a regular service on the said new route numbered 525 a greater number of omnibuses than he might under the said Section 6 have used for the purpose of maintaining the regular service on the said old route numbered 525 shown in his Schedule of the 30th July,

use in Lower Clapton Road (Part Median Road to Upper Clapton Road) Amhurst Road (Part Mare Street to Dalston Lane) and Dalston Lane (Part Amhurst Road to Mare Street) a number of omnibuses in excess of the number of omnibuses which he may use in those streets under Regulation 2 hereof.

(e) On week-days, from Mondays to Fridays inclusive, any person maintaining a regular service in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, upon a route shown in the first column of the Schedule to these Regulations may if such excess is due solely to the use of omnibuses by him for the purpose of maintaining such regular service on such route use in any of the restricted streets or parts thereof shown opposite to such route in the second column of the said Schedule a number of omnibuses exceeding the number of omnibuses which he may use in that street or part thereof under Regulation 2 hereof, by not more than 100 per cent. of the number of omnibuses which might, under and in accordance with the said Section 6 and the Schedule or Schedules deposited by him and in force on the third day of June, 1925, have been used by him for the purpose of maintaining along that restricted street or part thereof the regular service or services which were shown in such Schedule or Schedules.

4. The Minister of Transport may, after consulting the London and Home Counties

Traffic Advisory Committee, by notice published in the London Gazette, dispense with or relax on any occasion the restrictions imposed by these Regulations, either generally or in the case of particular streets or parts thereof.

LONDON TRAFFIC. RESTRICTED STREETS.

The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Amendment Regulations, 1925, dated the thirty-first day of July, 1925, made by the Minister of Transport under the London Traffic Act, 1924 (14 & 15 Geo. 5, c. 34).

Whereas by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1925 (S.R. & O. 1925, No. 322), the Minister of Transport made Regulations restricting the plying for hire by omnibuses in certain streets declared to be restricted streets by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1925, (S.R. & O. 1925, No. 179).

Now, therefore, the Minister of Transport, under and in pursuance of the powers given to him under Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and without prejudice to any further exercise of the said powers hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Amendment Regulations, 1925."

2. The London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1925, shall have effect as if—

(a) In Regulations 2 and 3 (c) the words "first day of January," wherever they occur were omitted and the words "seventeenth day of February" were inserted in substitution therefor;

(b) In Regulation 3, paragraph (d) were omitted and the following paragraph were inserted in substitution therefor;

(d) On week-days, from Mondays to Fridays inclusive, any person maintaining a regular service in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, upon a route shown in the first column of the Third Schedule of these Regulations may if such excess is due solely to the use

of omnibuses by him for the purpose of maintaining such regular service on such route use in any of the restricted streets or parts thereof shown opposite to such route in the second column of the said Schedule a number of omnibuses exceeding the number of omnibuses which he may use in that street or part thereof under Regulation 2 hereof, by not more than 100 per cent. of the number of omnibuses which might, under and in accordance with the said Section 6 and the Schedule or Schedules deposited by him and in force on the seventeenth day of February, 1925, have been used by him for the purpose of maintaining along that restricted street or part thereof the regular service or services which were shown in such Schedule or Schedules.

(c) There were added to Regulation 3 at the end thereof the following paragraph:—

(e) Any person maintaining on the 30th day of July, 1925, upon the old approved route as originally defined and numbered 525 by the Licensing Authority a regular service under and in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and a schedule deposited by him under that section and in force upon that date who in accordance with that section substitutes for that Schedule (hereinafter called "his Schedule of the 30th July") a Schedule showing his intention of maintaining a regular service upon the new approved route numbered 525 as re-defined by the Licensing Authority may, provided that

(i) such excess as is hereinafter referred to is due solely to the use of omnibuses by him for the purpose of maintaining a regular service on the said new route numbered 525, and

(ii) he does not at any time on any day use for maintaining a regular service on the said route numbered 525 a greater number of omnibuses than he might under the said Section 6 have used for the purpose of maintaining the regular service on the said old route numbered 525 shown in his Schedule of the 30th July,

use in Lower Clapton Road (Part, Dalston Lane to Median Road) and Mare Street, Hackney (Part, Dalston Lane to Graham Road) a number of omnibuses in excess of the number of omnibuses which he may use in those streets under Regulation 2 hereof.

(d) There were added to the said Regulations the following Schedule:—

3. Nothing in these Regulations shall—

(a) affect the operation prior to the date of these Regulations, of the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1925, or anything done or suffered under those Regulations, or

(b) affect any right privilege obligation or liability acquired accrued or incurred under those Regulations, or

(c) affect any fine or punishment incurred in respect of a breach of those Regulations, or

(d) affect any legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right privilege obligation liability fine or punishment.

and any such legal proceeding or remedy may be instituted continued or enforced and any such fine or punishment may be imposed as if these Regulations had not been made.

Authorisation of Landing of Animals for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended for exceptional purposes is hereby allowed, subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

The Order of the Minister, dated the ninth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, defining the said premises as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of one male Indian antelope shall not apply to the movement into the said premises of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animals as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animals have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulation Applicable to the Animals on Landing.

4. The animals on being landed shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.
